First comes the simple sewing of strips and strips of fabric to batting. Then we'll cover it with one large piece of black fabric. Did you know that there is an amazing array of gorgeous patterned all-black fabric out there? It's true! You'll learn to freely cut a pattern-less picture from that one piece of cloth. The final sewing is simple, but the finished piece is striking! You don't even have to BE an artist to make this one-of-a-kind piece of true ART... and it's FUN! This class will be at the church. 9-3.

We continue to have our Sweatshop on the second Tuesday each month at Levy School 7:00 to 9:00 pm. . Everyone is welcome; bring your machine or scissors to trim with. It is always a fun evening and we get stacks of quilts processed.

Wow! Wasn't that a wonderful display of CASA quilts...thank you all, including the members of Quilts From the Heart.

As usual Julie and Arlene will be accepting quilts for CASA and Wounded Warriors. With the current critical need in Afghanistan your Wounded Warrior quilts truly make a difference.

Last but not least, remember you can help support the St. Andrews food bank by bringing canned goods to our meeting. Their greatest need is for meats and fruit. The drop off table is near the entrance.

Quilts for Wounded Warriors – Arlene Zobrist

This beautiful design came from a quilter not in our Guild, and it was so unique that I thought you would like to see it. If anyone wants the pattern, let me know and I will contact the quilter.



The quilt is already in Afghanistan; I send them as soon as possible due to the critical need.

For any new members, these quilts are shipped directly to the two front-line hospitals in Afghanistan, where they are given to critically wounded troops and are deeply appreciated, both by patients and medics. One hospital is at Camp Bastion which was recently attacked and suffered some fatalities so the trauma rate is high. It's an honor to be able to send these quilts directly to our wounded in combat. Please be aware that the timing is now – hopefully they won't always be needed there.

We still have batting for your warrior quilts, and lots of fabric including large pieces for backing. Stop by our table at the next meeting.

Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)
All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)
Appropriate patriotic theme/design
Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

Quilt Show – Baskets of Quilts & More - February 16-17, 2013

Quilt Acquisition – Calling ALL quilts and garments! Where are you?? Please enter your many items as early as possible. We have plenty of room for quilts of all kinds and often more than one entry per person. The acquisition form is available on our website or at the meetings. We encourage you to file your applications on line to save time for the acquisition team. The team will be available to take photos and accept forms of your quilted items. Remember the quilt top must be completed and the entry form completely filled in order to enter your items. Again, you will have the opportunity to have your quilt judged. Just note your desire on the application form.

“It’s a Basket” Quilt Show Challenge – How is your quilt for the challenge coming along? There are so many possibilities. There are only two basic rules. The quilt can be no more than 30” in any direction and has to have a “basket” somewhere in the quilt. Copies of the challenge will be available at the meetings and on our website. You enter the quilt through the Acquisitions entry form.

Auction Quilts – Our auction basket has started to fill up. That is good news. However, the goal is to have about **50 quilts** for our live auction. Anyone who donates an auction quilt will receive a raffle

ticket to win a Longaberger basket plus a show pin. Entry forms and requirements are available on the website and at Guild meetings. You can donate a quilt of any style, technique, or color. Enjoy fabricating a treasure for the auction!

Raffle Baskets – The baskets have begun to be filled especially with books. Now we need fabrics, notions, patterns, threads, or other quilt related items. What unique basket theme could be you come up with as well as the well-loved ones like patriotic, holidays, seasonal, animals, nature, color scheme choices. Our guests do enjoy discovering what is in each basket.

Opportunity Quilt & Sewing Machine Tickets – Mary McHale has the ticket packets ready for all members to pick up for both the quilt and sewing machine. The “Parade of Baskets” quilt is an eye-catcher so it is easy to sell tickets. The sewing machine is the perfect size to travel with you wherever you go. 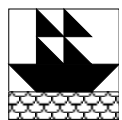
Intra-Guild – Carollee Schuegraf & LaVerne Owen-Barakat

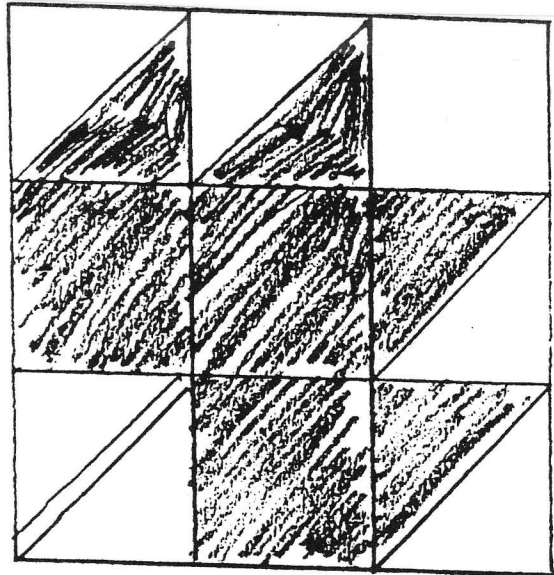
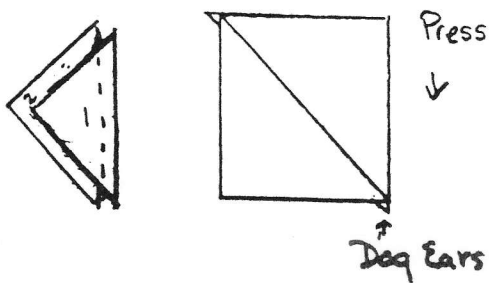

SBQG Block of the Month
Maple Leaf
November 2012 Drawing
(9 1/2" unfinished, 9" finished)

This month we have chosen the Maple Leaf pattern for our BOM project. For the leaf use any fall color. For the background fabric use cream, and for the stem use green or brown.

1. Fabric 1: Leaf. Use any fall color.
 - a. Cut 3 3 1/2" squares
 - b. Cut 2 3 7/8" squares, cut in half on the diagonal
2. Fabric 2: Background. Use cream or cream print.
 - a. Cut 1 3 1/2" square
 - b. Cut 3 3 7/8" square, cut in half on the diagonal
3. Fabric 3: Stem. Cut one 3/4" x 6" rectangle in brown or green
4. For the stem square, sew a background triangle to each long side of the stem.
Trim the block to 3 1/2" square.
5. Sew together as shown.

Quilting 101: A half-square triangle is a square made of 2 triangles. One way to make a half-square triangle is to cut a square 3/8" larger than the desired half-square triangle out of two fabrics, then cut them on the diagonal. (If the half-square triangle is to be 3 1/2" then cut squares 3 7/8"). Stitch, press, and trim the "dog ears" as shown below.



Sign your name on the back in the seam allowance. Remember to heat set the ink.

*Note: If you have a preferred method of construction, use it instead.

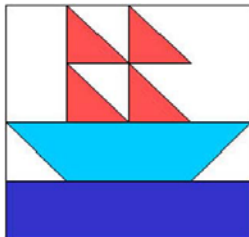
