Sue Glass, our travel chair, has organized another "day tour" for the quilt guild.

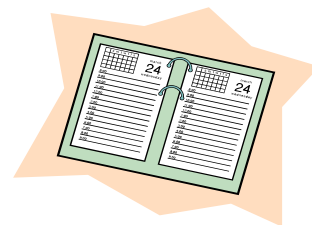


Saturday, September 10 - we're off to the San Diego Quilt Show, The Mingei International Museum at Balboa Park to see "Bold Expressions: African American Quilts", and finally, we'll stop at Quilters Paradise in Escondido. The price of \$48 includes the air conditioned motorcoach, driver's tip, refreshments, and admission to the Museum.

The exhibit at the museum sounds very interesting. The exhibition showcases more than fifty quilts made throughout the American South between 1910 and the 1970s. Stunning color combinations and distinctively free patterns epitomize an artistic vision that is unique to the American folk art tradition. African American quilts, made entirely by women, are celebrated for their bold improvisation and modern take on traditional quilting patterns, such as the House Top or Log Cabin, Star of Bethlehem and Pine Burr. Many of the quilts are made from materials that were readily available to the makers, including flour sacks, old blue jeans and work clothes and fabric remnants. This early form of recycling and reuse was a necessity that became the foundation for unique expression. The exhibition will also explore a variety of construction techniques and quilting.

Sue won't be available at the June or August meetings to take reservations so Pam is looking for someone to sit in for her. Can you help? ♦♦

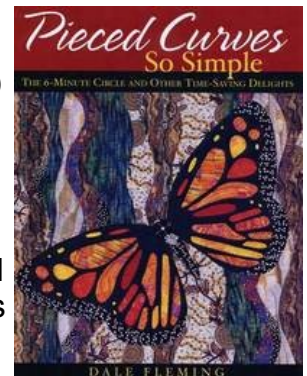

“Novice or accomplished, traditional or contemporary, quilters love the notion of circles and curves in quilts but only too often avoid them thinking they are too difficult. Based on the top selling quilt book, *PIECED CURVES SO SIMPLE*, this class will transform how you quilt. Learn to machine piece the six-minute circle with all of its nuances and variations using my extraordinarily fast, easy, pinless piecing technique.

This is my most popular class as it covers all the basic skills in the book and is all skill levels. First I teach how to make a 6-minute circle. Then I show students some quilts they can make just using circles. Easy instructions are available to everyone. There are always people who just want to make circles and a quilt and nothing else. In the afternoon I teach how to make tips, convex curves and play with patterns in the context of making simple leaves.” ♦♦

"Twist on Tradition"

We had a fruitful quilt show meeting in May and came up with a good blend of new and returning ideas for the 2012 show generated from the April Brainstorm meeting. Others ones are still being considered as we continue to plan the look of the show. There are still some openings for the committee, please see me if you are interested. Being on the committee is a great way to meet people and help the guild.

Long Beach Quilt Festival – I still have a few opening for people to work the hours needed for the show as well as selling quilt tickets on Thursday and Sunday.

Southern California Quilters Run 2011 – The 2012 Opportunity Quilt will be viewed for the first time during the second weekend of the Run, June 23 – 26. We will need volunteers to sell tickets at Luella’s Quilt Basket. There will be a sign-up sheet at the June meeting. Thank you ahead of time for helping out.

Quilt Challenge – Once again, there is a challenge for the show based on the look of the Opportunity quilt and being a part of the Centennial Celebration for Torrance. There are just two rules. The first one is that you must use an old recognizable traditional block from at least 75 years ago. However, the twist is to use it in a new Twentieth century plus way. (Something old. Something new.) The other rule is that no dimension (left to right or top to bottom) is to exceed 30 inches or be smaller than 12 inches.

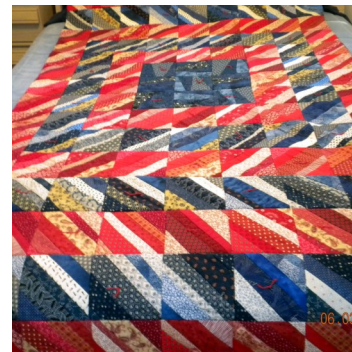

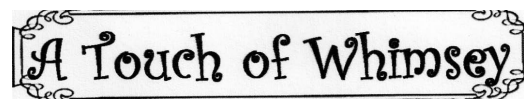

Fall Activity – It's a Mystery! It's been quite awhile since the guild has had a mystery quilt, so we found a great one. It's perfect for beginners, but seasoned quilters will like it also. We have special permission from Debbie Caffrey to run this within our guild. (Who, by the way, is teaching at Long Beach again.) We will hand out the very first step in August, with the next steps coming monthly. We'll give fabric requirements now since you may find some great fabric over the summer. Stop by Intraguild to sign up. There is NO cost, but it will help us determine how many copies we need.

Light Background – 3 yds; *Main Print* – 1 ¾ yds; *Accent Fabric* – 1 ¾ yds; *Optional Border* – 2 1/8 yds*; *Binding* – 1 yd*. *Border can be made using more of the main fabric. Accent fabric would make a good binding. You can also wait until the top is finished and use something completely different for the border and binding. Finished size is 51 X 68 before borders.

Secret Pal – The potluck in June is our "big reveal". Bring your final gift to the dinner and sometime during the dinner we will see who has been giving us some really awesome gifts.

Summer Puzzle Challenge – The time is here. Get those puzzle quilts started. Come have one last look at the samples and get some inspiration for your own. We have 3 mini Sudoku kits to give away. **You only need to stop by and ask for a ticket.** It's that simple.
