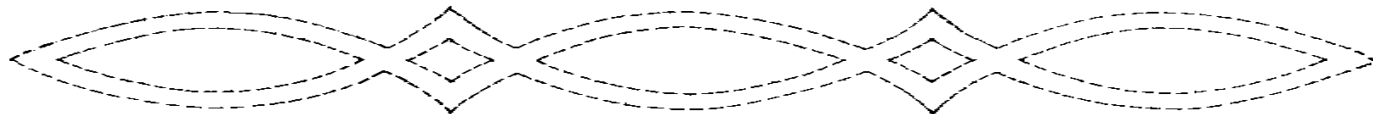

### ***Reverse Applique Extravaganza***

This August, our own Guild Member and award winning quilter Nadine Kirk will be treating us to a lecture and slide tour of contemporary and historic quilts that incorporate the technique of reverse appliqué. She'll also be sharing many of her show quilts from the Pacific International Quilt Show, American Quilting Society Show and the Road to California.

Nadine has been quilting since 1991 and teaching since '93. This will be her second guild lecture since 2004. Nadine grew up in the San Fernando Valley and has lived in the beach area since college (UCLA). Nadine lives in old Torrance (since 1980) with her husband, who is also her "roadie" on the quilt lecture circuit. She works full time in WLA (she runs the legal department of a public commercial real estate company), and has been with them for 31 years (scary thought). Nadine has been making a number of charity quilts and string-pieced blocks the last few years, which began when she was remodeling and she didn't have the brain power to work on developing new designs. Nadine is looking forward to getting back to developing new designs, and also doing some traveling (in her "spare time").

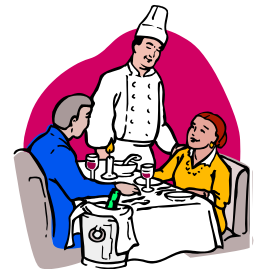

## Quilts for Wounded Warriors

In July, we sent 12 quilts to Afghanistan: 6 to Bagram and 6 to Camp Bastion. We got our first Thank You note from a wounded female soldier, who wrote: "My name is Cheryl. I was injured in a rocket attack in Afghanistan. I got one of your quilts in Bagram. I am so happy to have it and know someone out there cares to do this for us!"

We also received a Thank You note from a medic who wrote in behalf of a wounded warrior: "Thank you for all your support! My name is Melissa and I work in the Bagram CASF. We greatly appreciate everything you do for us. We send out on average 30 soldiers a day who have been hurt or injured. When we get a new patient they receive one of your quilts, and they all love them!. Again, we appreciate all your donations!"

I stay in touch with our contacts via email, and one of them wrote: "Your support has been noticed throughout Afghanistan. A few of your quilts were forwarded to smaller Operating Bases and Out Posts. The Army ICU nurses

there give quilts to those patients being packaged for transport to higher levels of care. The troops cherish your gifts and thank you cards. Once again, what you do lets everyone here know that Americans back home love them."

As you can see by the notes, the need for these quilts is continuous. I ship them as soon as we have 6 quilts (which fill a box), so please contact me if you have any ready to send. Special thanks go to Blue Star Mothers, South Bay LA Chapter, for paying for the shipping, and to Don Bunting for donating his long-arm quilting service for our troops. If you'd like to write to a wounded warrior or medic, please let me know and I'll give you their address. Thanks so much for your support which is making a difference.

### Requirements for the quilts:

**Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)**

**All cotton, no synthetics (*including batting, 80/20 blend is acceptable*)**

**Appropriate patriotic theme/design, generic for all branches of service**

**Optional: Pillowcase, 20" x 30", coordinating fabric (*good way to use your stash and have fun using the "sausage" method*)**◇◇◇◇
