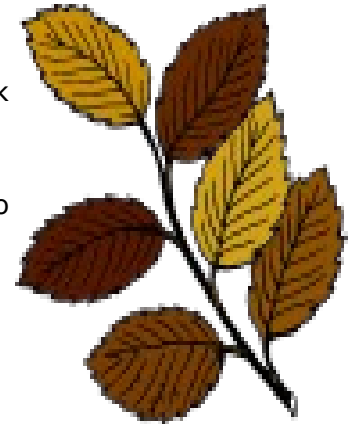
## President's Corner - Mary Shadbourne & Pat Bryan

Upcoming Fall Speakers and Workshops

September 15, 2015 – **Mary Tabar** – “Traditional to Art Quilts”



This lecture is a combination of a short PowerPoint presentation followed by a trunk show during which Mary will reveal a collection of 30 types of quilts. After viewing these quilts, we will have a more informative knowledge about the kinds of quilts we create as well as the ones we view at quilt shows.

September 16, 2015 Workshop – **“Water Color Strip Quilt”**

These water color quilts are easily made from only three floral fabrics. First, the fabrics are cut into strips and then sewn together into diverse strip stratas. The next step is cutting the stratas into half-square triangles and now the pleasure begins as you design and create your own version of this quilt. There are dozens of layouts possible. Which one will you choose?

**Dinner with the Speaker.** All guild members are invited to join us for dinner with the speaker at 4:45 pm on the night of the guild meeting. October 20, 2015 – **Christine Barnes** – **“Buying Fabrics with Color in Mind”**

As quilters we have endless sources for buying fabric; however, choosing fabric with color in mind takes an awareness of basic color concepts and the qualities that make fabrics special. In this digital-image presentation and trunk show, you’ll learn how to select fabrics for successful quilts and avoid common pitfalls when building your stash.

October 21, 2015 Workshop – **“Elegant Circles”**

This workshop begins with a discussion on the role of value in creating depth and volume in a quilt design, followed by an overview of the process for creating circles, shadows, and background triangle squares. A step-by-step demo of basting fabric circles using an iron and appliquéing the circles and shadows to the background makes these techniques doable for all skill levels.

November 17, 2015 – **Peggy Martin** – **“Beyond Tradition”**

Expand your creativity by using traditional quilts as a springboard for design inspiration. See how one idea leads to another – making one small change at a time – to come up with totally new ideas and looks. Traditional quilts, and more contemporary ones that result from going one step beyond, will be shown and discussed.

November 18, 2015 Workshop – **“The New Feathered Star”**

Feathered Star is one of the most beautiful traditional blocks, often attempted in the past only by master quilters because of the need for such precision piecing of the tiny triangles. Piecing them in rows with the Quick-Strip Paper Piecing method makes it possible for all levels of quilters to make this block much easier and faster! New settings, including setting the octagon on point, give a totally new look to this classic favorite.

## ***Dottie's Findings - Dottie Daybell***

What can you do with a wedge ruler? There are several different kinds of wedge rulers, depending on the angle at the bottom. The angle determines how many wedges it takes to make a circle. A standard Dresden Plate ruler is 18 degrees, and makes a 20-petal plate. Here's a nice two-part tutorial from V and Co for Dresden plates with a modern touch, plus a third post with a variation:

With that same ruler, you can make a Tumbler quilt. Bonnie Hunter is doing Tumblers for her Leaders and Enders project this year:

Bonnie is making tiny tumblers from 2 1/2" strips. I have started one from 3 1/2" strips, using a half-century of scraps from my stash, my late mother's stash, and snippets salvaged from my friends. I have more tumblers in mind, perhaps one from Christmas fabrics.

Wedge rulers can be made with any angle that divides evenly into 360 degrees. You can get a 9-degree wedge ruler (40 petals) and make a huge rosette like this (if you can keep your seam allowances precise!):

These designs by Laura Nownes, which I really like, were made using a 22.5-degree ruler (16 petals). There's no tutorial, just photos. I assume she trimmed circular blocks to the octagon, square and hexagon shapes:

Laura has other designs using a 36-degree wedge (10 petals). Put "wedge" in the search box on her blog to find them.

If you don't want to buy separate rulers to get the various angles, Omnigrad makes a 6" x 24" rectangular ruler with lines marked to cut many of the above sizes. It may be less convenient to use, but it's more economical.

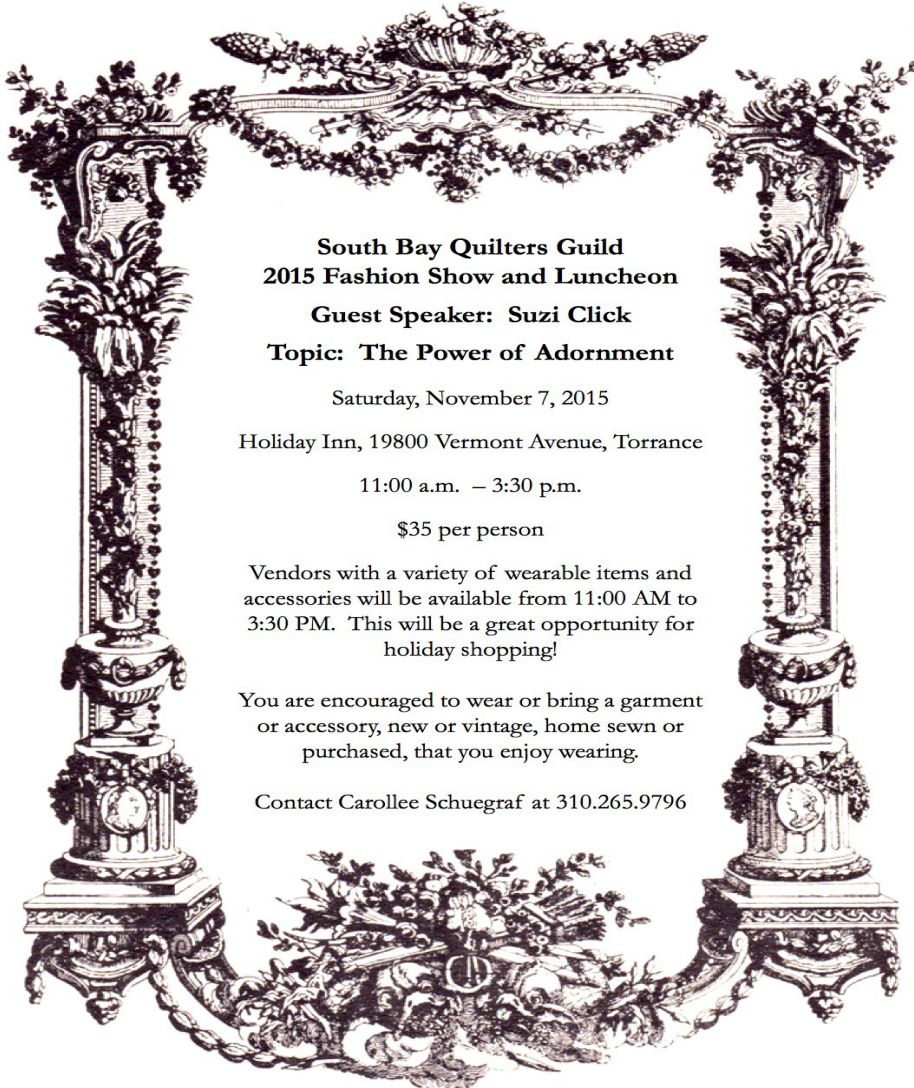
