Lisa Coulombe is a wearable art designer living in San Diego, California, who makes quilted jackets, casual enough for everyday wear. However, they are sure to get a second look because of their innovative use of color and embellishment. Her inspiration comes from traditional and contemporary quilt designs. She has created more than 65 jackets. Lisa trunk show reveals her very wearable jackets sprinkled with a few showpieces such as 'Soleil Olé', her entry in the 2004 Bernina Fashion Show and 'Circles of Influence' from the 2005 show. ## Programs/Workshops (continued)

### Call for Models

I need 6 models to wear the various wearable jackets and coats that Lisa Coulombe will be showing. The sizes are from 10-14. Plus, one model size 6-8 is needed. Each model should wear a basic single color outfit, either all black, all off-white, or another neutral color. Lisa prefers to have the models wear a short or long-sleeved shirt and skirt or pants. Please contact Stephania if you can be a model. Garments are best displayed on bodies not just held up for us to see. Thanks in advance for your help.

### The February workshop is "Curvy Bias Jacket or Tote"

Lisa will walk us through the intricacies of curves made easy using her interwoven bias technique. Add tiny prairie points, free motion quilting, or another technique of your own choosing while making a tote bag or jacket. The samples she has sent us are breath taking. Her Curvy Bias technique could easily be used in other quilting projects too. [There is still several available spots for this workshop.](#)

### The April workshop is "Mosaics & Motifs Table Runner" with Sherry Werum.

This workshop offers the opportunity to learn many techniques. The table runner center is a unique way to construct a woven tumbling block pattern using fabric tubes. The side pattern is a mosaic from a mosaic in Saint Mark's Basilica in Venice. Other motifs are available. This workshop includes instruction on decorative stitching techniques and use of monopoly thread for quick machine applique. Kits will be available to purchase in various color schemes. The **May workshop** will be a project from the book **Carefree Quilting** by **Joy Lily**. She is all about taking the stress out of piecing blocks. Her quilts are block designs that use traditional elements in carefree ways with "perfection optional" techniques where seams may wander and points are not always sharp. ### The Comfort Project - Mary Shadbourne

SWEATSHOP NEWS: Second Tuesday sweatshop is scheduled for February 11 this month. Write it in on your calendar and join us from 7p to 9p this coming Tuesday at Levy Adult School, Room 7

(near the south parking lot), 3420 West 229th Street, Torrance. New members are especially encouraged to participate in this fun evening activity--meet other members and help with the work of the guild. We meet in room 11, on the southwest corner of the Levy campus. If you'd rather not bring a sewing machine, all you really need to bring is yourself. You have several choices--sewing, pinning, trimming, turning--you name it. In two hours, we'll sandwich sixty to eighty quilts for The Comfort Project.

**QUILT POSSE INFORMATION:** We had a couple of very productive Posse parties in January. If you're not on the Posse list, you might as well sign up. Being on the list obligates you to absolutely nothing. If you get an email or phone call regarding an upcoming roundup, and you have an hour or two open, participate--or not, it's up to you. Posse members are notified when small-group "work parties" are scheduled. They happen on various days of the week, always from 10a to 12p, and always at my (Mary Shadbourne's) house in southeast Torrance. Three to five people sew, trim, turn, close, label and "bind" comfort quilts, getting them ready to tie. This is a great way to get to know other members in a smaller setting--to connect names to faces. Always come empty-handed to this one--no need to bring anything. Join the Posse by signing up at The Comfort Project table (back of the room) at the February meeting. If you're already deputized, don't sign up again... you'll be a posse member until you tell us to delete your name.

**SILENT AUCTIONS, FEBRUARY/MARCH:** This month two auctions will end: (1) a collection of Hawaiian quilting books and patterns (retail value over \$300), and (2) the set of 17 ten-inch muslin blocks (1977), stamped with wild flowers and ready to embroider. Instructions and illustrations are included (no floss). Coming in FEBRUARY (ending in MARCH) we're offering a great wire rack with wire bin-type drawers. It is 58" tall, 18 1/2" wide and 21" front to back.

quilts. Panels provide a great centerpiece, and by framing them with coordinating fabrics you can easily adjust the size to make a stretcher/guerney size quilt. Also a good way to creatively use some pieces of fabric from your stash.

Our thanks to Robert Kaufmann for their generous donation of fabric last month - lots of pretty patriotic designs. They have been a constant donor and this time the fabrics were especially appropriate.

Please don't hesitate to share any ideas or hints you have on our warrior quilts. I still keep photo albums of all the quilts we've sent, and will be glad to bring them to Guild if you'd like to review them. They will be on display at our quilt show. No two are alike, and the only common feature is the care you show by making them - quilted love sent to show our appreciation to those who sacrifice so deeply to defend our freedom.

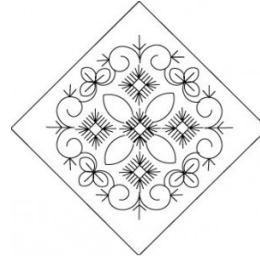
New books are here! I purchased seven interesting books at the "Road to California" show. They are processed and ready to check out.
