She spent years doing prom dresses and entire wedding parties and later had a business in Baton Rouge making ladies sportswear.

She has always loved quilts, but only had time to make a few for special occasions. When they moved to Shawnee, OK, she got into a talented group of ladies and really got hooked on quilting. While there she started her company, "Dogwood Designs". Janet has designed a line of patterns, Dogwood Designs, starting with her popular Oklahoma Sunsets a few years ago. Her patterns have raw edged fusible appliqué designs on beautiful sunset batiks.

When they moved to Beaumont, Texas, she started participating in quilt shows to sell her designs and kits. Most notable is the International Quilt Festival in Houston. 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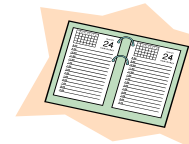

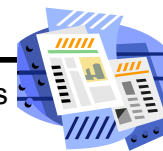

Patchwork Star Report

The Patchwork Star for September, 2011, is Mary Jane Jewell. Mary Jane was born in Portland, Oregon but has lived most of her life here in California. Her mother taught her to sew when she was a child and she was making her own clothes by the time she was a teenager.

Her path to quilting started in the early 1980's when she took a couple of classes on crazy quilting and appliqué while living in Chicago. She really started to quilt when she discovered Hawaiian appliqué quilts in 1997. She started off making quilts and pillows using the Hawaiian appliqué method and eventually began creating her own patterns.

She joined the SBQG the same year. Since joining the guild she has chaired the Fashion Show, co-chaired the Quilt Show and served on the Board in the capacity of Workshop Chair. She enjoys art quilts and appliqué and says she has been inspired by many different teachers.

Most of us know Mary Jane because of her incredible talent in making clothing and costumes. She belongs to the Costumers Guild West, Inc. and has served on its Board of Directors. Mary Jane has her own small business which she runs out of her home creating custom clothing and costumes. She is currently working on costumes for a couple from the Jane Austin Society which entails both a man's and a woman's period costume. The man's costume will include an embroidered silk satin waistcoat, circa 1815. Many of the costumes she makes are reproduction historical clothing and fantasy costumes for various groups and conventions. Mary Jane enjoys reading science fiction and fantasy and creates costumes for herself and others when she attends science fiction conventions. She is very active in these groups and runs the art shows at the conventions.

We are lucky to have such a talented and fearless talent as a member of our guild. Welcome Mary Jane Jewell! ♦♦

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

We continue to get thank you notes from our wounded warriors and their caregivers showing their appreciation for our quilts. One wrote "I wanted to let you all know that your quilts are going to great use here at Bagram and are very much appreciated – a great touch of down-home America to the many service members here. Thanks for your generosity, patriotism, support, and just being the great American people you are." Another wrote: "I would like to thank you all for the quilt and pillow case . . . very useful and makes me feel a little at home." Another warrior said that he "flipped the quilt over today so he could enjoy the pattern on the other side for awhile." Our quilts continue to get delivered in one week or less which is amazing considering the distance and fact that they go to an actual combat zone.

The beautiful Army quilt shown here was made by Nadine Kirk who has done several and has more in work. It was shipped too soon for Show & Tell at our last meeting and is already in Afghanistan. Several of you have put thoughtful personal messages on your quilt labels, and I'm sure your special touch will be treasured by our warriors.

Our thanks to Westside Quilters for bringing me 5 more beautiful quilts, and especially to Pepper Leibow for making extra pillowcases, which are always needed since I enclose each quilt in a pillowcase. Our continuing thanks to Blue Star Mothers of America for paying for all the shipping, and to Don Bunting for donating his long-arm services. A reminder from Don that the backing and batting need to be 4 inches larger than the top on all sides. ♦♦

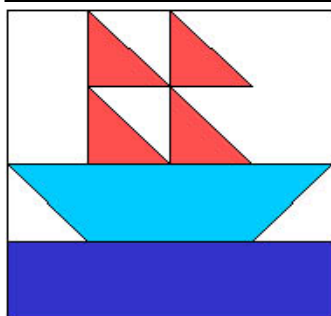
