## Programs/Workshops (continued)

### ◆◆◆ Upcoming Speakers and Workshops

#### ▶ October 20, 2015 – Christine Barnes – “Buying Fabric with Color in Mind”

As quilters we have endless sources for buying fabric; however, choosing fabric with color in mind takes an awareness of basic color concepts as well as an understanding of the qualities that make fabrics special. In this digital-image presentation and trunk show, you'll learn how to select fabrics for successful quilts and avoid common pitfalls when building your stash.

#### ▶ October 21, 2015 Workshop – “Elegant Circles”



This workshop begins with a discussion on the role of value in creating depth and volume in a quilt design, followed by an overview of the process for creating circles, shadows, and background triangle squares. A step-by-step demo of basting fabric circles using an iron and appliquéing the circles and shadows to the background makes these techniques doable for all skill levels.

▶ **Dinner with the Speaker.** All guild members are invited to join us for dinner with the speaker at 4:45 pm on the night of the guild meeting. #### ▶ November 17, 2015 – Peggy Martin – “Beyond Tradition”

Expand your creativity by using traditional quilts as a springboard for design inspiration. See how one idea leads to another – making one small change at a time – to come up with totally new ideas and looks. Traditional quilts, and more contemporary ones that result from going one step beyond, will be shown and discussed.

#### ▶ November 18, 2015 Workshop – “The New Feathered Star”

Feathered Star is one of the most beautiful traditional blocks, often attempted in the past only by master quilters because of the need for such precision piecing of the tiny triangles. Piecing them in rows with the Quick-Strip Paper Piecing method makes it possible for all levels of quilters to make this block much easier and faster! New settings, including setting the octagon on point, give a totally new look to this classic favorite.

#### ▶ January 19, 2016 – Laura West Kong – “Confessions of a Quilting Diva”

We've all made at least one quilty mistake, aka a design opportunity, which almost certainly made the finished quilt more interesting, as well as given an interesting story to tell. From Laura's beginnings in fine art and graphic design all the way to her whimsical modern folk art quilts of today, this presentation is a true quilting adventure with many surprises and confessions in store.

#### ▶ January 20, 2016 Workshop – “Impressionist Quilts: Painting with Fabric”

Create a quilted work of modern art with brush strokes made not with paint, but with fusible fabric. In this workshop you will learn how to capture light and create the illusion of three-dimensional form in your fabric art like an Impressionist painter. Although this is a no-sew class, tips will be given for finishing your fiber artwork by quilting or framing. Participants will be able to choose from three (3) patterns: cupcake (shown here), spool of thread, or sphere.

**STAFFING** signups will be available from through December. See Sue at guild early to get the job you want. Remember we ask that everyone contribute at least 3 hours during the show weekend.

### Vote on Change to Guild Standing Rules

Our Vice President of Programs, Gina Shankle, and Workshop Coordinator, Stephania Bommarito, have written Workshop Guidelines, which were approved at the Oct. 6 Board Meeting. The Board recommended making these Guidelines a part of the Guild Standing Rules. A change to the Standing Rules requires approval of the Guild, so at the Oct. 20 meeting we will vote on appending the SBQG Workshop Guidelines to the Standing Rules as Exhibit A. Get ready for the October meeting. I'll be bringing 50+ quilts for you to take home and tie between October and November. If tying isn't your pleasure, check out a kit (or three, or ten) to complete during the month. These quilts are a cinch to assemble. Just 42 six and a half inch squares.

SWEATSHOP INFORMATION: Second Tuesday, October 13, 2015, Levy Adult School, 3420 West 229<sup>th</sup> Place, Torrance.

Everyone is welcome to help us sandwich 60 plus comfort quilts, assembly line style. ATTN:NEW MEMBERS—WE WANT YOU, TOO!! Levy Adult School, 3420 West 229<sup>th</sup> Street, Torrance. 7 to 9p, Room 6, just off the south parking lot, close to the office. A few of us will be there to greet you. No quilting skills required!

Items to bring to sweatshop (all optional):

- Scissors for trimming
- A chopstick for turning
- Your sewing machine for sewing around pinned quilt sets.
- ...or bring nothing. We'll have everything you need.

### SILENT AUCTIONS BEGINNING IN OCTOBER:

1. Quilt coat kit. 7+ yards of various fabrics, several batiks. Includes everything needed to make a mid-length quilted coat—fabric, batting, and pattern.
2. "Let it Snow" quilt kit. From Keepsake Quilting. All flannel, includes panel, border fabric, backing and backing. Approximately 40" x 48".
3. Hawaiian appliqué quilt. Brown with off-white background. Hand quilted. 45" square.
4. UFO Mrs. Claus dolls, made with large empty spools (included. One doll almost complete; heads and hair for at least two more. Three different types of fur including (I think) a feathery boa.

SILENT AUCTIONS ENDING IN OCTOBER: (1) "Three Women at Tea" wall hanging. 22.5" x 32" (2) Jewel box variation wall hanging. 22.5" square, (3) Large pine quilt rack, mounts on wall—up to 60" wide quilts, (4) UFO will make a large green/white quilt. Many completed blocks.

## ***Dottie's Findings - Dottie Daybell***

This month, we have a bricolage. (Look it up! It describes my quilts these days.)

1. Barbara Brackman writes about a beautiful Civil War quilt that's on exhibit through January 3, 2016, at the Autry Museum in Griffith Park:

2. These pretty quilt blocks, wool applique on a cotton background, led me in two directions:


