Lecture: Jill Schumacher

Meet, Jill Schumacher, Quiltmaker to the Queen on Tuesday, January 18th.

National award winning machine quilter, Jill Schumacher began making her first quilts at the age of 12. Having been an art major, Jill has dabbled in many different art forms. It was not until many years later that Jill was introduced to the art of machine quilting in 1997. She fell in love with this method of quilting and has not stopped since first experiencing the thrill of completing each heirloom quilt. Jill's first machine quilted quilt won the Best of Show at the Siskiyou County Fair in 1998 and went on to take Second Place in the State level competition. This recognition started Jill's journey into competitions and later, the inception of her quilting business, Quilt-maker to the Queen. Jill has taken classes across the country from Master Quilters and is working toward her own certification as a Master Machine Quilter.

Come join Jill on a quilt adventure and learn the art of creating tomorrow's heirlooms with your home sewing machine.

The workshop on Tuesday and Wednesday will be an introduction to machine quilting and the next day, machine quilting your own mini whole cloth quilt. See Workshop Article on Page 2 for more information. ♦♦

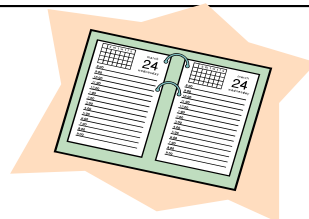

Two Machine Quilting Workshops with Jill Schumacher...Quiltmaker to the Queen!

Tuesday January 18, 2011—In this class you will learn the basics of machine quilting doing quilt loops, curves, designs, free motion straight lines and simple stippling. You will make and bring to the workshop a completed Ohio Star Block to quilt in class.

Wednesday January 19, 2011—Jill will teach an intermediate machine quilting class: The Mini Wholecloth Wall Hanging. You will learn more elaborate patterns and how to stitch them. Learn how to stitch a beautiful feathered wreath or heart with feather border and some decorative background quilting.

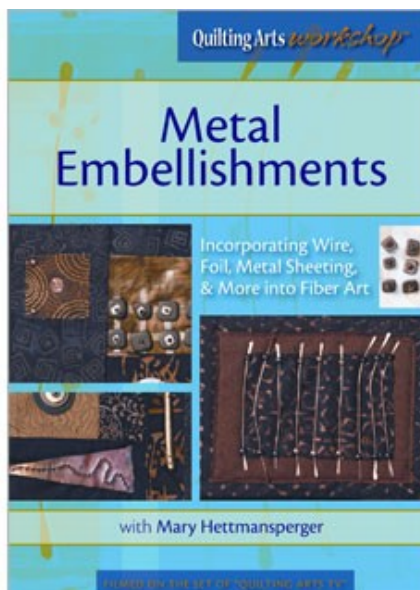

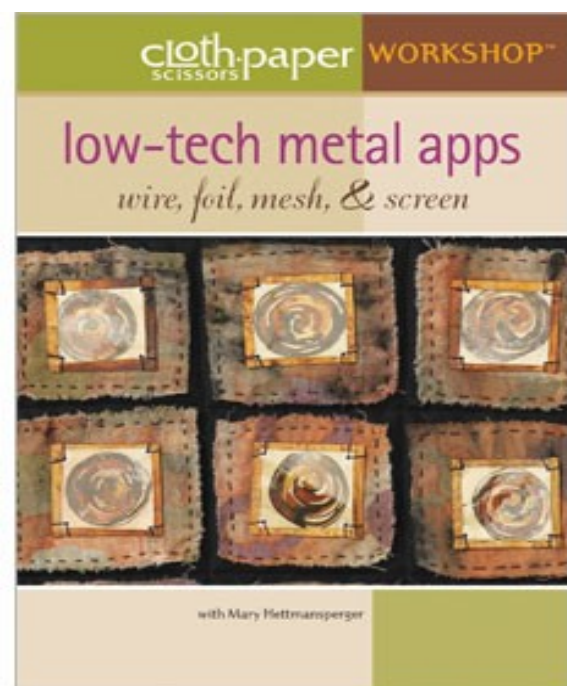
Metal Embellishments: Incorporating Wire, Foil, Metal Sheeting, & More into Fiber Art with [Mary Hettmansperger](#)



Starting out with metal sheeting as the focus, foils and copper sheeting are explored. Next, Mary demonstrates how wire (in a variety of metals and gauges) can be used to create shapes, images, weaving, and baubles to personalize art quilts and fiber art. Forging, shaping, and texturing sheet metal and wire are covered, along with simple techniques for using a propane torch to add special effects, achieve color, and obtain distressed surfaces. Surface techniques are explored, and options for designing with metal are introduced. With simple fabric applications, what to do and what to avoid when incorporating metals and found items into art quilts are considered. The final focus is on finishing, with special consideration given to methods of attaching metal embellishments to fiber art.

Low-Tech Metal Apps: Wire, Foil, Mesh, & Screen with [Mary Hettmansperger](#)

Discover the endless possibilities for using low-tech metal applications to alter and embellish the surfaces of all types of artwork—from mixed-media wall art and collage to book arts, quilts, and other fiber art. After whetting our appetites with an introduction to metal embellishments on her Quilting Arts Workshop™, “Metal Embellishments: Incorporating Wire, Foil, Metal Sheeting, & More into Fiber Art,” in this DVD, Mary delves even further into specific materials and techniques. Patinas, shaping, and forging are all covered. Discover unique manipulations for wire, including looping and twining. Learn to attach altered metals to a variety of surfaces to add depth, interest, and color to your artwork.

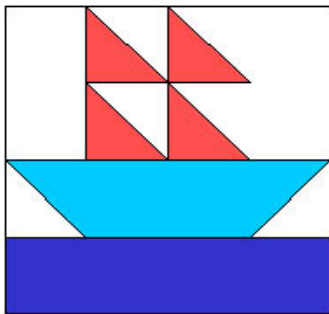
