Dinner with the Speaker: All guild members are invited to join us for dinner with the speaker at 5:00 pm. The restaurant is Good Stuff and is located at Ave I and PCH. Let Stephania know if you can come so there is enough seating.



October 21, 2014 – Grace Errea “Value of Value of Color” Color gets the credit but VALUE

is what always makes a successful textile piece. Grace will explain what VALUE is, how to see it, and how to use it. Once understood, your quilt color choices will always end up being amazingly effective when you focus on value and let all other colors fall into place naturally.

October 22, 2014 – The workshop will be “Intro to Heat-Set Machine Appliqué” In the class you will learn to use an appliqué technique so new and revolutionary; you will use nothing else once you try it. It is easy, foolproof and the results are always amazing.

This technique leaves the quilt and the fabric soft and manageable, not stiff and board-like, as fusible webs and glues do. This technique produces a “no-fray raw edge appliqué” as a result. Along with this, participants will learn about the Value of using **Value** in your textile work. This workshop is worth taking just to learn this concept as you incorporate values into all your future quilts.

November 18, 2014 – **Wendy Mathson – “Scrap Management”** We all have bags and boxes of scraps collected over time. What do we do with them? Wendy will answer this question. She will show many types of scrap quilts, from antique to modern. Plus, Wendy will share practical suggestions and tips about how to save, sort, store, and use those leftover bits of loved fabrics.

November 19, 2014 – **“Storm at Sea / TRIMplate piecing”** This pattern and it’s variations is a wonderful way to use up scraps. The TRIMplate rulers are a unique tool that allows for greater accuracy while you sew. There are neither templates, paper or foundation piecing, nor bias edges. You’ll be amazed at how this versatile block can produce such a wide variety of unique quilt designs. What a great way to end the year by using up scraps.

SWEATSHOP NEWS: Second Tuesday sweatshop is scheduled for September 9 this month. Join us from 7p to 9p this coming Tuesday at Levy Adult School, Room 6 (near the back parking lot and close to the office), 3420 West 229th Place, Torrance. Machines are always welcome, but if you come empty-handed, we have plenty of tasks to assign.

QUILT POSSE INFORMATION: Give me your email address and your permission and I'll put you on the Quilt Posse list. As a posse member, you'll be notified when we get together during

the daytime for small group work sessions, similar to our regular sweatshops, except we don't sweat. One member called it "social sewing." It's a great way to meet other members in an informal setting, even if you've been in the guild a long time. We rounded up several additions to the posse over the summer. Watch your email for future posse activities.

WOOHOO - we've reached QFWW #500 !!! What a wonderful way to start our new year in the Guild. Mary McHale made this beautiful milestone quilt, complete with hand-embroidery and long-arm quilting by Don Bunting. We are dedicating it in loving memory of a local South Bay hero who gave his life for his country. Army

Corporal Joseph Anzack, Jr, a close friend of Mary's son and family, was killed in action May 23 2007, after being captured May 12 while supporting Operating Iraqi Freedom. More information is available on the web. Joseph is also commemorated in the Veteran's Park on Anza Ave and Lomita in Torrance.

You should all be very proud of achieving this goal of 500 quilts (and still growing). I'm personally gratified by your strong support for this project, which joined our already active Community Services outreach several years ago. The stretcher size of these quilts makes them a bit challenging, and also serves as a sobering reminder of their purpose of bringing comfort to our wounded on the front line. I hope you find this as rewarding as I do, and please know your efforts also mean so much to their families. The

Anzack family asked me to relay their appreciation for this honor for Joseph.
