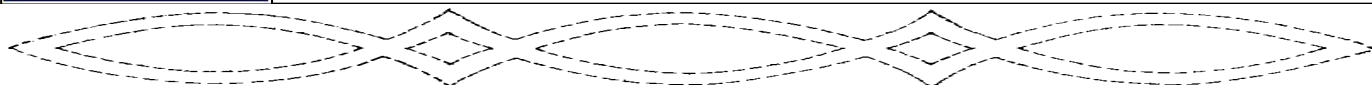

Tuesday January 18, 2011

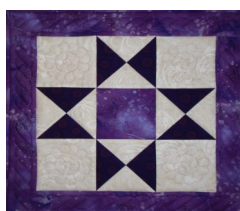

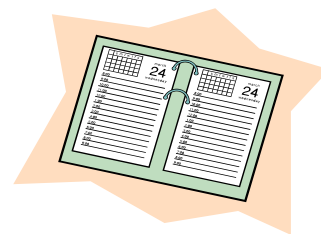
Dinner will be served at 6:30 P.M.

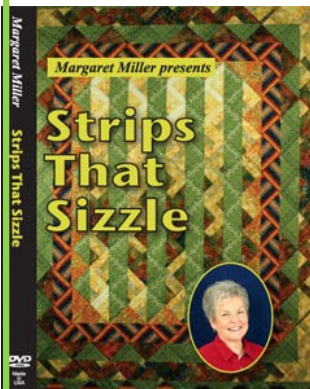

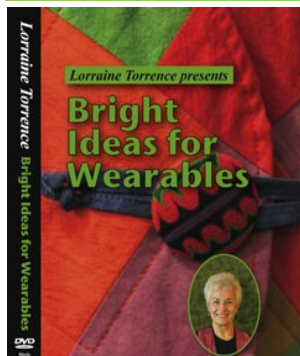

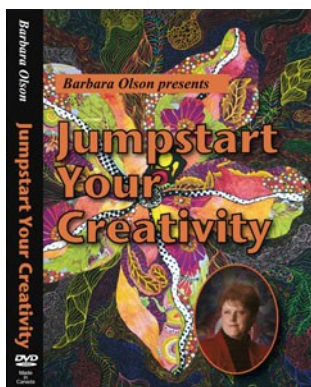

- Read-Me-A-Quilt--quilts and books. (Julie Maas) Deadline for holiday giving was December 1, but you can still show them and turn them in for after-the-holidays giving. The need is ongoing.
- Quilts for Our Wounded. (Arlene Zobrist)
- canned meats and fruits for St. Andrews Pantry Project (Mary Shadbourne)
- Donations for Foster Kids Backpack Project. See article elsewhere in this newsletter. (Helen Carson)
- any quilt tops you've sewn from kits. There will be no kits to check out in December--we'll gear up again for this project come January.

Karen Rakita has singlehandedly created three twin-sized quilts to be donated to the men's S.T.A.R. (Society To Aid the Retarded) residence. This will be the first time we've donated to the men, and now we need three more quilts to complete our gift. Please let me know if you're interested/willing to make a quilt--or two--or three. We can provide fabric, twin-sized kits, batting--anything you need. If you'd rather be just a piece of the process, *i.e.*, the top, the sandwiching, the tying, the binding, we'll find someone to fill in the other pieces. Let's get this project finished while the weather is still so coooold!

Beginning in January, I will be bringing to our monthly guild meetings, a few bankers boxes full of fabric to be processed. You are encouraged to take home a box of fabric at time to work on at your leisure. (We'll be happy to get it to your car for you!) You can take the processing as far as you want, and you can take as much time as you want--there are no deadlines for the return of the fabric. Let's see how this flies. We're looking at ways to get more quilts into the pipeline. Let me know if you have any additional ideas as to how to give this process a boost. ◇◇

They LOVE the quilts and are amazed by the love that went into making them. This month I'm not sure if I have all the names of people who donated quilts. I will take these quilts to CASA in time for their Christmas party. Please call me if you have any finished quilts and we will make arrangements to get together or for you to deliver your quilts to Luella's Quilt Basket and I will get them from the store.

Quilts for Wounded Warriors

Thanks to Guild members Lois Pio, Nadine Kirk, and Carole Hardinge, we sent a box of 6 quilts to Iraq in Nov. We received a Thank You note from our contact there stating they gave one of our quilts to a survivor who was being sent home, and "there is such a look of joy on the faces of our soldiers and airmen when we give them one of the beautiful homemade gifts." The quilts sent this month were especially beautiful. Lois and Nadine both made 2 quilts, with machine quilting donated by Don Bunting. Carole's lovely quilt was hand-quilted, which I pointed out when sending it, to show how much love and care are put into these quilts.

The 6th quilt is pictured here, donated by a quilter who moved to Arizona but still sends her warrior quilts to us. This unique pattern is called "Greek Key" and was adapted to our patriotic theme, including some fabrics for each branch of service and an embroidered eagle in the center block. If you'd like a copy of this pattern, please let me know.

We've now sent 149 quilts to wounded warriors, and #150 is completed, made by the President of the local Blue Star Mothers Chapter who has been paying for shipping. I know some other quilts are in work, and even though it's a busy time of year, I'm hoping to get enough to send another box in December. The holiday cards with heartwarming personal messages written by Guild members were included with the quilts sent in November, to bring some cheer to our wounded who can't be with their loved ones during the holidays. Thanks for all your support. ◇◇

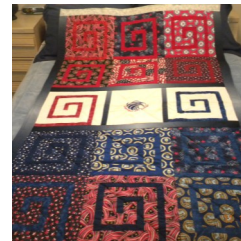

Acquisitions NOTICE: **The December meeting, December 14th is the deadline to submit your quilt in the 2011 Quilt Show!** You will find an acquisition form in the newsletter as well as in the "Members Only" section of our website under "Quilt Show Forms". We encourage submission by e-Mail (the address is an active link on the form). All entries must go through the Acquisitions Committee including the Round Robin and Challenge quilts. Your quilt does not have to be totally finished when you enter as long as you know you will have it done by the show. The photo must show design and color and the finished size must be defined in order to plan the hanging. Please completely fill out the form! If you would like to have a professional judge review and critique your quilt, here is your chance. A judge's critique lets you know what you are doing well and where you need to improve. Critiques are anonymous. To allow time prior to the show for the judging, quilts being judged must be handed in at the February guild meeting. There is a fee of \$10 per quilt to cover the judge's fee. The deadline for submissions is the December meeting.

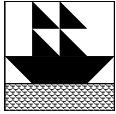

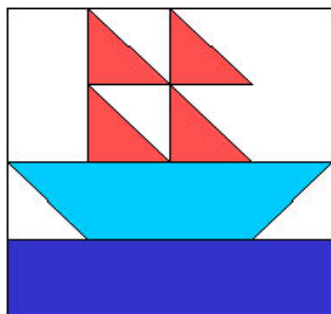
