October 21, 2014 – **Grace Errea** **"Value of Value of Color"** Color gets the credit but VALUE is what always makes a successful textile piece. Grace will explain what VALUE is, how to see it, and how to use it. Once understood, your quilt color choices will always end up being amazingly effective when you focus on value and let all other colors fall into place naturally.

October 22, 2014 – The workshop will be **"Intro to Heat-Set Machine Appliqué"** In the class you will learn to use an appliqué technique so new and revolutionary; you will use nothing else once you try it. It is easy, foolproof and the results are always amazing.

This technique leaves the quilt and the fabric soft and manageable, not stiff and board-like, as fusible webs and glues do. This technique produces a "no-fray raw edge appliqué" as a result. November 18, 2014 – **Dawn Ferrier** – **Creation Station "Fun & Funk & Junk"** Dawn's

philosophy is to promote reuse and repurposing as part of the overall creative process. Her store, in Buellton, is an eclectic quilt shop with a riot of color and display. Hence, Dawn will be sharing her many ways she uses scraps and fabrics to come up unique, delightful quilted treasures of all kinds.

November 19, 2014 – The workshop will be showing us how she actually creates her many recycled, reused, and repurposed projects. Just like her lectures, the day will be unconventional as you find out what is in her many project boxes.

Info you can use:

Small Quilt Auction: Sandra Sarch will begin taking your auction quilts at the September guild meeting. Please call her if you have questions about size or suitability. We need LOTS of beautiful quilts to auction, so let's all get busy! Don't forget that you get a free show pin when you donate an auction quilt.

Raffle Baskets: Peggie Wormington will begin taking your donations for our raffle baskets in September or you may call her to make separate arrangements. We also welcome donations of filled baskets from members or groups.

Red and White Challenge: Diana Smith will also begin taking your completed blocks at the September guild meeting or you may mail them to her or call her to make other arrangements. We will display these blocks at the January guild meeting so that guild members may vote for their favorite. Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd.

- Blocks must be only red and white or red and cream. Prints may be used, but they must be different shades of red, red and white, or red and cream. No other color is permitted. PLEASE PREWASH YOUR FABRIC!!
- Blocks must be 12 ½" unfinished (as they are turned in to Diana), 12" finished.

- Blocks may be any technique – pieced or appliqued, embellished, etc.
- Blocks will not be returned, but will be used in the 2016 guild opportunity quilt, or auction quilt.
- The Block Challenge Submission form found elsewhere in this newsletter, on the guild website, and available from Diana must be submitted with EACH block.

Opportunity Quilt: Stephania Bommarito is beginning to take the quilt around to different venues to publicize our show and sell tickets. Please call her if you have time to volunteer to go with her to assist. We will definitely submit our quilt to display at Road (Jan 22 – 25, 2015), and will be asking for volunteers so please be thinking of how you can help!

Publicity: Kay Salm will be preparing our bookmark flyer this next month and we hope to have them ready to begin distribution at the August guild meeting. Please take some and pass them on to friends or colleagues, churches, etc. Let's get the word out about our beautiful show!

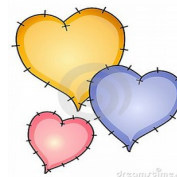
