This month we will not have a guest speaker (as we have the Quilt Show wrap-up), however I will take this opportunity to discuss our President's (Pam Overton) "thank you" quilt blocks...

Yes, this is Pam's third year as President. First year (2000), second year (2001). It is time to thank our President, Pam Overton for her work and achievements of 2010-2011 by creating Amish quilt blocks for her. Blocks are made by all members of the Guild. Pam has chosen a traditional Amish Nine-Patch Quilt for her theme. Two and one-half inch black squares alternating with a solid color, use the same color in all alternating squares. These blocks may be sewn by hand or machine. Since the quilt probably will be hand quilted, it might be nice if you hand-stitched the block, but it is up to you. The blocks should be **6-1/2 inch unfinished**. The Guild will supply, the black fabric. You will cut 5 black squares, and add your solid color to create a 9-patch Amish block. Please sign your block, on the front, but be sure your signature is within the 6" area. The blocks will be **due at the June 2011 meeting**. We will have an information table set-up at the April and May meetings. Stop by, pick up the black fabric. Sample blocks will be available at the table. I hope everyone will contribute, to show Pam our appreciation for her three years as President. Any questions, call Carollee Schuegraf, 310.265.9796. If you are unable to attend the meetings, please call me and I will mail you the black fabric

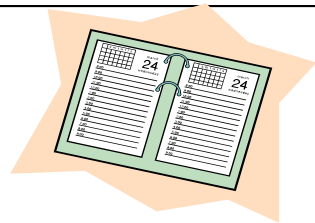

Jan Hirth - Four Way Appliqué Class

This workshop will focus on learning four different methods of appliqué: freezer paper and starch, needle turn, interfaced applique, and invisible machine stitching. After trying four appliqué techniques, you will be able to construct your own garden quilt with the 12 flowering block patterns from Piece O' Cake Designs using the appliqué method of your choice.

One block pattern will be given in class. If you wish to make the whole quilt, you will need to purchase the Piece O'Cake pattern. Check with one of our local quilts shops (Luella's Quilt Basket or AAA Sewing and Vacuum) to order the full pattern.

Department of Child Services (DCS) Project

Please join us at our monthly "Sweatshop," March 8, 2011 (the second Tuesday of the month). We convene at 7pm, this time in Room 12 at Hamilton Adult School, 2606 West 182nd Street, Torrance. Bring scissors and/or a sewing machine (perhaps a pointy chopstick), and help us sandwich 60-80 quilts.

We're once again scheduling daytime work parties. Work parties are different in that we meet in a member's home and take about twenty pre-pinned quilts through the entire production process (sewing around, trimming, turning, closing, labeling, and tying). Let me know if you want to be included in work party notifications, or if you would like to host a work party at your house. They're held different days of the week, always from 10 to 12. These get-togethers are casual and low key, and we often have lunch afterward at a nearby restaurant, optional of course. If evenings and after dark isn't that appealing to you, or if you don't work during the day, then join us for a work party. It might be the just the thing for you. Call me: Mary 310.326.4953.

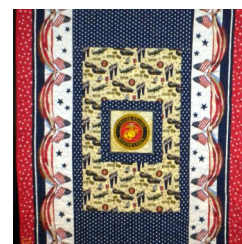
Quilts for Wounded Warriors

Thanks to Guild member Judy Platus and her daughter, we had the honor of sending this Marine quilt (displayed at the Quilt Show) to their family friend and war hero, Marine Corporal Farrell Gilliam from Ridgecrest CA. Farrell stepped on an IED in Afghanistan on Jan 5 and suffered many catastrophic injuries, including amputation of both legs. He has undergone multiple surgeries and is currently at the Naval Medical Center in Bethesda MD. His family set up a Facebook Page to communicate his status, if you'd like to follow his progress. Our thoughts and prayers are with this brave young warrior and his family.

Our thanks also go to Westside Quilters, a new sister Guild, for the 3 beautiful quilts and pillowcases they have already given us for our wounded warriors. With their help and the help from our local chapter of Blue Star Mothers, I was able to send a box of 6 quilts to Iraq in answer to their request for more quilts. Our next box, which is almost ready (need 3 more quilts) will go to Camp Bastion, Afghanistan, the area where Cpl Gilliam was injured. His company has sustained the heaviest losses in Marine Corps history since Vietnam.

The continuing need for these quilts speaks for itself! While there are many groups making quilts for our wounded, the biggest difference with our project is that we send them directly to the war zones so the critically injured receive them immediately after they are wounded, and keep them for the trip home. While the quilts are appreciated wherever they are received, I feel it's worth the extra cost and effort to send them directly to combat hospitals where they are needed most, and medics say they "mean everything there" when given to them in the triage units. They arrive in just one week, and our contacts keep me informed via email. ♦♦

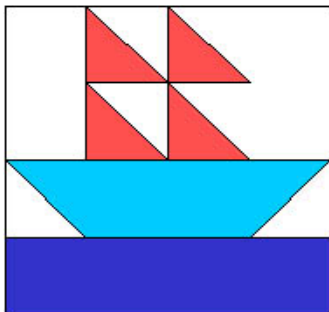
