I am always choked up by the generosity of our guild in the huge numbers of stockings our members turn in.

Continuing with the generosity and thoughtfulness of our guild I have been told by members who have been sent notes and cards when there were times in their lives when they needed support of others that the outpouring of prayers and best wishes has been very much appreciated. Thank you to all who take the time to respond to others in their time of needing to know people care.

Our November guild meeting was another case in point. By the time we finished with the Community Service showing of all of the Wounded Warrior quilts, the comfort quilts made by some of our members and the many Read-Me-A-Quilt donations we had shown a BUNCH of quilts. Thank you, thank you for all the time and energy you all have put into these projects.

We talk about CASA a lot but don't really know the whole story. The board had come to learn that the CASA funding had been drastically cut and advocate volunteer training had taken a huge hit. The board recommended to the guild that we make a donation earmarked for training a CASA (as they are called). We had a CASA representative, a fun and lovely woman by the name of Lauri Halderman, speak to us about how CASA was started by a judge in northern California who wanted to make sure children were getting proper attention and counseling by advocates of their own. She explained the 36 hour training program for new CASA volunteers. After questioning Lauri about details and finding we have more than enough in reserve funds to lead the guild another year without income from a quilt show (as is called for in our bylaws) the motion was passed to donate \$3000 to CASA. This in no way impacts the philanthropic donations we will be making at the end of June to other worthy charities.

We are not just a group of quilters. We are a group of people who care about others and do things to show it. I am proud of us.

I wish you all Happy Holidays and a Happy New Year.

The final sewing is simple, but the finished piece is striking! You don't even have to BE an artist to make this one-of-a-kind piece of true ART... and it's FUN! Quilt Acquisition – Tuesday, December 11, 2012 is the final day to enter **quilts** or **garments either on line or in person at the guild meeting**. We have plenty of room for quilts and garments of all kinds. You can also enter more than one quilt. All quilts are entered via the Acquisitions entry form. The acquisition form is available on our website or at the meetings. Please be sure that you have filled out the applications completely with accurate measurements for the size of the quilt. The team will be available to take photos and accept forms of your quilted items at the meeting. Again, you will have the opportunity to have your quilt judged. Just note your desire on the application form. Sunday Quilts – If you have a large size basket quilt that we can hang on Sunday after the Auction quilts come down, please enter this quilt through the regular process and mark that it is a Sunday Quilt on the application form Don't forget to enter your Basket Challenge quilt. Several fascinating quilts have already been entered. Just mark the box on the form that it is a Challenge quilt.

Auction Quilts – Our auction basket has begun to fill up. We have 25 magnificent and unique quilts. Yet, the goal is to have about **50 quilts** for our live auction. Remember, anyone who donates an auction quilt receives a raffle ticket to win a Longaberger basket plus a show pin. Entry forms and requirements are available on the website and at Guild meetings. You can donate a quilt of any style, technique, or color. Amaze us with a gem that you have crafted and that someone attending the auction MUST HAVE!

SBQG Block of the Month
North Wind (In Amish Colors)
January 2013 Drawing
(9 1/2" unfinished, 9" finished)

Color: Amish quilts use only solid color fabrics. Pennsylvania Amish colors go from red to green on the color wheel and do not include orange, yellow, and yellow green. Using black with other colors binds and intensifies them.

For this block use two fabrics, a black and any solid color in the Pennsylvania Amish palate. Quantities given in the directions will make two blocks, one for the drawing and a "keeper".

Fabric 1: Any solid color

- Cut 5 7/8" squares; cut in half on the diagonal = A
- Cut 1 6 7/8" square; cut in half on the diagonal = C

Fabric 2: Any solid black

- Cut 5 3 7/8" squares; cut in half on the diagonal = B
- Cut 1 6 7/8" square; cut in half on the diagonal = D

Make the center section of the block first. For each block:

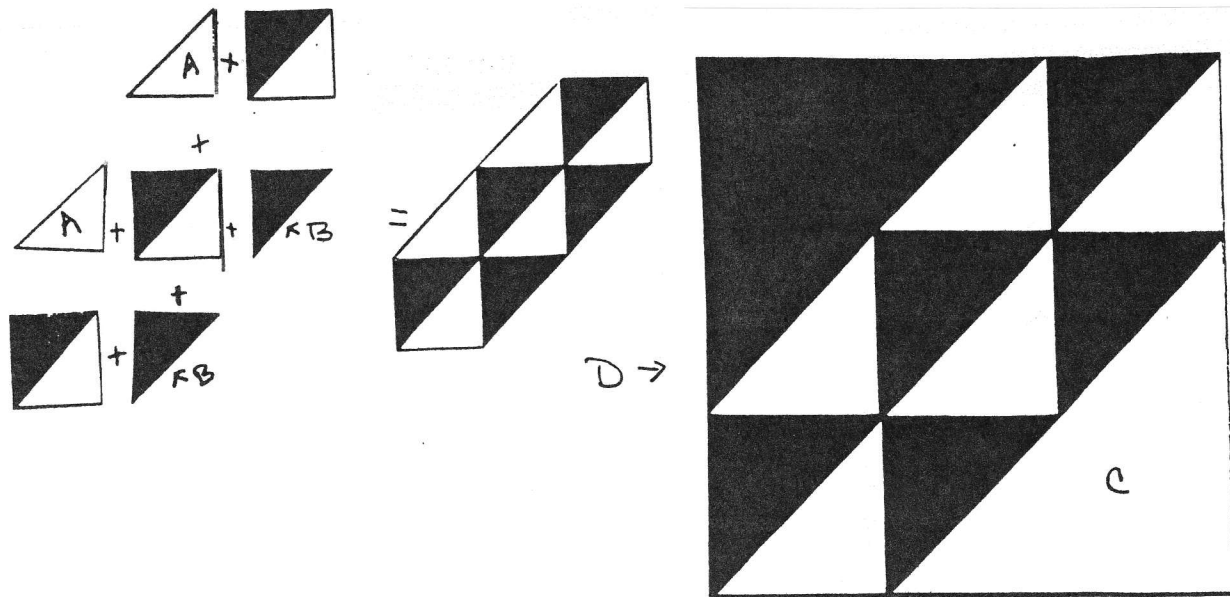
Sew 3 half square triangles, using A & B pieces.

Add the remaining A and B pieces to the sides of the half square triangles as shown.

Sew the three sections together to make the center.

Sew C to the dark edge of the center section.

Sew D to the light edge of the center section.



Sign your name on the back in the seam allowance. Remember to heat set the ink.

*Note: If you have a preferred method of construction, use it instead.

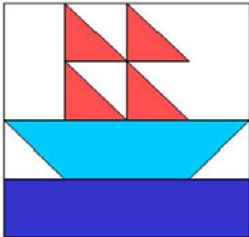
