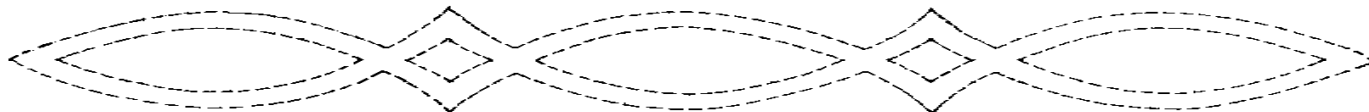

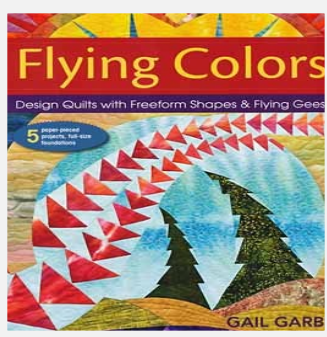

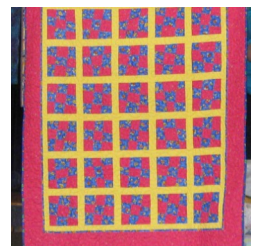

Quilts for Wounded Warriors

Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton (*including batting, 80/20 acceptable*)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

In September we sent 7 quilts, pillowcases, and a few blankets to the military nurses in Camp Bastion Afghanistan who are living in a tent. We also sent 5 quilts and pillowcases to the combat hospital in Iraq since we still have 50,000 troops there. Our next shipments will go to the two Afghanistan hospitals since their needs are increasing.



The stunning Wounded Warrior Quilt pictured here was made by Guild member Eva Killingsworth. She creatively showcased the Marine official seal and some Marine military fabric by framing it with "bunting" fabric, which she fussy-cut to make a very striking border. This is an excellent example of how to use panels and special fabrics for these quick quilts, and I'm sure this one will be a huge hit!

Good news – Robert Kaufman Fabrics has donated some patriotic and military fabric for our Wounded Warrior Quilts. We also got a generous donation of patriotic fabric and gift cards from members of the Torrance First Baptist Church, thanks to Don Bunting. Don continues to donate his long-arm services for this project, and the South Bay LA Chapter of Blue Star Mothers continues to pay for all shipping costs. They also hosted a quilt workshop to get more quilts/quilters. We say thanks to all our sponsors who are showing their gratitude and support for our Wounded Warriors. If you'd like to make a quilt using these fabric donations, please let me know and I'll get some fabric to you. There is a nice selection of patriotic colors plus a few service-specific designs. ♦♦

We encourage submission by email (the address is an active link on the form). If you know how to reduce the file size of your photo file, please do so as this helps not to overload the mailbox. If you don't know how to reduce the size, send your photo anyway as we have enlarged the mailbox. All entries must go through the Acquisitions Committee including the Round Robin and Challenge quilts. Enter sooner rather than later. Your quilt does not have to be totally finished when you enter as long as you know you will have it done by the show. The photo does need to show design and color and the finished size has to be defined in order to plan the hanging.

If you would like to have a professional judge review your quilt and give back constructive critique, here is your chance. A judge's critique lets you know what you are doing well and if you need to improve in an area. Critiques are anonymous. In order to have time prior to the show for the judging, the quilts to be judged are due to be handed in at the February guild meeting. There will be a fee of \$10/quilt to cover the judge's fee.

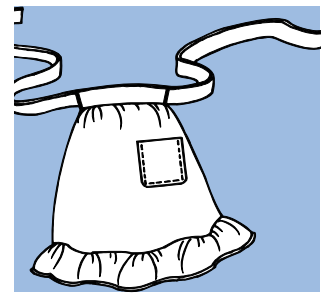

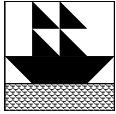

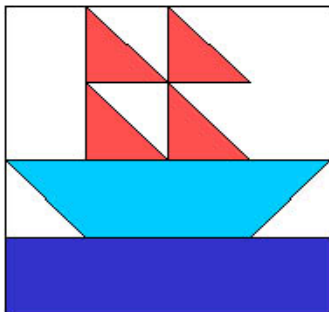
