### ◆◆◆ Upcoming Speakers and Workshops

#### ► November 17, 2015 – Peggy Martin – Beyond Tradition

Expand your creativity by using traditional quilts as a springboard for design inspiration. See how one idea leads to another – making one small change at a time – to come up with totally new ideas and looks. Traditional quilts, and more contemporary ones that result from going one step beyond, will be shown and discussed.

#### ► November 18, 2015 Workshop – The New Feathered Star

Feathered Star is one of the most beautiful traditional blocks, often only attempted in the past by master quilters because of the need for such precision piecing of tiny triangles. Piecing them in rows with the Quick-Strip Paper Piecing method makes it possible for all levels of quilters to make this block much easier and faster! New settings, including setting the octagon on point, give a totally new look to this classic favorite.

#### ► January 19, 2016 – Laura West Kong – Confessions of a Quilting Diva

We've all made at least one quilty mistake, aka a design opportunity, which almost certainly made the finished quilt more interesting as well as given an interesting story to tell. From Laura's beginnings in fine art and graphic design all the way to her whimsical modern folk art quilts of today, this presentation is a true quilting adventure with many surprises and confessions in store.

#### ► January 20, 2016 Workshop – Impressionist Quilts: Painting with Fabric

Create a quilted work of modern art with brush strokes made not with paint, but with fusible fabric. In this workshop you will learn how to capture light and create the illusion of three-dimensional form in your fabric art like an Impressionist painter. Although this is a no-sew class, tips will be given for finishing your fiber artwork by quilting or framing. Participants will choose from three (3) patterns: cupcake (shown here), spool of thread, or sphere.

#### ► February 16, 2016 – Debbie Gordon – Tools of the Trade

Fabric, thread, scissors, needles, thimbles and sewing machines. All of these are 'Tools of the Trade' for those of us who quilt and sew and, although they are all readily available and in abundance today, this wasn't always the case. Debbie will provide insight into their histories as she walks us through their beginnings and development, while also providing a sprinkling of anecdotes associated with each of these modern day treasures.

#### ► February 17, 2016 Workshop – English Paper Piecing Sampler

Create a masterpiece using shapes other than squares, triangles or strips, and be absolutely precise without the stress! Learn the time-tested technique of English Paper Piecing and begin a treasured quilt. Debbie will share examples of the different shapes that are appropriate for this technique while also providing historical notes as well as modern and antique examples. Discover how to select and cut appropriate fabrics and create different illusions with your fabric choices.

Bring your already composed information and your quilt, and Melanie will work with you to complete the entry right there at guild. She will also take the necessary photos. A show entry form is also included in this newsletter.

Our **OPPORTUNITY QUILT** will be displayed on Saturday, January 23 at **Road to California**. As usual we must supply 20 hours of white glove support in return – we need your help!! We must furnish the names of our workers by Dec 1, **STAFFING** signups will be available from through December. See Sue at guild early to get the job you want. Remember we ask that everyone contribute at least 3 hours during the show weekend.

## ***The Comfort Project - Mary Shadbourne***

November's sweatshop will be the last of the year. This is your chance to contribute your time and effort in preparing most of the quilts we'll be tying at the December meeting--perfect timing--before the holidays take over.

**SWEATSHOP INFORMATION:** Second Tuesday, November 10, 2015, Levy Adult School, 3420 West 229<sup>th</sup> Place, Torrance 7 to 9pm, Room 6, Just off the south parking lot, close to the office. We need all hands on deck to help sandwich 60 plus comfort quilts, assembly line style. No quilting skills required! Bring something from the list below, or come empty-handed. We'll put you to work no matter what.

- Scissors for trimming
- A chopstick for turning
- Your sewing machine for sewing around pinned quilt sets.
- A friend! We need all the help we can get.

### **SILENT AUCTIONS ENDING IN NOVEMBER:**

1. Wall hanging. 22 ½" x 32". Blanket stitch appliqué, 3 women at tea.
2. Wall hanging. 22 ½" square. White/green/tiny flowers. Jewel box variation?
3. Pine quilt rack. Holds up to 60" wide quilt. Easy to change quilts.
4. Quilt coat kit. 7+ yards of various fabrics, several batiks. Includes everything needed to make a mid-length quilted coat--fabric, batting, and pattern.
5. "Let it Snow" quilt kit. From Keepsake Quilting. All flannel, includes panel, border fabric, backing and backing. Approximately 40" x 48".
6. UFO Mrs. Claus dolls, made with large empty spools (included). One doll almost complete; heads and hair for at least two more. Three different types of fur including (I think) a feathery boa.

1. During last month's search for the wool appliqué pattern, I came across some nice tutorials on working with wool, at Three Sheep Studio:

2. And this is the year of the wedge! This quilt uses a 45-degree wedge (a Kaleidoscope ruler):

The wedges are made from two strips, but otherwise it's just a Kaleidoscope, until you see how the corners are filled in. The pattern is from Sujata Shah, an American quilter who is originally from Mumbai. Her interesting quilts combine two cultures:
