With the calendar shift for May Sweatshop will be May 21 (third Tuesday) at Levy School. Mary has the details for you. Welcome all who want to come help with the Comfort Project. This is a great way to get acquainted with new and old members. Won't you join us?

Last but not least, remember you can help support the St. Andrews food bank by bringing canned goods to our meeting. Their greatest need is for meats and fruit. The drop off table is near the entrance.

Philanthropy

Once again it is time to start thinking about possible recipients for our annual Philanthropy Donation. The board will make a recommendation as to the dollar amount. That information will be presented and voted on at the May meeting. Then at the June meeting we will vote on the recipient.

In the meantime we are asking you to think about the charity you would like to nominate. I will accept verified nominations at the April and May meetings. Please remember these donations are made to IRS-sanctioned 501(c)(3) non-profits. Nomination forms are available on our website under Financial Forms. See the form for detailed instructions as to the verification requirements. I will also have hard copies of the nomination forms at the meeting.

To date we have received the following nominations.

BREAST CANCER ANGELS: Provide financial and emotional assistance for women and their families as they are going through breast cancer treatment. Orange and LA County. Also do one-time emergency assistance in the Inland Empire and San Diego County.

Food Program, Housing Needs, Clothes and Other Needs, Medical Co-Pays and COBRA Costs, Home Health Care & Final Expense, Second Opinion

Fund, Scholarship Fund, Holiday Party for Clients, Social Worker, Legal Assistance.

SISTERS BY HEART: Provide support and care packages to families whose children are born with hypo plastic left heard syndrome, a form of congenital heart disease. These babies undergo surgery within the first few weeks of life. Monies will be used to provide special leggings and hospital PJs that are used for the comfort and ease in caring for the infants in the NICU pre- and post-surgery as well as other useful items included in the care packages.

PTA CHRISTMAS BASKETS, LAWDALE COUNCIL: Provides Christmas baskets (last year 125 families and 20 seniors). Baskets include at least 2 boxes of food including meats and canned goods, toys for children. A totally volunteer program with no paid staff.

DELHAVEN COMMUNITY CENTER: A non profit social service agency which provides social, recreational and educational activities to mentally challenged adults and "at risk" youth in the San Gabriel Valley Area. Monies would be used to refurbish the library used for their reading and writing programs.

Quilts for Wounded Warriors – Arlene Zobrist

Since many of you saw the front of the warrior quilt made by Dorothy Brown (quilted by Raylene Christmas) at our last Guild meeting, I wanted to show you the lovely "thank you" label she put on the back. Quite a few of you have done similar labels, and I'm sure these messages add even more value in conveying our appreciation for their sacrifices.

In April we sent 9 quilts to the front line hospital in Bagram, Afghanistan. Thanks so much for your continued generosity in making these stretcher-size quilts, and the beautiful quality displays your wonderful quilting talents. When our wounded warriors receive a hand-made, colorful quilt directly in the stark war environment where they are injured, it shows them we care enough to make and ship them to the combat hospital, which is mentioned in all the thank you notes received from patients, their families, and from their medical staff.



Requirements:

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

New members and novice sewers are warmly encouraged to attend this monthly event. We love it if you bring your sewing machine, but if that's a bother, feel free to just bring yourself—and maybe a pair of scissors for trimming the quilts once they've been sewn around.

Quilt Posse hasn't been active for a while, but be on the lookout for email notifications of weekday morning work parties in the near future.

April's silent auction, the necktie "crazy" quilt, was won by Melanie Dreike. The May silent auction (seventeen yards of fabric including four yards of Ultrasuede), will end after the break at the May meeting. A new silent auction will start at the May meeting and will end at the June meeting.

ANNOUNCEMENT: Before the May meeting (between 6 and 7p), I'll be demonstrating the quick, quick method of assembling a quilt top from squares arranged in columns (vertical rows). Most of our kits are arranged this way, and once you've learned this method, you'll probably arrange not only our other kits, but your own quilt tops as well, in this manner, before you start to sew. I will be at the Community Services table in the back of the meeting room. Come watch.

Department of Child Services Party

Our DCS PARTY is scheduled for the May meeting So this is the time to bring items for the DCS Emergency Placement Bag Project. We all drew a child (age and gender) at the April meeting. We hope that will help you with your decisions about what to bring. See the article below for a description of the project and guidelines on what they need.

The DCS program supports the foster children in the care of DCS. These children, because of domestic violence or unsafe conditions, often leave their homes with just the clothes on their backs. Our

contributions help improve the quality of life for these children and families.

The idea is to provide emergency supplies for the children as they are moved into the foster system. The age group for these items is from infant to 8 years. The list below will serve as a guide as to the types of things that are needed.

You might want to get together with a friend or two or maybe your friendship group to assemble a backpack. Or, if you don't feel like you have time to shop for these things just donating a gift card would be greatly appreciated. Also individual items are appreciated.

PLEASE NO USED ITEMS

What every Emergency Placement Bag could use:

A gift card valued at \$25.00 for a department type store that is open late hours such as Target or Wal-Mart. This would cover the child if she/he needs a toothbrush, underwear, socks, pajamas or food. Grocery store gift cards would be second best option such as Vons, Ralphs or Albertsons. Even a \$10.00 card or individual items would help.

Ages 0-2 Diapers, wipes, baby clothes, onesies, bottles, blanket, age appropriate toys. Gift card.

Ages 3-5 Kids cups, pull-ups, toddler clothes, age appropriate toys. Gift card.

Ages 6-8 Clothes, shoes, socks, underwear (boys seem to prefer boxers), nightlight, flashlight, toothbrush and paste, hair brush, comb, pajamas, sweats (pants and shirts), jeans, shirt, jacket. Gift card.

All donated items will be turned over to the Department of Children & Family Services, Torrance Regional Office, 2325 Crenshaw Blvd. Torrance.

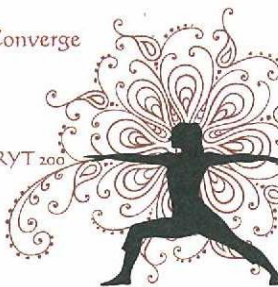

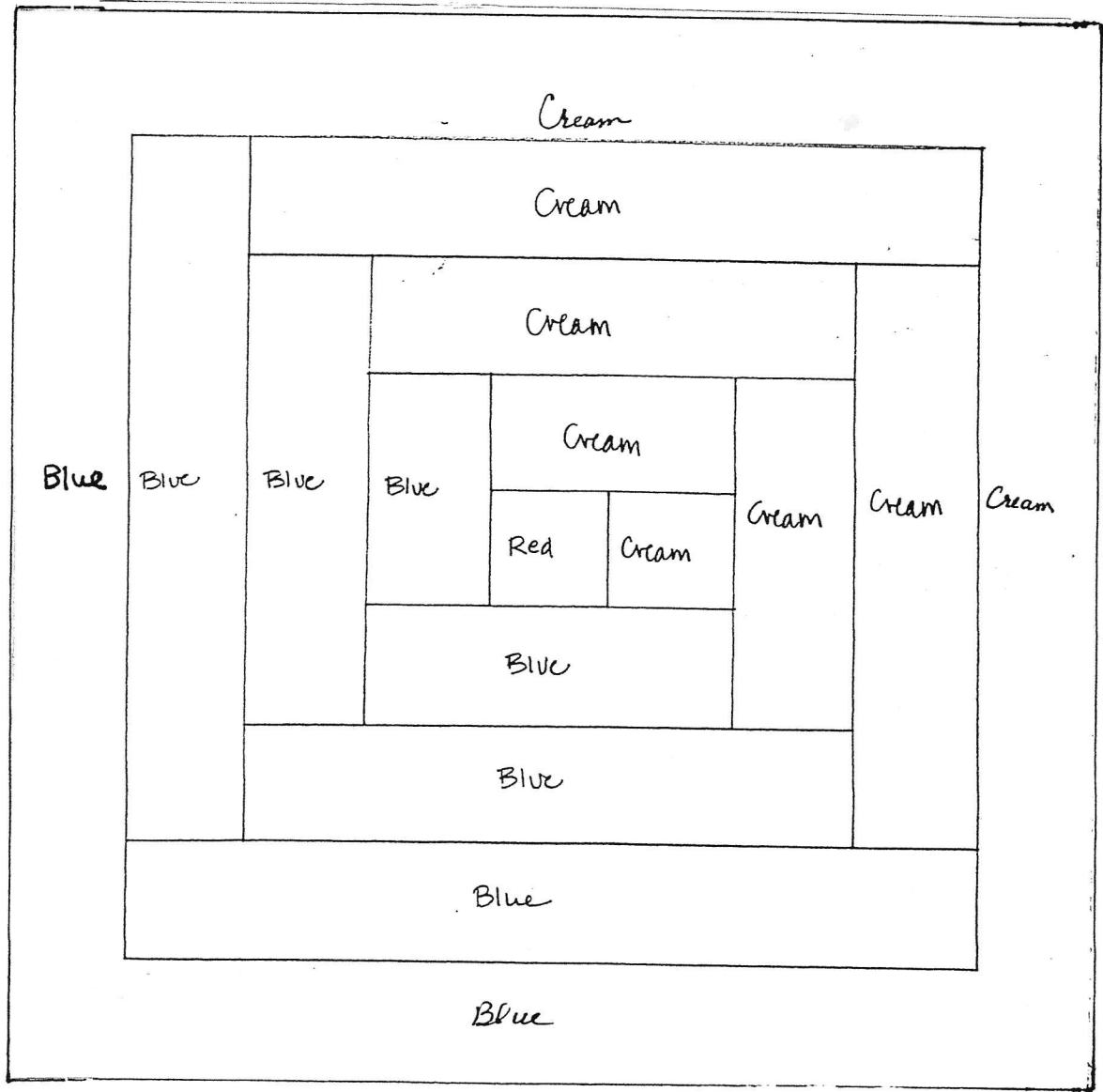

SBQG Block of the Month
Log Cabin
June 2013 Drawing

Log Cabin (9 ½" Unfinished, 9" Finished)



Red: Start with a 1 ½" x 1 ½" center square.

Strip piece the block using 1 ½" strips of blue and cream strips as shown until the block measures 9 ½" unfinished or 4 rows on each side of the center.

If you have a preferred method of construction, please use it. Also sign your name on the back. Remember to heat set the ink.
