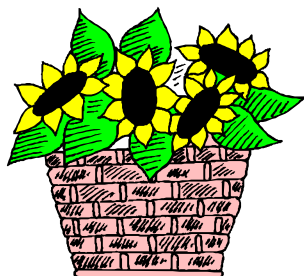

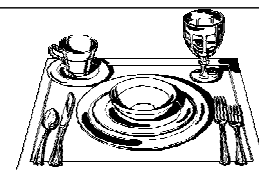

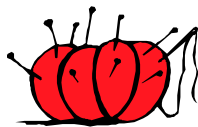
August & September workshops will be held in the community room of Palos Verdes Library.

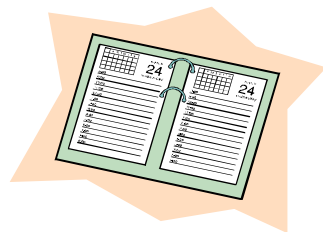

Section 8. OFFICER VACANCIES

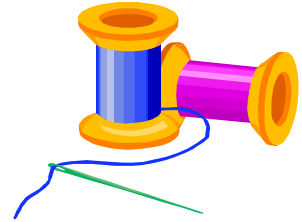

Julie's Fantasy Garden, as the theme for this year's block.



It's time to thank our wonderful President Julie Limback-Jones for her work and achievements of 2008-2010 by creating wonderful quilt blocks for her. Blocks are made by ALL members of the guild. The quilt includes everyone from beginner to master quilters. Julie has chosen "Flowers" or "Julie's Fantasy Garden" for her theme.

To make it simple we will focus on flora; any flower! We are going to exclude bugs, animals and tools. The blocks should be 6 inch finished, so 6 1/2 inch unfinished. If you are doing an appliqué block, please start with a 7 1/2 inch background and don't cut the block down as we will cut them to the proper size. The background of the block should be green. The Guild will supply a 7 1/2 inch Green background. The flower should be set on Point. Please sign your block, in ink, on the front, but be sure your signature is within the 6 1/2" area. If you are machine embroidering a block, please remove the stabilizer. Your block can be pieced, appliqued, foundation pieced, or embroidered. Feel free to embellish with buttons or beads.

Color:

Background: Light Green, THE GUILD IS SUPPLYING at 7 1/2" in block. Pick up yours at the Guild meeting, along with an applique pattern, or paper pieced pattern...or use your favorite.

Flowers: Brights: Purple, turquoise, orange, fuchsia, yellow, etc. (Julie doesn't really care for pastels.)

Julie's favorite flower is the Gerbera Daisy. She tends to like flowers that are bright colors and "happy" flowers. She likes both whimsical and realistic flowers. She likes Jacobean applique also.

But also, we will give her signature bricks: Each Guild member should also contribute one Signature Brick...come by our table and we will have pens and "bricks" to sign. (A rectangle piece of fabric.) You can embroider your signature if you would like too.

The blocks are due by the June 2010 meeting.

We will have an information table set up at the April and May meetings. Stop by, sign your "Brick", pick up a pattern, look at books for ideas, sample blocks, pick up the background fabric, or if piecing, pick up some green fabric.

Any questions, please call Carollee Schuegraf, 310.265.9796. As VP for programs, it is part of my responsibility to coordinate the "gift" for the president at the end of her term. First year (last year) is fat quarters, second year is blocks. If you can't attend the meeting, please call me and I will mail you the background, and a pattern. I hope everyone will contribute to show Julie our appreciation for her two years as President.

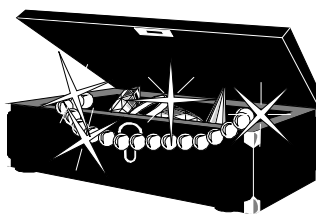

From July 3, 2010 through March 28, 2011, The Bowers Museum of Cultural Art presents *Quilts: Two Centuries of American Tradition and Technique*, an exhibition of American quilts from the 18th-20th centuries, many on view for the first time. This fascinating exhibit highlights an array of quilt styles and techniques that embody the powerful visual impact and historical traditions of their era. The artistic craftsmanship is spectacular! Check the museum website www.Bowers.org for more information. Bowers also features an award-winning restaurant, Tangata, as well as the Gallery Store – an exotic shopping experience that has drawn rave reviews from coast-to-coast for its unique array of items.

Antique Quilting Frame. An acquaintance of Eva Killingsworth has donated an antique Quaker quilting frame to sell to benefit our guild. It's probably from the early 1900s. This frame is the kind that has measurements on the rails and little spikes to hold the fabric in place. The rails are about 93 inches long, but they fold in the middle so it is reasonably compact. Quilts for Wounded Soldiers

We received this note from a wounded soldier who received one of our quilts sent to Iraq last month: "Hello – Thanks for the quilt I received in Balad, Iraq, before my treatment. Thanks Again, Sgt Fucina, 25th CAB." This was the first note we received from a soldier instead of from a medic, and it arrived within 2 weeks after the quilts were shipped – very fast! It's gratifying to know that our quilts are bringing comfort to our soldiers when they are injured, showing them we care.

A box of 6 quilts was sent to Afghanistan this month, and included the lovely quilts from Ethel Newman (above), Pat Steck (lower left), and Sandra Reichard (lower right). Your continued support of this program is appreciated – you are making a difference and supporting our troops!

Requirements for the quilts:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton, no synthetics

(including batting, 80/20 blend is acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design, generic for all branches of service

Optional: Pillowcase, 20" x 30", coordinating fabric



I just received a special request for quilts from another hospital at Camp Bastion in southern Afghanistan. This is the busiest hospital in Afghanistan and they transport some severely injured patients in-country. The Medic said they have a limited supply of linens and are unable to provide blankets for any of their Aeromedical flights. I will send our next quilts to this new location and wanted to let you know that word of our quilts is spreading! The need is definitely there, and you can be assured that your labor of love is going straight to our injured in combat zones. If you have any quilts ready to send, please don't hesitate to contact me and I will expedite them to our wounded warriors.

CHARITY NOMINATIONS

El Segundo Relay for Life, Team ZF Dancing Fleas

[benefits The American Cancer Society]

For our guild's \$1000 donation this year this is the most urgent charity because it affects all of us and our families and friends. This group of volunteers already raised over \$33,000 for fighting Cancer within only 2 years. They are called "El Segundo Relay for Life, Team ZF Dancing Fleas" and can be found on the internet. They have "Relays for Life", elaborate Garage Sales, events where a restaurant or other concern allows a portion of the income on a specific date to go to the cause, etc. They work very hard all year. The volunteers are Cancer survivors or are related to someone who survived or LOST their fight with Cancer. Their goal is to Fight for a Cure. We can make that our goal too!

SUPPORT FOR ADDICTIONS PREVENTION AND TREATMENT IN AFRICA FOUNDATION (SAPTA) is a substance abuse and HIV treatment program helping the poor of the slums of Kibera, Kenya. The people of Kibera are a vulnerable population of alcohol/drug users, HIV positive women and men, commercial sex workers, and youth without the ability to pay for school.

The Kibera slums is home to approximately 700,000 people and is one of the most densely populated slums in the world. Mud huts, tin roofs, no running water, sewage treatment or roads.

SAPTA was formed 3 years ago and has served over 200 people who have received free treatment and counseling for addiction. Once sober the Foundation offers training in "Income Generating Projects" to assist them to become more productive members of society. One program offered is the "Quilt Making" project. The people in this program are being taught to sew by making quilts and garments. Trainees are instructed on possible ways to sell their products, how to manage and save money. The goal is to assist our trainees in ways to insure that they can purchase their own sewing machine and form cooperatives where they can act as trainers for others extending the outreach to help heal more people.

Alcohol, drugs, HIV and other illness associated with living in such difficult conditions has left many mothers and grandmothers alone to raise their children and grandchildren. Many of these women live on \$1 - \$2 a day if they can find work. SAPTA believes that by helping the care-givers, and keeping them healthy, fewer children will become orphans. Should SAPTA receive the Guild Charity donation, we will use this gift to expand the resources for this program.

SAPTA offers the only addiction counselor training programs in Africa approved by the National Association of Alcohol and Drug Counselors of USA. SAPTA Foundation is a 501 (c) 3 Non-Profitable Organization. For more information see www.saptafoundation.org.

These three young women have gone from begging on the streets of Bamako, Mali in West Africa, to business owners in 18 months. Fabric of Life Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit international development foundation. Its primary purpose is to support cooperative development projects that directly impact the quality of life for families in developing countries. The Foundation supports three primary activities: *micro-credit programs for micro-entrepreneurs*, *increasing access to education* and *increasing access to affordable health care*. Here is one of the Fabric of Life Foundation projects:

Hèrè jè Center, Mali, West Africa
 The vision of the Hèrè jè Center is to stop the cycle of begging for begging girls and provide sustainable income generating activities. In the local Bambara language, "Hèrè jè" means "happiness group". The Hèrè jè Center offers skills training, health and nutrition, family planning, AIDs prevention and literacy skills. These skills lead to developing micro-entrepreneurs who can generate sustainable income for themselves and their families.

The girls are learning skills that are indigenous to Mali. Fabric dyeing, painting and stamping are some of the self sustaining skills taught at Hèrè jè Center. I will have examples of these beautiful fabrics at the May meeting. And don't we all love artisan crafted fabrics? Please come by and see them at the workshops table. AND...You may order your own fabrics from the Fabric of Life boutique by going to their web-site.

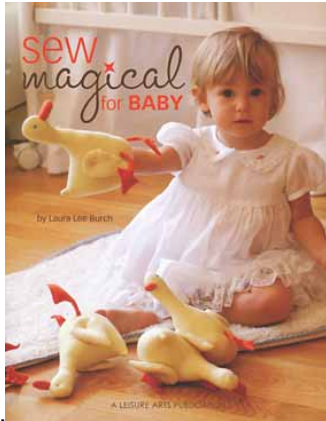

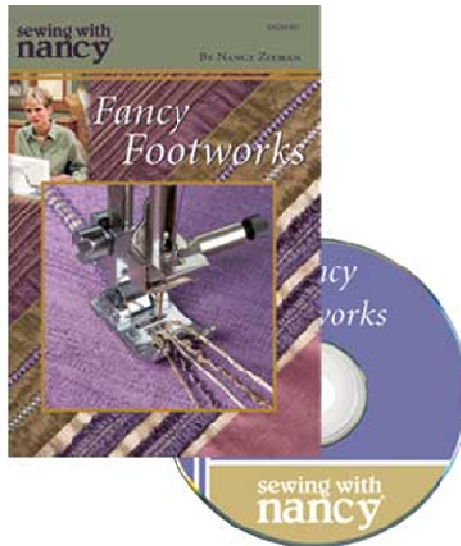

Create a farm animal puzzle; a grocery bag filled with potatoes, apples, pears, strawberries, oranges, carrots and velcro peelable bananas; wooly sheep rattle; crinkly goldfish; and a pair of adorable elf slippers.



Fancy Footworks DVD

Explore the possibilities for using your sewing machine presser feet. Specialty presser feet expand the capabilities of your sewing machine. See how to use the Open Toe Foot to appliqué and attach trim, the Fringe Foot to make trim and sew on buttons, the Multicord Foot to couch threads and gather, and the Edge Joining Foot to join trims and stitch in the ditch. This DVD includes instructions on using the Cording and Piping Foot, the Edgestitching Foot to make pleats and diamond tucks, the Pintuck Foot to make traditional and corded pintucks, and the Overcast-Guide Foot to overcast and seam knits. To achieve professional results Nancy Zieman describes how the Little Foot/Patchwork Foot is used for precise seaming and channel stitching, the Curve Master Foot to simplify joining curved quilting seams, and the Big Foot to do echo quilting and free motion quilting and stippling.

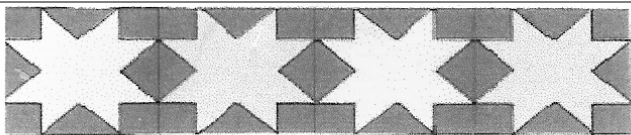

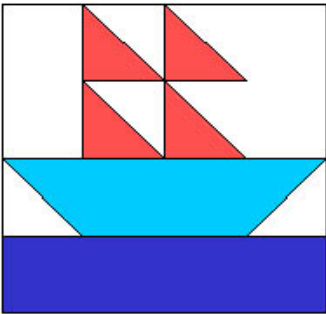
