We are starting the new year with **Helen Frost**.

Her lecture is entitled "**The Quilter's Magic Show: Lots of Tricks for Better Quilts.**" Helen Frost, a world famous seasoned quilter and amateur magician will answer the question.... "Is perfect patchwork an illusion?" Helen will expand your quilter's bag of tricks with secrets about precise cutting, pressing, flat borders, and perfect bindings. Then decide for yourself if Helen is more of an expert quilter or magician.

Would you like to join us for dinner with our speaker, Helen Frost, at the Good Stuff Restaurant in Riviera Village at 5:00pm before the guild meeting? Contact Stephania Bommarito to let her know you plan to join us. It is always fun to get to know the speaker!!

The **August 21 workshop** is "**Beautiful Bindings**" Come learn how to achieve smooth bindings with perfect corners and flawless joining ends. Practice sewing angled and scalloped edges along with 'gourmet' bindings, such as two-color and faux piping. During the class, you will bind small pieces of pre-quilted fabric to put into a "binding" binder, a portfolio of sample bindings that you can refer to again and again. The kit includes all quilted fabrics and bindings. A kit fee of \$10 will be collected when you sign up.

In September, our speaker will be Phyllis Binkley "How to Show Space and Create Depth in Quilts"

Phyllis Binkley has been creating landscape quilts for over ten years. By using free motion machine stitching, thread painting, and hand embroidery she is able to enhance her collages with stitches and details of all kinds. During the trunk show, she will share her knowledge of how to create a landscape that invites you into the scene by employing artistic techniques that give the illusion of space and depth.

The **September 18 workshop** is **'Building a Landscape'**. Beginning with Phyllis's hand-dyed fabrics and her 30 years of experience as an art teacher, you will create your own landscape. Foundation, backing, batting, and binding fabrics will be provided. Plus, a heat-bond will already be attached to the fabrics so they will be ready to be cut and composed. This patriotic quilt was made by Rylen Schmid, age 9, our youngest donor! She also wrote a personal letter to a soldier/hero, saying thanks for serving our country. Rylen made the quilt in her sewing class. It is already in Afghanistan, and our contact

called it "awesome"! Our thanks to Rylen for her thoughtful gift and patriotism.

Helen Lu has been busy sending our warrior quilts via DHL. She has already received a Thank You note from one of the medics, who wrote that the deployment hospital doesn't have a home-like feel and



it's so nice to be able to give the quilts to our wounded warriors. She said they are used immediately and they look forward to seeing more. DHL publicized our project in their Newsletter, which resulted in their Service Center Manager in Alaska sending Helen 2 quilts made by his mother, a long-time avid quilter who plans to make more. Many thanks to Helen and DHL for all they are doing to bring this comfort to our injured troops!

Some large pieces of fabric for backing have been donated and will be on our table at our next meeting. If you need backing or batting before the meeting, please let me know.

Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

DHL Supports Wounded Warrior Quilt Program

Here is an article that was in DHL's monthly newsletter. Helen Lu works for DHL and gotten them to donate DHL shipping of our Wounded Warrior quilts to



Afghanistan. Thank you Helen! And they seem pretty proud of it too.

Shipping Gifts of Comfort and Warmth to Wounded Warriors

"Rosie the Riveter" may have been the cultural icon representing the women who supported the war effort in WWII, but Helen picked up right where Rosie left off. A Customs brokerage specialist at the DHL Express Gateway in Los Angeles, Helen is a member of the South Bay Quilters Guild. She, along with her fellow members of the guild, helps create some of the most beautiful quilts for the elderly, those in need during the holidays and victims of abuse.

Helen's guild also creates quilts for wounded warriors, but they were struggling to finance the shipping charges needed to transport these wonderful creations directly to



combat hospitals in Afghanistan for our critically wounded warriors. "The wounded are transported from combat areas on converted cargo planes with minimal heat. The handmade quilts provide warmth and comfort to show them we care and are also used as part of patient care in Intensive Care Units," said Helen.

Helen reached out to Pasquale Scaramuzzini, Director of the LAX Gateway, who involved our DoD team - including Mike Taylor and Jorge Haynes. They not only supported the donation of our shipping services for the quilts, but they helped make the right connection in Afghanistan so the injured troops could receive these special gifts.

Since June 13, about a dozen quilts have been shipped to Bagram, Afghanistan with the support of DHL Express. "On behalf of the Men and Women Medics at Craig Joint Theater Hospital, I wanted to extend a warm 'Thank You' for your never ending compassionate service," said Col. "Willie" Tellez, who is based at Bagram Air Field, Afghanistan. "Since arriving to Bagram, I have personally witnessed 100's of smiles on the faces

of our wounded Soldiers, Airmen, Marines and Sailors who received the quilts that you folks have preciousely made. Seeing the staff present these to them are moments I will never forget; moments that could not be possible without you and team of artisans in Los Angeles and all around the US. Just wanted to say thank you, and please know your heartfelt work is making a difference!"

The beautiful, soft quilts are a colorful, patriotic patchwork and those for the military medical community must be 100% cotton for comfort and safety and also must be sized for a stretcher/gurney.

Quilt Show 2014 - Pam Overton & Stephania Bommarito

Summer is slipping by quickly! We hope you're busy working on an auction quilt, your show entry, or a challenge quilt or better yet, all of them!

Did you see our opportunity on display at the Long Beach International Quilt Festival? It caught the eye of lots of the attendees and they were most complimentary and generous in buying tickets! ☺ Our Quilt Coordinator, Stephania Bommarito, has a busy schedule

planned for the quilt but she can use your help. In the coming months, she's lined up lots of opportunities for us to show our quilt at other guild's meetings and sell tickets. Can you help? Please give her a call.

Challenge quilts. We've had a number of requests to adjust the measurements slightly. Your quilts can be anywhere from 12 to 15 inches wide and 36 inches long. As a reminder, your sleeve will go on the short edge so that all the quilts hang vertically.

Entry Categories for the Show. After much discussion the committee has made the decision to eliminate the judging category for "professionally machine quilted". We will still have machine quilted, hand quilted, appliqué, traditional pieced, mixed media, and art quilts. We have also determined, due to the dwindling number of entries for garments, that we will eliminate the garment category. We'll begin accepting entry applications at the September meeting.

We would also like to thank Wayne Berman from Sea Catch for his generous donation of \$350 toward the quilt show. Wayne is Karen Yarrow's employer. Yes, after several years of retirement, he was able to coerce Karen into returning to work part time. His generous donation has been used to acquire additional outdoor signage for the show.

For those on the committee . . . no meeting in August. We reconvene in September and will be ready to start our countdown to the quilt show.

Mary Ellen Hopkins

Sad news to report -- Mary Ellen Hopkins passed away last week. I took my first quilting class at her store and still enjoy her seminal books.

Mary Ellen Hopkins was born in Peoria, Illinois, 83 years ago. She began sewing when she was eight years old, remembers loving it, and has ever since. In 1977, Mary Ellen opened Crazy Ladies and Friends Quilt Shop in Santa Monica, CA. "Classes were more lectures than hands-on. Students did the work at home. From that point on, I began receiving invitations to do lectures. Getting up on a stage and talking without interruption was great," remembered Mary Ellen.



But running a shop and traveling eventually became too much, and after nearly 20 years she sold the shop and devoted all her time to lecturing and teaching.

Mary Ellen later started her own publishing company and has written 11 quilting books. Her first book was the very familiar "It's Okay If You Sit on My Quilt." My books provide ideas rather than projects," warns Mary Ellen. Her original development of simplified piecing methods and restructuring block settings has proven to be great time savers for quilters. Her "bend the rules" approach has helped revolutionize quilt making. She is probably best known for creating the connector and perfect piecing triangles concepts.

Mary Ellen was a guest speaker at AAQLA about 15 years ago with a large trunk show that covered a vast number of techniques.

If the public is invited to the planned memorial service in August in Santa Monica, we'll provide details via email.
