Programs /Workshops Stephania Bommarito & Jo Catalano

● May's speaker is **Linda Wagner. "Games This Quilter Plays"** – Quilting, for Linda, was just a fun hobby. Then, after joining a quilt guild, things got rapidly out of hand. Show and tell was her favorite part of the meeting as she saw so many patterns to try. In short order, she had over 80 UFO's (unfinished projects). Sound familiar?? This lecture is full of games that she plays with herself to get motivated to finish the volume of "need to be done" quilts. Some games apply to specific projects and some are bigger tips on how to avoid unfinished projects.

● May, 2015 – **"Borders"** So you finished your blocks and the quilt is done....oh you actually expect me to sew the blocks together - AND it needs a border? So, you just cut an interesting fabric into larger strips add it on all sides and call it done. If this describes your quilt making, you are missing an opportunity to add a little extra pizzazz to your quilt and create something stunning. This class explores options that use simple techniques to create the WOW factor. In class, we will learn a method for making a simple block with

Quilt Show 2016 - Sue Glass

**"Celebrating the Red, White and Blue!"
February 13/14, 2016**

It's time to begin preparations for our February 2016 Quilt Show. As you can see above, our 2016 Theme is "Celebrating the Red, White, and Blue!" Our beautiful red and white quilt is being quilted as this is written, and we hope to have it out and about very soon. We are planning to have a special exhibit of antique red and white and blue and white quilts as our Sunday exhibit. We will call for antique quilts in these colors as we get closer to the show dates.

Our challenge theme this year will be "Hearts." As you may notice, our show will be open on Valentine's Day, so we thought this would be fun. You may use any technique or style of quilting, and you may use any colors as long as the theme is represented. You might think of names of songs, or books, or sayings that include the word "Heart" as your inspiration, or you can use a traditional block or applique pattern, whatever you like. Your entry must be a completed piece, 18" x 18." We will have prizes again this year, and will vote for the winners at our January 2016 guild meeting. Call me

We encourage you to make an auction quilt to donate for our February 14 auction. We need about 50-55 quilts to make up our auction, so let's all get busy! Sandra Scharch will begin taking your auction quilts at our August meeting. The auction proceeds make up a large part of our show profits. Department of Child and Family Services PARTY

Bring your donations to the May meeting and we will take it from there.

DEPARTMENT OF CHILD SERVICES (DCFS) PROJECT

This program supports the foster children in the care of DCFS. These children, because of domestic violence or unsafe conditions, often leave their homes with just the clothes on their backs. Our contributions help improve the quality of life for these children and families.

The idea is to provide emergency supplies for them as they are moved into the foster system. The age group for these items is from infant to 8 years. The list below will serve as a guide as to the types of things that are needed.

You might want to get together with a friend or two or maybe your friendship group to assemble a backpack. Individual items are also appreciated. Or, if you don't feel like you have time to shop for these things just donating a gift card would be greatly appreciated.

PLEASE NO USED ITEMS

What every Emergency Placement Bag could use:

A gift card valued at \$25.00 for a department type store that is open late hours such as Target or Wal-Mart. This would cover the child if she/he needs a toothbrush, underwear, socks, pajamas or food. Grocery store gift cards would be second best option such as Vons, Ralphs or Albertsons. Even a \$10.00 card or individual items would help.

Ages 0-2 Diapers, wipes, baby clothes, onesies, bottles, blanket, age appropriate toys. Gift card.

Ages 3-5 Kids cups, pull-ups, toddler clothes (including socks, shoes, underwear, pajamas), age appropriate toys. Gift card.

Ages 6-8 Clothes, shoes, socks, underwear (boys seem to prefer boxers), nightlight, flashlight, toothbrush and paste, hair brush, comb, pajamas, sweats (pants and shirts), jeans, shirt, jacket. Gift card.

All donated items will be turned over to the Department of Children & Family Services, Torrance Regional Office, 2325 Crenshaw Blvd. Torrance.

SWEATSHOP INFORMATION: The second Tuesday of the month, May 12, 2015, is the sweatshop date this month. Please come and help us sandwich 60 plus comfort quilts, assembly line style. Don't assume others will step up and do this job—make

the commitment to at least check it out. Come to Levy Adult School, 3420 West 229th Place, Torrance, 7 to 9p, Room 6, just off the south parking lot, close to the office. A few of us will be there to greet you. No quilting skills required!

Items to bring to sweatshop (all optional):

- Scissors for trimming
- A chopstick for turning
- Your sewing machine for sewing around pinned quilt sets.
- A friend! We need all the help we can get.

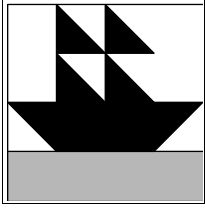
