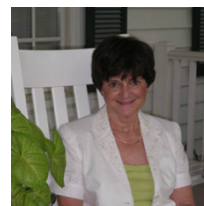

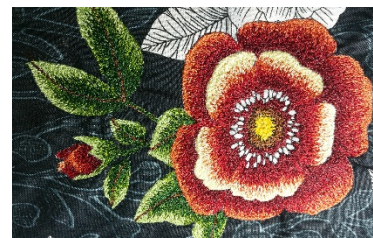
October 21st (Wednesday) – “Advanced Applique” Sue Glass – 10:30AM-4:30PM – In Person at PV

Library

South Bay Quilters Guild member Sue Glass builds on her prepared-edge applique instruction (from 2024) covering more advanced techniques using the Matilda pattern by Irene Blanck. Although the workshop is free to members, each attendee is asked to contribute four 6 ½” blocks to be made into a quilt for SBQG’s 2027 Quilt Show Auction. A kit is available for those who did not take her earlier class or who need additional supplies.

November 18th (Wednesday) - “Thread Painting” Nancy Prince - 10-4pm - On Zoom.

A perfect class for beginners or for those wanting to brush up on their thread work skills using only the zig zag and straight stitch on your sewing machine. This workshop introduces you to the technique for thread painting making it easy for you to incorporate this technique into your own quilt or landscape design. All students get an up-front full view in this Zoom workshop. A black & white printed fabric acts as a guide to make the technique simple. Creating designs in thread is just too much fun so come learn the process. Nancy will be giving a lecture during our October meeting so you can learn more about thread painting. Some prep work and ordering the kit is required for the workshop, mostly to familiarize yourself with your machine settings and make sure you have the correct presser foot. Quilt Show 2027 is moving along!

Opportunity Tickets: Please pick up your tickets (just past the Membership Table) at the meeting. Also, checks for Opportunity Tickets should be made out to **South Bay Quilters Guild, Inc.**

Entries: The Quilt Show Entry and Auction Entry forms are live on our website. You will receive a confirmation email with your submitted responses (new!) and instructions on how to submit your quilt photo. Quilt entries will be accepted up to the December guild meeting. You may bring your quilts to be photographed and measured starting in October. The Consignment Form will be available on November 1.

Raffle Baskets: Raffle baskets are still looking for donations and will be taking them through the Oct. meeting. They will take donations of actual baskets through November. Basket themes so far include **Wool, Seasons, Vintage, Batiks, Christmas, Sewing, Children's, Novelty, Blenders** and **solids** and more. Note: In the Christmas fabric there is ½ a Poinsettia tree skirt which was part of Louise's stash. If someone has the other half of the tree skirt, please let Kathy Gerds know ASAP. We also have some miscellaneous **craft supplies** that make a basket. Please let Kathy Gerds know if you have anything we can add. Our September Block of the Month is a truck and camping trailer that matches our beach theme. It's done with fusible appliqué or any other method you'd like. The background is 9-1/2 x 22-1/2 inches and you can divide the sky and road or ground if you want to break up the design.

Also, don't forget to turn in a Halloween block for our Halloween raffle block. The block should measure 6-1/2 inches with a 6 inch finished block. When you turn in your block you will have a chance for a drawing to win all of the blocks other Guild members have turned in. You may turn in as many blocks as you want to receive another chance to win the blocks others have entered. Winner will take home the blocks of all participants, just in

time to make a quilt, table runner or other fun thing for Halloween.

We also will be having another charm square exchange, and this time we'll ask you to turn in 20 5in. squares of a favorite batik fabric you have. It can be any color, and we will exchange our squares so you will go home with a variety of squares from our participating Guild members.

Comfort Quilt Project – Mary Shadbourn

The count is in for comfort quilts delivered in the year from July 1, 2025, thru June 30, 2026: 805! No wonder we're so exhausted! There are many ways to participate: Start by checking out a couple of kits (or an armload) at the meeting to finish during the month. Or, sign up for Sweatshop where we partially assemble 50+ small quilts factory-style. Sweatshops are held at different locations; September Sweatshop will be held at New Horizons. Watch for the Sign Up Genius, published on the first day of the month, at approximately 10:00am.

Disaster Relief – Nadine Kirk

Thank you to all who turned in completed blocks for the Potato Chip quilts. We will have enough blocks to make 3 quilts (one red & white, and two blue & yellow for Ukraine). Please return any remaining completed blocks to Alicia Frankel by the September Guild meeting so we can assemble tops. We'll start a new block project for Ukraine in the near future.

Spokane Fire Survivors. There was an initial quilt collection from The Quilting Bee in Spokane for the fire survivors, which reached their storage capacity with donations of quilts, pillowcases and pet bedding. They will be working with local non-profit organizations once distribution channels have been set up. In the meantime they have asked that we hold quilt and pillowcase donations until they are able to accept more, which will be much appreciated when they are ready. We will continue to check for any other non-profit organizations in the Spokane area who are willing to accept quilts; if anyone has suggestions please let Nadine know. To assist with the current needs of the community we are suggesting a cash donation from the Guild's disaster fund to the local food bank, 2nd Harvest (<https://2-harvest.org/>), which is part of Feeding America, a 501(c)(3) organization, to be discussed at the September Guild meeting.

We are not collecting donations for disaster relief at this time due to limited storage space. Please hold your disaster relief quilts (large lap size of 60x70-ish) until there is a need. If you decide to turn your finished quilt in as a RMAQ instead of holding it for a future disaster need, we ask that you follow the RMAQ guidelines and include a new book that is related to your quilt with your donation. Additional information is included in the RMAQ section of the newsletter.

We have quilts available to share if the need arises. If any of you are aware of someone who has had a disaster in their life, please let Nadine know. Thank you all again for your continued generosity and support of the Guild's Disaster Relief efforts.

An intake number for the quilt, your name and the book information will be listed at the Guild meeting. We appreciate your help in making this process as smooth as possible.

Our quilts are donated anonymously, with a SBQG fabric label sewn to the lower left corner of the back of the quilt. Thank you all for sewing the label to your quilt before it's turned in, it's much appreciated. Labels are available from Alicia at the Guild meetings or from Nadine directly

Our RMAQ program provides quilts and related new books to special needs children in the LA County foster care system through CASA-LA (Court Appointed Special Advocates-LA). We also collect baby blankets/quilts for those who are in the program and are now having babies of their own. The Guild does not pay for books for this program, and your donated books need to be unused. Please refer to the Guild website for more detailed information on quilt size, pictures of some donations, an updated list of books available for you to donate with your quilt, and a list of suggested books that you may purchase.

Findings – Dottie Daybell

1. Cassandra posts about doing a quilting test. One of the things she shows us is her "wrapped stitches", which are analogous to the hand embroidery technique of whipped running stitch.

2. Patriotic BOM: I know, you're tired of stars. But I'm not! Bonnie Hunter's 2026 Leader and Ender Challenge, Tulip Swirl, has simple 4-patch units which can be arranged in different ways. I like her second layout with a star surrounded by partial stars. Being Bonnie, she gives us very good piecing and pressing instructions.

3. Rachel in the Netherlands, a master with color, made a beautiful lozenges quilt. She gives no pattern, but you can use Bonnie Hunter's good instructions to make the block. Change Bonnie's measurements to reflect Rachel's taller rectangle (which is more like the original 1890 quilt) and change the layout to offset alternate rows. Like Rachel, you could insert a couple of double-wide blocks with large prints.
