## Comfort Project – Mary Shadbourne

Join us for our monthly second Tuesday Sweatshop from 7p to 9p Tuesday, March 12, 2013 at Levy Adult School, Room 7 (near the south parking lot), 3420 West 229th Street, Torrance. This is where we sandwich sixty to eighty comfort quilts and get them ready for further processing and delivery. Several new members are attending Sweatshop and finding it a good way to meet other quilters in a smaller setting. If you're a new quilter, Sweatshop is a great place to learn the basics. It's a plus if you bring your sewing machine, but that's definitely not a requirement; your own scissors, perhaps (ours are of questionable, but serviceable quality). Other than that, we have everything you need, including friendship and laughter.

If you'd rather not go out after dark (to Sweatshop), please give some thought to volunteering for the Quilt Posse. Posse members are notified when small-group "work parties" are scheduled. They happen on various days of the week, always from 10a to 12p, and always at "the hub" (Mary Shadbourne's house). Come empty-handed to this one--no need to bring anything. You can work for one hour or two, whichever you choose. Join the Posse by signing up at The Comfort Project table (back of the room) at the March meeting. If you're already deputized, don't sign up again... you'll be a posse member until you tell us to delete your name.

Another way you can help with The Comfort Project is to take home a kit—make that a few kits—no, make that several kits—OK, make that as many kits as you can carry! Kits are assembled in 6-1/2" squares, ready for you to sew together at your leisure. There's no rush—you can return finished tops at the next guild meeting, or the next, or... later. These tops are paired with backs and the sets are brought to Sweatshop when we have our monthly sandwiching project.

*[Editor's note: Mary has a mountain of kits ready to sew. I took home four kits after the last guild meeting. Took me only a little over an hour to complete them all! Now I've decided to pledge that I will sew at least 2 kits a week! How about you? How many will you pledge to do each month? If we all pitch in to get the tops sewn the guild will be able to provide many more quilts to the shelters and hospitals in our community that so desperately need them.]*

**Read Me a Quilt – Julie Maas**

Wasn't it great to see all of the interest in our Read Me a Quilt program at our quilt show? People expressed interest in making quilts for CASA as well as starting their own program. I hope they follow up on their interest. JoAnn Cope made some quilts for CASA as did her friend. June Stewart picked up a quilt top from our give away table, finished the quilt and turned in a lovely little quilt. Karen Rakita, Bobbi Bell, and Nadine Kirk each made a quilt. Joyce Sharifi donated some lovely brand new books. If you want to use one of those books for a CASA quilt, please contact me. Thank you ladies for all of your hard work making quilts and finding appropriate books to go with them. You amaze me with your creativity and generosity.

**Department of Child Services PARTY**

Last year we threw a "Baby Shower" for the Dept of Child Services at the May meeting. It was so successful we thought we would do it again this year, with an eye to making it an annual event. Since we are no longer collecting items on a monthly basis this seems a good way to continue to help with this program.

This year we want to expand the focus to include all of the age groups. We will have a drawing at the April meeting where you can draw a slip of paper indicating girl or boy, age 0-2, age 3-5 or age 6-8. This way we hope to have items for other than just babies.

**So here is the plan:** April meeting, draw for the age range and gender of your recipient. May guild meeting we will have a DCS PARTY themed event.

Plan to bring items for the DCS Emergency Placement Bag project. Please read the following suggestions from DCS as to what they find most helpful.

**DEPARTMENT OF CHILD SERVICES (DCS) PROJECT**

This program supports the foster children in the care of DCS. These children, because of domestic violence or unsafe conditions, often leave their homes with just the clothes on their backs. Our contributions help improve the quality of life for these children and families.

The idea is to provide emergency supplies for the children as they are moved into the foster system. The age group for these items is from infant to 8 years. The list below will serve as a guide as to the types of things that are needed.

You might want to get together with a friend or two or maybe your friendship group to assemble a backpack. Or, if you don't feel like you have time to shop for these things just donating a gift card would be greatly appreciated. Also individual items are greatly appreciated.

**PLEASE NO USED ITEMS**

What every Emergency Placement Bag could use:

A gift card valued at \$25.00 for a department type store that is open late hours such as Target or Wal-Mart. This would cover the child if she/he needs a toothbrush, underwear, socks, pajamas or food. Grocery store gift cards would be second best option such as Vons, Ralphs or Albertsons. Even a \$10.00 card or individual items would help.

**Ages 0-2** Diapers, wipes, baby clothes, onesies, bottles, blanket, age appropriate toys. Gift card.

**Ages 3-5** Kids cups, pull-ups, toddler clothes, age appropriate toys. Gift card.

**Ages 6-8** Clothes, shoes, socks, underwear (boys seem to prefer boxers), nightlight, flashlight, tooth brush and paste, hair brush, comb, pajamas, sweats (pants and shirts), jeans, shirt, jacket. Gift card.

All donated items will be turned over to the Department of Children & Family Services, Torrance Regional Office, 2325 Crenshaw Blvd. Torrance.

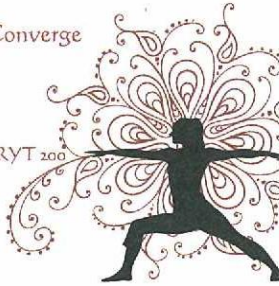

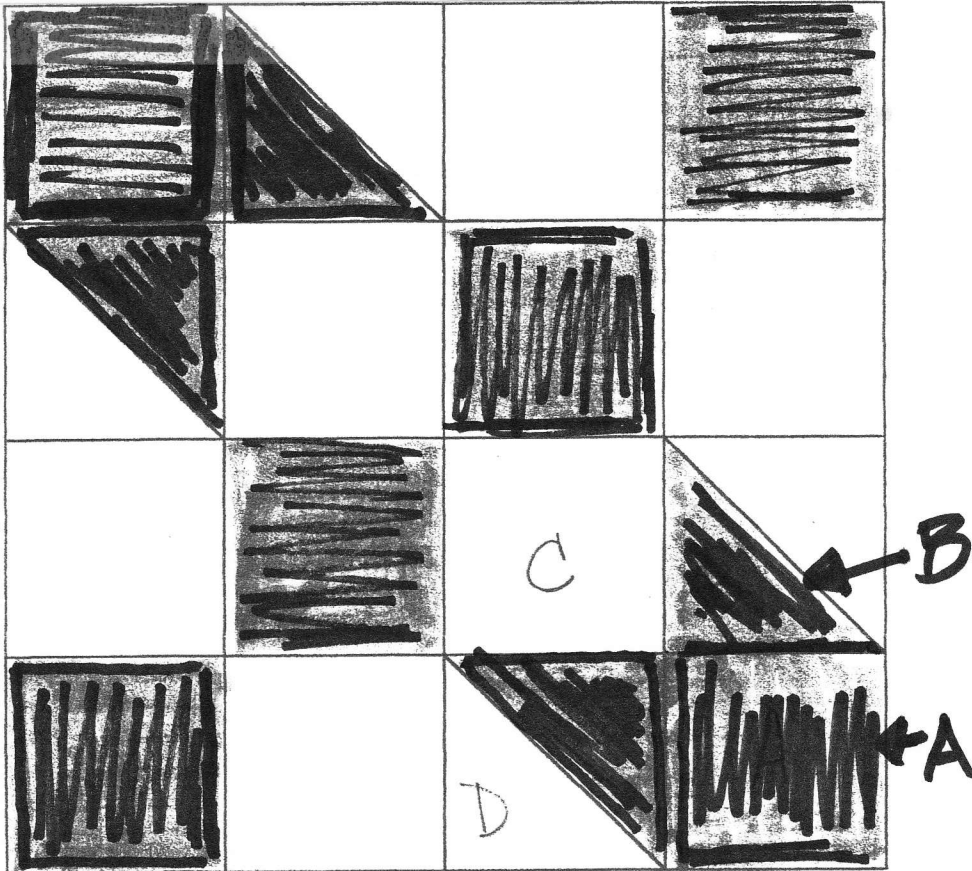

From any color batik fabric cut:

- A. 6 squares 2 3/4" x 2 3/4"
- B. 2 squares 3 1/8" x 3 1/8", cut on the diagonal to make half square triangles

From cream or off-white fabric cut:

- C. 6 squares 2 3/4" x 2 3/4"
- D. 2 squares 3 1/8" x 3 1/8", cut on the diagonal to make half square triangles

Sew together as shown.

If you have a preferred method of construction, please use it.

Sign your name on the back. Remember to heat set the ink.
