Yes, you can submit a quilt for display at Road and our show but please complete an application for each event. And remember, the quilt you enter for Road must be complete, quilted, bound, with a sleeve on it by the December meeting!

Anyone who donates an auction quilt will receive a raffle ticket to win a Longaberger basket with lid, perfect for storing thread and needles, a small project, odds and ends, as well as a show pin. fabric left over from making Pam's President quilt. Have you finished a UFO that now needs a new home? You can donate a quilt of any style or kind. Use your imagination and create a treasure for the auction!

Raffle Baskets – The baskets have barely begun to be filled. They need to be jam-packed with treats galore. Ruby Tabata is ready to receive all donations of large baskets as well as any quilt related items you have to donate to the cause. Fabrics, notions, patterns, books, threads, or??? are just some suggestions. Scrap Bag

Free Quilt and Frame!!. An 88” x 88” square quilt, a scrappy quilt in the spools pattern with fabric from 30’s, 40’s and later has been machine pieced and partially hand quilted. There are 6 rows across and 6 rows down. The blocks are made from four 6” blocks are about 12 inches square and have sashing between the blocks. About 2 rows have been hand quilted. The quilt frame has 3 long spindles and comes with an additional 3 short spindles. This quilt is from an estate sale. Yes, the quilt maker is known. Bonnie Winters will be happy to answer any questions you may have. If interested call Bonnie. It will go to the first caller.

Harvest of Colors – Quilt Show / Costal Quilters Guild, September 22-23, 2012

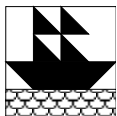

At the end of the year you will have your own color wave of 9 ½” blocks of keepers.

Each month we will have some hard copies of the pattern at the meeting as well as our on-line versions in the newsletter (see the pattern at the end of the newsletter) and on our SBQG website. It is our intent to keep it simple so we have a large group participating. Also, if you have preferred methods of construction, please use it in lieu of those provided. 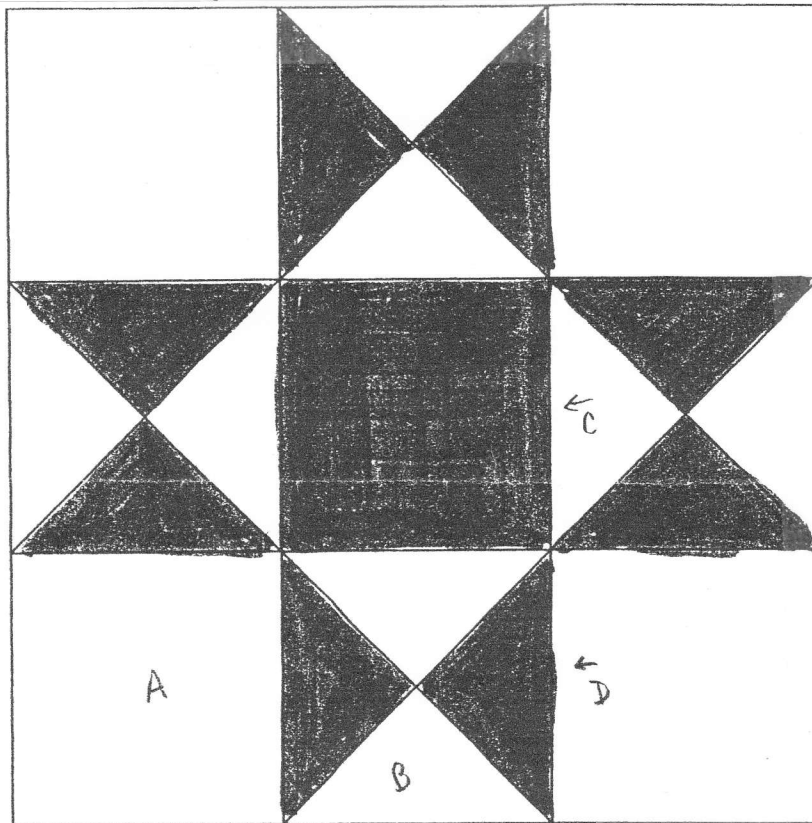

SBQG Block of the Month
Ohio Star
October 2012 Drawing

Our next block of the month is another old and traditional block. Again, you can submit up to five blocks for the maximum number of chances to win the October drawing. Also, don't forget to make a "keeper" of your own choice of colors. The two colors this month are cream background and any blue for the color.

Ohio Star 9" Block Finished (9 1/2" Unfinished)



For the background use a cream fabric.

A Cut 4 3 1/2" squares

B Cut 2 4 1/4" squares, cut twice on the diagonal to make quarter square triangles.

For the star and center square use any blue of your choice.

C Cut 1 3 1/2" square

D Cut 2 4 1/4" squares, cut twice on the diagonal to make quarter-square triangles.

Sew together as shown.

Note: If you have a preferred method for construction of quarter square triangles, feel free to use it

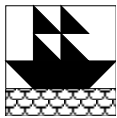

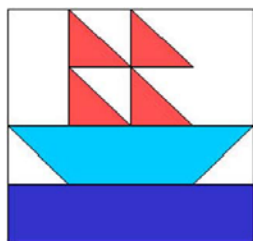
Special Presentation at the Lomita Library – Helen Lu
