After the devastating tornadoes ripped through there, I got in touch with several people (one is Ann Cosgrove who just quilted our opportunity quilt!). I have had lots of folks asking how we can help, and my friend Betty's granddaughter knows of a church in Moore who is working with several churches and the Red Cross as a relief center. What they need most urgently is financial donations to provide food, clothing, and shelter. If you would like to make a donation to help the victims, you can send them individually or we can collect them at the June guild meeting and I will send it to People's Church, 800 E. Britton road, Oklahoma City, OK, 73114. Please make your check payable to People's Church and earmark it for *Tornado Relief*. We have verified they are a legitimate non profit organization so your donation is tax deductible.

Helen Frost is a familiar name to quilters, especially those that have been quilting for more than 20 years. She is the author of several quilt books; her newest is *All-Star Quilts: 10 Strip-pieced Lone Star Sparklers* with Blanche Young. Although known for her innovative strip-piecing techniques, her first love is hand appliqué. In 2009 Helen was inducted into the Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame. She and her husband live in Tucson, Arizona.

August 21 - Workshop - Beautiful Bindings 9-3

Achieve smooth bindings with perfect corners and learn a great method for joining the ends. Practice

sewing angled and scalloped edges and try new 'gourmet' bindings, such as two-color and faux piping. You will bind small pieces of pre-quilted fabric to put in a 'binding binder', a portfolio of sample bindings that you can refer to again and again. The kit fee includes all quilted fabrics and bindings. A kit fee of \$10 will be collected when

you sign up.

September 17, 2013 - Phyllis Binkley - "How to Show Space and Create Depth in Quilts" Learn how Phyllis creates her landscape quilts with special materials and techniques and see her trunk show of winning quilts. **September 18, 2013 - 9-3 - Phyllis Binkley** - "**Building a Landscape**" workshop will use her hand-dyed fabrics and her 30 years of experience being an art teacher, to let you create your own landscape. Foundation, backing, batting and binding fabrics will be provided and a heat-bond will already be attached to the fabrics so they will be ready to be cut and composed. A materials fee of \$45 will be collected with the class fee.

We took a careful look at all of the jobs for the show and have pared back in a number of areas. In addition, we know that some of you are not able to

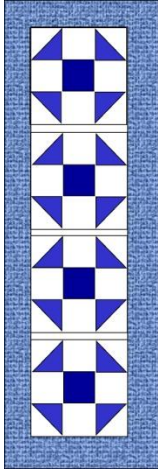


work the weekend of the show and so we are trying to identify things that you can help with during the time leading up to the show.

We need people to sort quilts, and we need someone to oversee all the wonderful prizes available, plus there are many more ways you can help out.
