After taking high school Home Ec. classes her attitude about sewing changed and she decided to get a degree in home economics education from the University of Arizona. She came to California in 1965 and got a teaching job in Santa Ana. She married Ted in 1967, taught a few more years then had two children. In 1973 Jan made her first quilt for her newborn daughter. She has since made over 200 quilts. She is a charter member of Beach Cities Quilters Guild and was president in 2000.

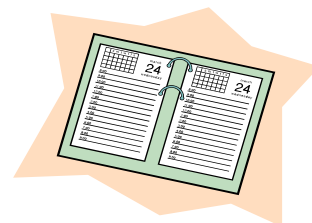

Jan Hirth - Four Way Appliqué Class

May's workshop will focus on learning four different methods of appliqué: freezer paper and starch, needle turn, interfaced applique, and invisible machine stitching. After trying four appliqué techniques, you will be able to construct your own garden quilt with the 12 flowering block patterns from Piece O' Cake Designs using the appliqué method of your choice.

One block pattern will be given in class then if you wish to make the whole quilt, you will need to purchase the pattern from a quilt shop or www.Pieceocake.com.

Unfortunately, the class is full, however if you are interested contact me in case of a cancellation. The August Workshop is also an appliqué class so you might want to take that class.

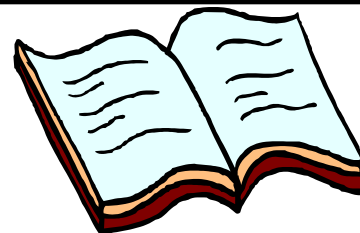

Quilts for Wounded Warriors

In April we sent 2 boxes of quilts to Afghanistan. The first box of 6 quilts went to Bagram, and a second box of 5 quilts went to Camp Bastion in S. Afghanistan. Both bases have very busy medical facilities that see a lot of combat injuries.

FYI, I network with some out-of-state quilters who get their mailing addresses from me, and we share feedback since we all have the same common goal. An “e-friend” quilter in TN got a very inspiring phone call from a wounded warrior that applies to all of us, so I’ll share an extract of that call: “Your gift reached me in Afghanistan before I was sent to Germany. I was a wounded warrior and your gift gave me the motivation to heal and drive forward and try my best. It means a lot to me that we have people here in the States who still continue to do things like sending us gifts. I wanted to let you know on behalf of the entire United States Marine Corps who have fought and lost their lives and their limbs that what you did means a lot to us.” This Marine talked to his men about what we did for him, and told them not to give up because of people like us at home. He is now back in NC and said his little son sleeps with this quilt every night!

I received another thank you note from a Marine who received one of our quilts: “I am a Marine who had a little accident with an IED and hurt my foot pretty good. . . The pillow case and quilt you made are great. Please pass my best to the Quilts for Wounded Warriors group.”

The lovely quilt above (with matching pillowcase) made by Guild member Karen Rakita wasn’t shown at our last meeting, so I’m including a picture for show & tell in the Newsletter. Many thanks to all of you who have given so generously of your time and talents to support our wounded warriors. The common theme heard from medics and warriors alike is that it means so much to know that someone cared enough to make them hand-made quilts. As I prioritize my time in retirement, I ask myself what I do that has more impact than showing a wounded warrior that we care – a tough act to beat. Please know that your support is deeply appreciated -- and unfortunately the need goes on. ♦♦

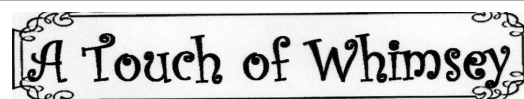

Pam has chosen an Amish Nine Patch as the theme. **Two and one-half inch black squares** alternating with a **solid (brights) color**, use the same color in all alternating squares. Please use **unwashed fabric**. Guild will supply the black fabric so pick up black fabric at table. Cut **4 black squares**, and add your solid color to create a 9-patch Amish block. Please sign your block, on the front, but be sure your signature is within the 6" area. Unfinished size: 6-1/2 inch.

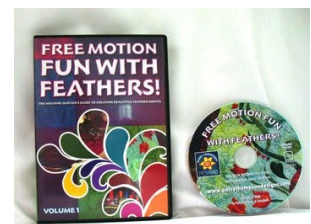

As I began writing this month's article, I thought of characteristics that usually come to mind when thinking about a quilter and our May honored member is loaded with them. Stephania Bommarito is talented, generous, caring, enthusiastic, devoted, and passionate about her creations. She is readily willing to share her skills with others, and to volunteer whenever asked. A member for over 30 years, she has always been a hard worker for our causes and always with a great attitude.

Stephania is from Minnesota and came to California for college where she majored in Textile Design Art at Long Beach State. In 1971 she studied textiles in Japan toward a masters degree. For more than 30 years she made costumes, wedding gowns and special occasion dresses as a dressmaker. She began quilting as a young girl and made doll clothes, her own clothes and quilts through her church group. This is where her knowledge and love of quilting started.

She confesses her studio and home are filled with more than 3000 books, plus articles, magazines, DVD's and that's not to mention fabric and tools. Stephania likes Sharyn Craig as a teacher because of her "what if" ideas. She loves art quilts and thinks the log cabin block might be her favorite because of the "possibilities". 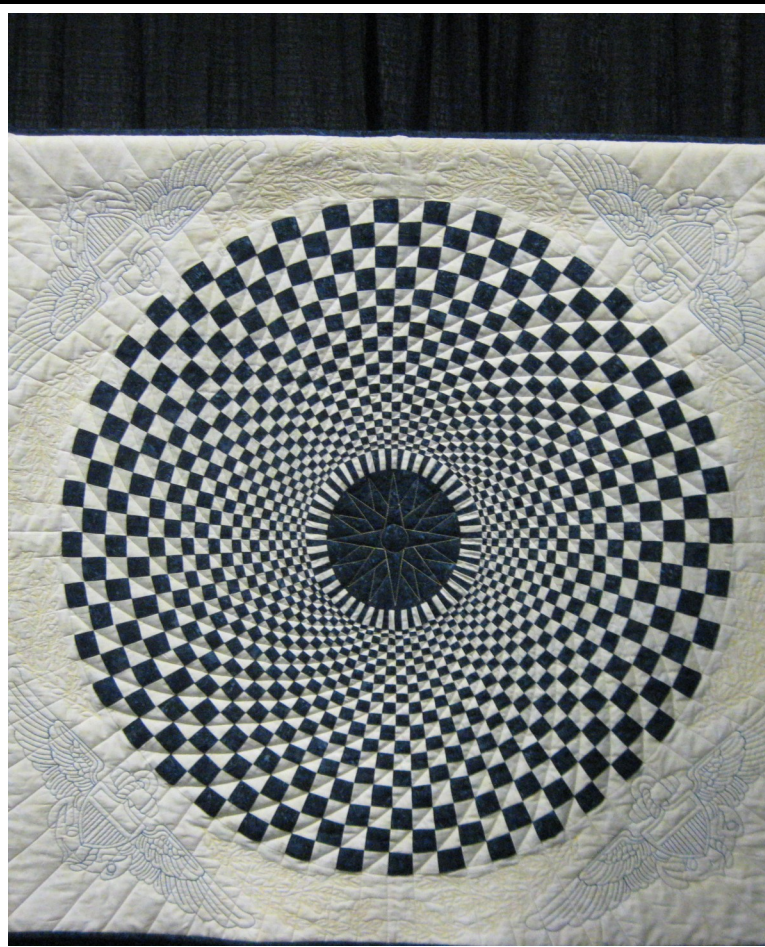

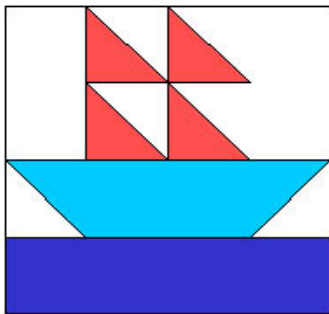
