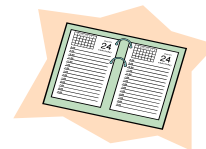

## Quilts for Wounded Warriors

**Requirements: Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size), All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable), Appropriate patriotic theme/design, optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric**



This beautiful flag quilt with matching pillowcase was donated at our Quilt Show by Dolores Wagner, who has made other warrior quilts and continues to make more. We enjoyed talking to the many visitors and other Guilds who stopped by our Community Outreach tables at the show. Surfside Quilters Guild of San Clemente reported they have now made 100 wounded warrior quilts since they began last May – Congratulations!

Thanks to the generosity of our quilters and several sister groups, we sent 38 quilts to Afghanistan last month – a record! Kudos to African American Quilters of LA for donating 15 quilts; other contributors include Westside Quilters, Quilts from the Heart, Ladies Tea Society, Lois Grover's friendship group, plus several individual donors. With the current turbulence in Afghanistan, I suspect these quilts are already comforting injured troops.

A recent article in Air Force Times newspaper shows one of our quilts being used by a wounded warrior on a gurney while being transported in a military airplane. The article states that survival rates have improved significantly thanks to their excellent care, and your quilts have been a part of that care. We received a heartwarming Thank You note from MSgt Natalie Rancourt, an Air Force medic from Fullerton CA who is currently stationed at Bagram Air Field. She thanks us for our support which helps her care for wounded in the transition unit, and said "It is easier being away from home when you know the home team is rooting for you!"

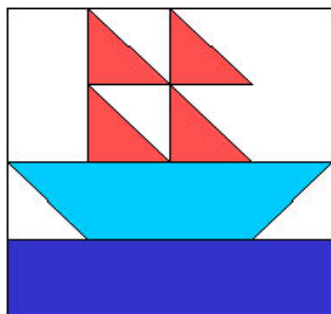
