Programs /Workshops Stephania Bommarito & Jo Catalano

October 21, 2014 - **Grace Errea "Value of Value of Color"** Color gets the credit but VALUE is what always makes a successful textile piece. Grace will explain what VALUE is, how to see it, and how to use it. Once understood, your quilt color choices will always end up being amazingly effective when you focus on value and let all other colors fall into place naturally.

October 22, 2014 - **"Intro to Heat-Set Machine Appliqué"** In the class you will learn to use an appliqué technique so new and revolutionary; you will use nothing else once you try it. It is easy, foolproof and the results are always amazing.

This technique leaves the quilt and the fabric soft and manageable, not stiff and board-like, as fusible webs and glues do. This technique produces a "no-fray raw edge appliqué" as a result. Along with this, participants will learn about the Value of using **Value** in your textile work. This workshop is worth taking just to learn this concept as you incorporate values into all your future quilts.

November 19, 2014 – **“Storm at Sea / TRIMplate piecing”** This pattern and its variations is a wonderful way to use up scraps. The TRIMplate rulers are a unique tool that allows for greater accuracy while you sew. There are neither templates, paper foundation piecing, nor bias edges. You'll be amazed at how this versatile block can produce such a wide variety of unique quilt designs. What a great way to end the year by



using up scraps.

January 20, 2015 – **Ann Turley – “Why Am I Buying Broccoli When All I Want To Do Is Quilt?”** This is a quandary with which we can all identify. “Stop!! Don't toss that dryer sheet - I think I can use it! Wait - I need to go to Home Depot before I start this quilt, and probably the Dollar Store as well.” This is a quote from Ann's website. There are so many items that we can use that do not have a "quilt" label attached. Ann has a suitcase full of traditional non-quilting stuff that can be used in your next project that will leave you laughing

and racing off to the "other" quilting sources.

January 21, 2015 – "**Recycle/Reuse**" Every year, we all make a New Year's resolution to finish UFOs or actually set the blocks we made into a quilt. This workshop will definitely inspire you to earth your orphan blocks, unloved fabrics, or UFOs. Ann will guide you down new avenues to encounter new solutions using slice & dice techniques along with some simple piecing to give those projects a completely new fun look.

Quilt Show Committee Meeting schedule: Our next meeting will be at 5:30, November 4, before board meeting, at Marie Calendars on Hawthorne at Torrance Blvd. There will not be a meeting in October. An agenda and meeting reminder will be sent to all committee members around the middle of October.

At the October guild meeting:

Auction Quilts: We need lots of wonderful auction quilts! Sandra Scharch is our auction chair this year, and will accept your quilts through the January meeting. Each quilt must be accompanied by the auction quilt form found on the website (members only section) or gotten from Sandra at guild. Maximum size for auction quilts is 36 x 36 or 1296" around the outside edge. **Deadline for turning in your auction quilt is the January guild meeting.** Talk to Sandra if you have questions about the auction quilts or the deadline.

Acquisitions: Pam Overton and Melanie Dreike will accept acquisition forms and pictures for your quilt show entries. Please note there is a **change in the deadline** for show

entries this year. **Your completed application and photo must be received by the acquisition committee NO LATER THAN NOVEMBER 30, 2014.** The application form is included in this newsletter, and is also found on the website in the members only section. Additionally, here is the URL for the form: <https://docs.google.com/spreadsheet/viewform?formkey=dHB5WDNWcWN3MmlrZkdMUjJfNks4QXc6MA#gid=0>. The form and photo may be completed and submitted on line, printed out and mailed to Pam or given to her at the October or November guild meetings. Your entry does not have to be completely finished before sending in the application form, but it must be at least a completed top and far enough along that we know the whole quilt will be completed before the show. Call Pam or Melanie if you have questions.

Block Challenge: Diana Smith will continue to accept entries for the Block Challenge. Please be sure to fill out the Block Challenge Form (found on the website, members only section) and safety pin it to the back of your submission. We have almost 20 wonderful blocks already. **Deadline for Block Challenge submission is the December guild meeting.** Don't forget there will be prizes for first, second, and third place.

Raffle Baskets: Peggie Wormington will accept donations for the raffle baskets. We have lots of notions and books, but we need more fabric so clean out those stashes!

Pins: Diane Miller has our beautiful show pin. This pin is a limited edition, so when they are all gone, they are gone. You will receive a free pin when you submit an auction quilt or you may purchase one from Diane.

Staffing: Signup sheets will be available at each guild meeting (including for White Glove). We ask that every guild member put in at least 3 hours at the show, whether it's for show setup, takedown, white glove, entrance, etc. Your commitment of time allows our show to be one of the best Southern California! The Comfort Project - Mary Shadbourne

SWEATSHOP NEWS: Second Tuesday sweatshop is scheduled for October 14 this month. Join us from 7p to 9p at Levy Adult School, Room 6 (near the back parking lot and close to the office), 3420 West 229th Place, Torrance. Bring a sewing machine if you can, but no matter if you can't; we have plenty of tasks to assign. Some people like to bring their own scissors, but we have scissors for you to use. Together, we'll sandwich sixty to eighty comfort quilts for finishing and distributing to those in need in our community.

QUILT POSSE INFORMATION: Give me your email address and your permission and I'll put you on the Quilt Posse list. As a posse member, you'll be notified when we get together during the daytime for small group work sessions, similar to our regular sweatshops, except we don't sweat. Posse parties are a great way to meet other members in an informal setting, even if you've been in the guild a long time. Posse members, watch your email for future (occasional) posse activities.

SILENT AUCTIONS ENDING IN OCTOBER: (1) another vintage quilt, 60" x 80", hand quilted, small Dresden plates with lattices and cornerstones. \$100 minimum starting bid, (2) a small wall hanging, 16.5" x 21", and (3) twenty blocks, 13" x 24", botanicals, machine embroidered on white-on-white and white-on-beige
