Programs /Workshops Stephania Bommarito & Jo Catalano

● November 18, 2014 - **Wendy Mathson - "Scrap Management"** We all have bags and boxes of scraps collected over time. What do we do with them? Wendy will answer this question. She will show many types of scrap quilts, from antique to modern. Plus, Wendy will share practical suggestions and tips about how to save, sort, store, and use those leftover bits of loved fabrics.

● November 19, 2014 - **"Storm at Sea / TRIMplate piecing"** This pattern and its variations is a wonderful way to use up scraps. The TRIMplate rulers are a unique tool that allows for greater accuracy while you sew. There are neither templates, paper foundation piecing, nor bias edges. You will be amazed at how this versatile block can produce such a wide variety of unique quilt designs. What a great way to end the year by using up scraps.

Programs/Workshops (continued) • January 21, 2015 – **“Recycle/Reuse”** Every year, we all make a New Year’s resolution to finish UFOs or actually set the blocks we made into a quilt. This workshop will definitely inspire you to unearth your orphan blocks, unloved fabrics, or UFOs. Ann will guide you down new avenues to encounter new solutions using slice & dice techniques along with some simple piecing to give those projects a



completely new fun look.

• February 18, 2015 – **Nancy Chong – “Hawaiian Quilting: Its History, Traditions and Superstitions”** Nancy began making Hawaiian quilts in 1978, and immediately became intrigued with the history and folklore surrounding this spectacular quilting art form. With her own quilts, she shares what she has learned about the traditions and superstitions that are interwoven with Hawaiian quilt making, the mysterious story of how they began, and how they became her obsession.

- February 19, 2015 – “Hawaiian Appliqué” In this workshop, you will have a hands-on experience with cutting out a Hawaiian block, basting, and needleturn appliqué. Nancy’s stress-free needleturn techniques are fun, relaxing, and easy. You will learn the ins and outs of the least time-consuming method of hand appliqué. No freezer paper, toothpick, cardboard, plastic, starch, or interfacing – just you, your



fabric, needle, and thread.

Footnote: All workshops are held in Room 308, in the Children’s wing upper schoolroom area of St. Andrews. The time is always 9am – 3pm.

At the November guild meeting:

Auction Quilts: We need lots of wonderful auction quilts! Sandra Sarch is our auction chair this year, and will accept your quilts through the January meeting. Each quilt must be accompanied by the auction quilt form found on the website (members only section) or gotten from Sandra at guild. Maximum size for auction quilts is 36 x 36 or 144” around the outside edge. **Deadline for turning in your auction quilt is the January guild meeting.** Talk to Sandra if you have questions about the auction quilts or the deadline.

Acquisitions: Pam Overton and Melanie Dreike will

accept acquisition forms and pictures for your quilt show entries. Please note there is a **change in the deadline** for show entries this year. **Your completed application and photo must be received by the acquisition committee NO LATER THAN NOVEMBER 30, 2014.** The application form is included in this newsletter, and is also found on the website in the members only section. The form and photo may be completed and submitted on line, printed out and mailed to Pam or given to her at the November guild meetings. Your entry does not have to be completely finished before sending in the application form, but it must be at least a completed top and far enough along that we know the whole quilt will be completed before the show. Call Pam or Melanie if you have questions.

Block Challenge: Diana Smith will continue to accept entries for the Block Challenge. Please be sure to fill out the Block Challenge Form (found on the website, members only section) and safety pin it to the back of your submission. We have more than 20 wonderful blocks already. **Deadline for Block Challenge submission is the December guild meeting.** Here is a photo of just a few of the beautiful blocks we have



already received. We need more, though, so I hope many of you are still working on them.

Advance Sale Entrance Tickets: Julie Limbach-Jones has discounted entrance tickets for the show. These tickets are \$6.00 per person if purchased from her before the show. Regular admission is \$8.00 at the door.

Opportunity Quilt: We will show our opportunity quilt on Saturday, January 25, and of course we need support. Signup sheets will be at the Show Staffing Table. We must provide 20 hours of white glove work in order to show our quilt at Road. Remember you can split your shift with a friend if you like.

Opportunity Quilt Raffle Tickets: Please see Nancy Jengo before the meeting starts to get your packet of 20 tickets to sell so that we don't have to remind you by calling out your name at the meeting. Nancy will mail out any packets we have remaining after the November meeting. We ask that every member sell at least 20 tickets to support our quilt.

Raffle Baskets: We will continue to accept donations for the raffle baskets at the November meeting. We have lots of notions and books, but we need more solid and blender fabric so clean out those stashes!

Pins: Diane Miller has our beautiful show pin. This pin is a limited edition, so when they are all gone, they are gone. You will receive a free pin when you submit an auction quilt or you may purchase one from Diane.

Staffing: Signup sheets will be available at guild. We ask that every guild member put in at least 3 hours at the show, whether it's for show setup, takedown, white glove, entrance, etc. Your commitment of time allows our show to be one of the best Southern California! Please see Sue at the guild meeting to sign up or have a question. You may also call her anytime.

Quilt Show 2016

I know – it's more than a year away, but you may want to know that our theme for 2016 will be "Celebrating the Red, White and Blue" as it is the 240th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Our Opportunity Quilt will be red and white. If you
