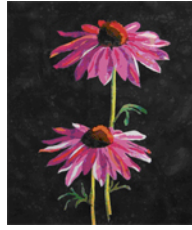

You will learn the steps of developing a flower art quilt by how color works to make a flower look real. How to use the fusible and lay out of design. I encourage creativity while assisting those who may feel timid about color and design. All skill levels can master these flowers and make them their own. The students in class will get 80% of there flower completed in class. April 20 & 21 Gwen Marston 19th Century Folk Art Applique

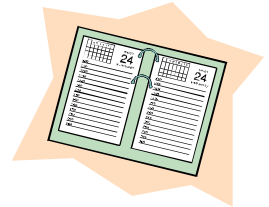

January, 2010 might be just the right time for you to start thinking about your own Pet Project through the guild. Here are a few suggestions:

- Have you ever heard of Fidget Quilts? They're made for alzheimers patients, usually about 20" square, with lots of visual interest and secure embellishments. Sometimes they're personalized, with individual pictures and personal information about the patient, but this is not a requirement. Different weights of fabrics can be used in a single quilt. They're often bound in satin, and sometimes backed with satin, too. We deal with two alzheimers facilities--perhaps you'd like to coordinate a Fidget Quilt project with one or both of them. This project need not be long-term. You could set a time limit, or set a quilt goal, depending upon the needs of the facility.
- How about heading up a wheelchair quilt project--these quilts are narrow enough to stay out of the wheels, and they include a pocket that covers the feet of the patient. (I found instructions on the internet). Community Services could help with fabric and batting.
- The Painted Turtle Project is still in need of participating quilters. If you would like to coordinate a Painted Turtle Project, we're here with fabric and batting to help you out.

Do you have a suggestion for a new Community Services Pet Project? Even if you don't want to coordinate it, we can put it out there and see if another guild member is inspired to step up and help. We want to hear from you! Last year's Holiday Dinner (doesn't that sound like a long time ago?)... was such fun. Great food, great music, and eighty quilts were made ready for delivery to various charities in the South Bay. Thirty other quilts were sent home with members to be finished and turned in at our next guild meeting. Over a hundred pounds of toiletries were distributed, and the leftover See's candy was shared by S.H.A.W.L. House and Harbor View in San Pedro. One hundred ninety something stockings were also given out this year.

Here we go again! January's sweatshop is scheduled at 7:00pm, the second Tuesday of the month at our semi-permanent location, Room 20, Hamilton Adult School 2606 West 182nd Street, Torrance. This is a big space, with lots of room for lots of sewing machines. Bring yours if you can. We hope to see you there.

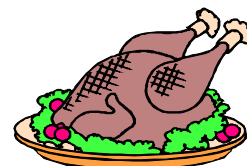

Bi-Monthly Block Exchange

Irish Chain (from McCall's Quilting)

Size: 12" Finished

Beginner Level

Cutting Instructions

Dark green print

... Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" x 3 7/8"

... Cut 1 square 4 3/4" x 4 3/4"

Med green print

... Cut 16 squares 2" x 2"

Cream

... Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" x 3 7/8"

... Cut 16 squares 2" x 2"

... Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" x 3 7/8"; cut diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles.

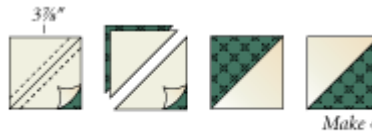
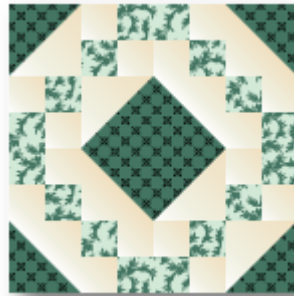


Diagram I

Assembly Instructions

Step 1. On wrong side of 3 7/8" cream fabric, draw diagonal line with the marking tool of your choice. Layer square with 3 7/8" dark green print square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line; cut apart on marked line. Press open to make pieced squares (Diagram I). Make 4 pieced-squares.



Diagram II-A

Step 2. Using Diagram II-A as fabric placement guide, sew 2" cream and medium green print squares together to make pieced square unit. Make 8.



Diagram II-B

Step 3. Paying close attention to placement, sew 2 pieced square units together to make piece rectangle unit (Diagram II-B). Make 4.

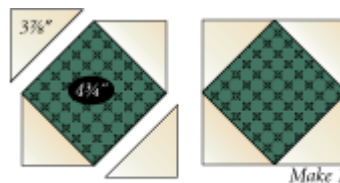
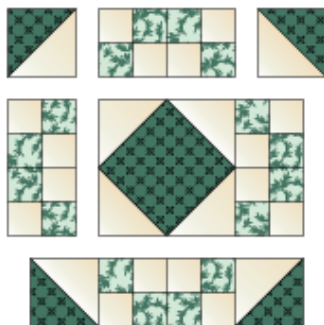


Diagram III

Step 4. Using Diagram III as a guide, sew 3 7/8" cream squares to 4 3/4" dark green square to make square-in-square unit. Make 1.

Step 5. Sew units together to make rows (see Assembly Diagram to make Irish Chain Block.

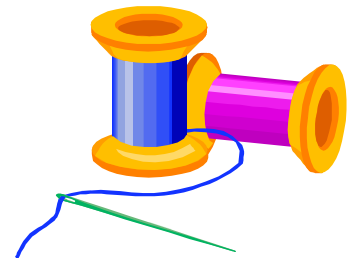

And don't forget, we're always happy to update your UFO listing (to add new ones or check off some that are finished).

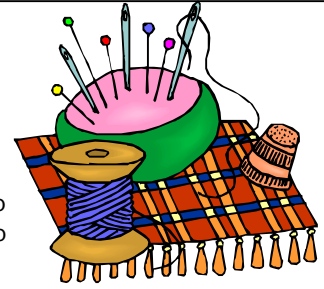

Important information about quilts submitted for display: Many thanks to everyone who submitted a quilt for display in our upcoming show. They are all lovely and we will want to show as many as we possibly can. We will be laying out the quilt show early in January, so shortly thereafter you will receive a letter letting you know if we were able to accommodate your quilt. We will do our best to include all of the quilts submitted, but we do have space limitations so please know that if we are not able to show your quilt, it's only because we ran out of space.

Acceptance letters will be available for pick up at the January guild meeting. Please remember to stop by the Acquisition Table to pick yours up if you submitted a quilt for entry in the show. Letters not picked up at the meeting will be mailed later that week. In addition to your acceptance letter we will also include a printout of the sample information card for your quilt. Please proofread it carefully (confirming size, techniques, description, etc.) as this is the information that will be displayed next to your quilt. If you find changes that should be made, please clearly mark up the hard copy and mail it to Pam Overton (672 17th Street, Manhattan Beach, CA 90266).

Special Exhibits:

Hoffman Challenge Quilts. Have you noticed on the flyers that we will have a group of the Hoffman Challenge Quilts this year? These quilts are from the 2009 challenge, and have not been seen in our area before, so tell your friends! This trunk goes to Chicago to Quilt Festival after our show, and unless you are going to Chicago, you won't have another opportunity to see these quilts.

President's Quilts: We will have a special exhibit of quilts from our former presidents. This exhibit will include those made from blocks given as well as completed quilts. It will be a lot of fun to look back and see these quilts!

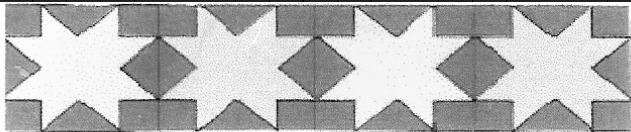
