Lecture: Del Thomas,
Thomas' Contemporary Quilt Collection

Del Thomas has been making quilts for more than sixty years, since her childhood in Oregon. A long time resident of Southern California since 1957; her addiction to quilting didn't really start until the late 1970s and it just gets worse every year. She enjoys trying many fascinating new techniques, but she still prefers commercial printed cottons, traditional piecing and few embellishments. Her quilts have appeared in magazines, a calendar, traveling exhibits, major and minor quilt shows and two solo exhibits. Many of her quilts are in private collections. Her work was included in the books *America From the Heart* and *Creative Quilting: The Journal Quilt Project*. She also contributed information on collecting quilts to Robert Shaw's *Art Quilts: A Celebration*.



Del is the owner of the Thomas' Contemporary Quilt Collection that is shown at different venues, quilt guild meetings and of course all over her house. Quilts from the Collection are loaned to museums and galleries to help promote art quilts. The Collection has grown to more than a hundred quilts, some are large and will cover a wall and some are smaller than a playing card. Included are works by well-known and not-so-well-known artists from across the USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Belgium, Germany, Denmark, and Japan.

Her presentation will include about 35 quilts and their stories. She will also talk about collecting art quilts.

Start planning for a two-day machine quilting extravaganza in January. We have not one but TWO WORKSHOPS with Jill Schumacher...Quiltmaker to the Queen! If your New Years resolution is to hone your machine quilting skills this is the perfect opportunity. Take advantage of this opportunity to spend two full days learning techniques and practicing your skills in machine quilting. Even if you have taken one or more machine quilting classes in the past, there is always something new to learn from each teacher.

Tuesday January 18, 2011

In this class you will learn the basics of machine quilting doing quilt loops, curves, designs, free motion straight lines and simple stippling. You will also learn how to follow a design, both continuous and beautiful heirloom feathers. Your pre-work for this workshop will be to make a completed Ohio Star Block to quilt in class.

Wednesday January 19, 2011

Jill will teach an intermediate machine quilting class: The Mini Wholecloth Wall Hanging. In this workshop ou will learn more elaborate patterns and how to stitch them. Learn how to stitch a beautiful feathered wreath or heart with a feather border and some decorative background quilting.

Department of Child Services (DCS) Project

We are proposing to sponsor a year-long project to support the foster children in the care of DCS. These children, because of domestic violence or unsafe conditions, often leave their homes with just the clothes on their backs. Let's improve the quality of life for these children and families. Our Read-Me-A Quilt project provides quilts and books for some of the children in foster care, but there is a more immediate need for help as they are removed from their homes and enter the system.

We're asking that you donate new items to help fill Emergency Placement Bags (aka backpacks) for the children. You can participate by donating individual items or perhaps join with a group to provide the items to fill a Bag. When you turn your items in, please make sure they are labeled as to age group.

The age group for these items is from infant to 8 years. The list below will serve as a guide as to the types of things that are needed. We would like to donate some Emergency Placement Bags to DCS in time for the holidays. The collection of the items for this first donation will be held at the November and December meetings. Backpacks will be the #1 item, so please consider a needy child this holiday season and throughout the year. And while the lists include blankets for each age group, I'm sure that if you provide the other items, Community Service will provide a quilt for each backpack.

PLEASE NO USED ITEMS.

What every Emergency Placement Bag needs or can use:

A gift card valued @ \$25 for a department type store that is open late hours such as Target or Wal-Mart. This would cover the child if she/he needs a toothbrush, underwear, socks, pajamas, food. Grocery store gift cards would be the second best option such as Vons, Ralphs, and Albertsons.

Ages 0-2 Diapers, wipes, baby clothes, bottles, blanket, age appropriate toys. Gift card.

Ages 3-5 Kids cups, pull-ups, toddler clothes, blanket, and age appropriate toys. Gift card.

Ages 6-8 Clothes, shoes, socks, underwear, nightlight, flashlight, toothbrush & paste, hair brush, comb, pajamas, sweats (pants, shirts), jeans, shirt, jacket. Gift card.

We will also be collecting useable luggage (new or used) for children that will be transitioning out of the Foster Care program.

Read me a Quilt

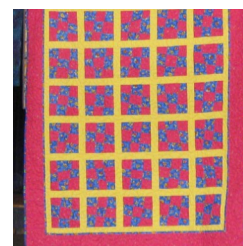

Quilts for Wounded Warriors

Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton (*including batting, 80/20 acceptable*)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

We sent 10 quilts to wounded warriors in Afghanistan last month: 5 to the combat hospital in Bagram, and 5 directly to the busy trauma center at the field hospital in Camp Bastion, Southern Afghanistan. Since they support a Marine unit, I used some of the new Kaufman fabric to make the Marine quilt shown here. A picture of this quilt is also going to Robert Kaufman Fabrics, along with photos of the Dr Seuss Read Me A Quilts, to say thank you for their donation.



We still have a lot of the donated fabric, so please let me know if you would like to use some of it to make a quilt. It includes military fabrics for the Army, Navy, Marines and Air Force, some red/white/blue star fabrics and some with flags, plus several rolls of red binding tape. If you tell me how much you need, I'll bring it to Guild meeting.

If you don't know how to reduce the size, send your photo anyway. All entries must go through the Acquisitions Committee including the Round Robin and Challenge quilts. Your quilt does not have to be totally finished when you enter as long as you know you will have it done by the show. The photo must show design and color and the finished size must be defined in order to plan the hanging. Please completely fill out the form!

If you would like to have a professional judge review and critique your quilt, here is your chance. A judge's critique lets you know what you are doing well and where you need to improve. Critiques are anonymous.

To allow time prior to the show for the judging, quilts being judged must be handed in at the **February guild meeting**. There is a fee of \$10 per quilt to cover the judge's fee. **The deadline for submissions is the December meeting.**

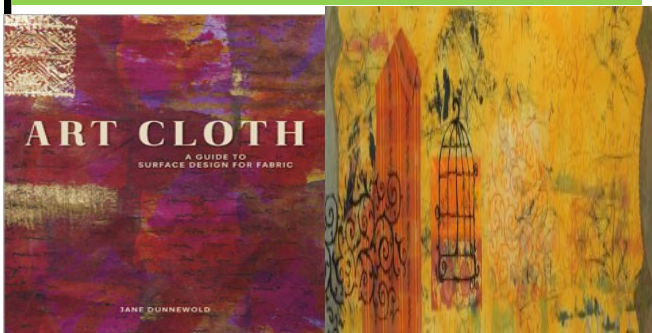

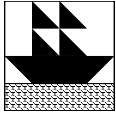

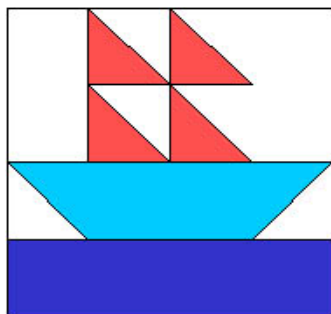
