I would like to thank the ladies who made CASA quilts this past month. Nadine Kirk made two, Grace Peng made one as did Diane Denney-Winthrop. In addition, Bernadette Grinnell made a very special quilt for a 3 year old blind girl. The quilt was filled with various textures so the child could feel the animals and the scene. I really appreciate all of the work that went into all of these quilts. Thank you.

I received a box of fabrics from Marcus Brothers Fabrics to be used to make CASA quilts. I met a friend of Marvin Marcus at a CASA function. I was asked if we could use some fabrics for making the CASA quilts. This lovely gentleman called his friend in New York (Marvin Marcus) and by the end of that week I had received 27 pounds of fabric. If you would like to use some of this fabric to make a CASA quilt, let me know and I can give you some of the fabric. There are various patterns, 30's being most prevalent. It is too heavy to carry all of it to the meetings unless I know someone will be willing to take it home to use. So, call me or e-mail me if you want some of it.

Quilts for Wounded Warriors – Arlene Zobrist

I have received some information on actual numbers of wounded in our front line hospitals. Sadly, the numbers are even higher than usual since fighting in Afghanistan has been fierce. Our front line contacts have requested all the quilts we can send, and also mentioned that they want red/white/blue themes, (which we normally do). Thankfully our numbers have been higher to help meet the need, and hopefully we can keep sending more.

To help achieve this, we'll have some backing fabrics available at our next meeting in Aug, from a donation of Community Service funds from our Guild. We still have some batting too, so bring your quilt top to Show & Tell and go home with the batting and backing to finish it. Recently several quilters mentioned that their warrior quilts were made with fabrics from our table. It's good to see donations used for the purpose intended, especially when the need is so great. A special note of thanks to some of you who have donated your time and efforts to finish quilts made by others – your generosity is appreciated!

We received more Thank You notes last month, including one from a nurse writing on behalf of a wounded warrior who couldn't write. We also received a heartwarming note from a hospital commander thanking us for sending the quilts to cover our wounded with "tokens of American appreciation." Some of you have been adding personal notes in your labels which are very meaningful to the wounded.

- **All cotton (incl. batting, 80/20 acceptable)**
- **Appropriate patriotic theme/design**
- **Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coord. fabric**

“Baskets of Quilts & More”

Call for Quilts – How are your quilts and garments for the 2013 show progressing? The mellow days of summer are a cool time to continue stitching the tops and/or quilting them. We will begin accepting quilts/garments at the September meeting. Remember the quilt top must be completed and the entry form completely filled in order to enter you items. The acquisition form has been up updated and is available on our website or at the meetings.

“It’s a Basket” Quilt Show Challenge – The challenge is a take-off on the theme of our show. However, the challenge will “challenge” you to redefine the concept of what a “basket” is or could be. You can even decide how you want your basket to be used. There are only two basic rules. The quilt can be no more than 30” in any direction and has to have a “basket” somewhere in the quilt. Copies of the challenge will be available on our website.

Opportunity Quilt – “Parade of Baskets” will be debuted at the Long Beach Quilt Festival. It will be on display Saturday, July 28th. A huge THANK YOU goes out to everyone who has volunteered to either

sell tickets or white glove at the show. Opportunity tickets are available now from Mary McHale as well as at the meetings beginning in August.

Sewing Machine Raffle – There is a brand new Brother Innovis-40 Project Runway limited edition sewing machine that has been donated to the guild for you to win too. It is the perfect lightweight machine to carry to workshops and to stitch up a storm. There will be a limited number of tickets available to purchase. Mary McHale has these tickets available too.

Auction Quilts – Julie Limbach Jones is ready to have her auction basket filled with many a quilt. There is room for about 50 quilts. Anything goes – let your creative juices flow! A walk-through of how to handle the insurance information, request for certs etc. to be sure it is "right" the first time. A must for the treasurer in your group.



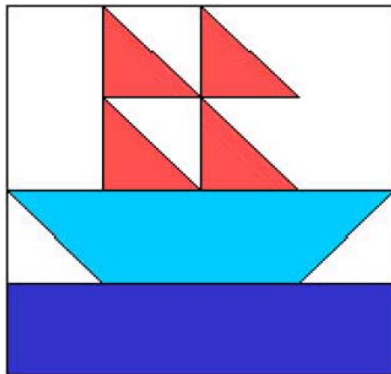
A note from the editor. . . . In support of our local sewing machine dealers and advertisers.

Are you in the market for a new sewing machine? Are you thinking about purchasing one of the "class" machines at the Long Beach International Quilt Festival (or any large show)? You should be aware of several things:

- Training classes for your machine must be provided by the selling store. If you purchase a machine from a store outside your neighborhood you'll need to travel to that store for training classes.
- The dealers demonstrating at the show have invested a great deal of money to get there. In many cases it costs them \$15,000 - \$20,000 to display at the show. Those costs are ultimately passed along to you, the consumer.
- Our local sewing machine dealers will most likely match or better the offers you see at the show.

If you really are looking for a new machine and know what you want, or don't know what you want, take the time to visit your local dealer before the show. Take the time to test drive a machine, compare features, and really evaluate what it is that you want/need. Good sewing machines are a major investment. Ask your local dealer if he/she will match any deals offered at the show. The answer will probably be Yes! You'll get the machine that you want and will have chosen with careful thought and evaluation. You will also get the local service and training support that you'll need, and you'll be supporting a "local" business .
