Congratulations, Joanne! I saw her quilt top when she picked up some batting, and it is stunning! Joanne promises to bring

her finished quilt to Show & Tell. If anyone wants a copy of this pattern, please let me know and I'll bring it to our next meeting. Although it's twin size, Joanne said it is easily adjusted to the stretcher size required for our wounded warriors.

I've heard from several of you who have quilts in work and I look forward to seeing the finished products. The local DAR has asked me to speak



and display a couple quilts at their Nov meeting, so I'll show them with pride. Thanks for your wonderful support to our troops to let them know we care!

### Requirements:

**Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)**

**All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)**

**Appropriate patriotic theme/design**

**Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric**

Our regularly scheduled evening Sweatshop will take place Tuesday, November 13, 2012. Please plan on joining us at Levy School, (Room 7 near the south parking lot), 3420 West 229th Street, Torrance, from 7:00 to 9:00pm. Bring your sewing machine if you can. The more machines we have humming, the more quilts we'll get into the pipeline. Keep in mind, we don't have a Sweatshop in December, so we're counting on the big push to end the year this month. If you have a favorite pair of scissors, bring them for trimming and turning (or you can use our scissors, but they're not always all that sharp). During those two hours, we'll sandwich sixty to eighty comfort quilts to distribute throughout the community.

For the general guild meeting, please consider taking home one or two quilts that require simple machine quilting. They're starting to stack up again. As usual, no urgent deadline to get them finished. All your help is greatly appreciated.

Please be sure that you have filled out the applications completely with accurate measurements for the size of the quilt. Applications are available on line in the Member section of the SBQG website. The team will be available to take photos and accept forms of your quilted items at the meeting. Again, you will have the opportunity to have your quilt judged. Just note your desire on the application form. **Sunday Quilts** – If you have a large size basket quilt that we can hang on Sunday after the Auction quilts come down, please enter this quilt through the regular process and mark that it is a Sunday Quilt on the application.

**“It’s a Basket” Quilt Show Challenge** – Don’t forget to enter your Basket Challenge quilt. Several fascinating quilts have already been entered. All quilts are entered through the Acquisitions entry form. Just mark the box on the form that it is a Challenge quilt. The rules are simple. There are only two basic rules. The quilt can be no more than 30” is any direction and has to have a “basket” somewhere in the quilt.

**Auction Quilts** – Our auction basket has begun to fill up. We have 15 quilts. Yet, the goal is to have about **50 quilts** for our live auction. Anyone who donates an auction quilt receives a raffle ticket to win a Longaberger basket plus a show pin. Entry forms and requirements are available on the website and at Guild meetings. multi-day pass, please let us know. We will discount your price to \$35.

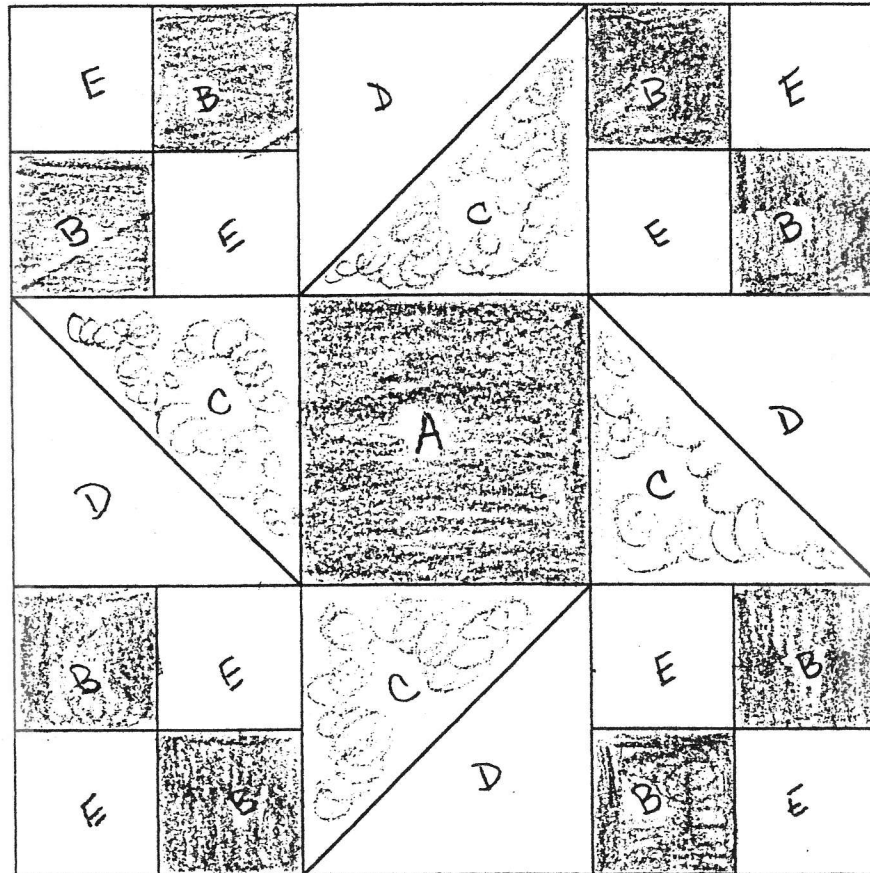
Saturday is also the day that we'll be displaying our opportunity quilt at the show. So sign up this month

Indiana Puzzle  
December 2012 Drawing  
(9 1/2" unfinished, 9" finished)

Use any Christmas fabrics for the medium and darks and use a cream fabric for the light.



From the dark fabric

- A. Cut 1 square, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
- B. Cut 8 squares 2" x 2"

From the medium fabric

- C. Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" x 3 7/8", cut on the diagonal to make half-square triangles

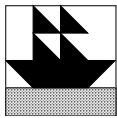
From the light fabric

- D. Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" x 3 7/8", cut on the diagonal to make half-square triangles
- E. Cut 8 squares, 2" x 2"

Sew together as shown.

Sign your name on the back in the seam allowance. Remember to heat set the ink.

\*Note: If you have a preferred method of construction, use it instead.

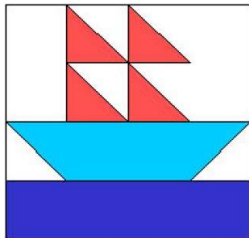
