◆◆◆ Upcoming Speakers and Workshops

► **Dinner with the Speaker.** All guild members are invited to join us for dinner with the speaker at 4:45 pm on the night of our guild meetings. We meet at **Good Stuff** restaurant located at Ave I and PCH in the beginning of the Hollywood Riviera in south Redondo Beach. Please let us know if you do plan on joining us so we can reserve ample seating.

► August 16, 2016 – **Suzi Parron – Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement**

Suzi Parron stumbled across her first barn quilt in 2008 and immediately looked for a book with more information on barn quilts. When she found that none existed, she decided to write one herself, which has since evolved into a second book. Suzi's talk will take you on a journey along the quilt trail, beginning with the very first barn quilt which stemmed from Donna Sue Groves and her wish to honor her mother's quilting art. The presentation features over one hundred stunning photographs of barn quilts, some of which rival cloth quilts in their intricacy. You will hear stories of individuals who have painted quilt blocks to honor loved ones or their local culture, along with a few humorous anecdotes. The presentation is both informative and entertaining as we explore the way in which our quilting heritage takes on new meaning as this movement continues to expand.

► August 17, 2016 Workshop – **Suzi Parron – Barn Quilt Painting**

Join the barn quilt movement by creating your own painted quilt block! In this workshop you will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step – drafting, taping, and painting – with careful attention to detail. At the end of the



workshop you will leave with a 24" by 24" finished quilt block – or with one last color (which will be provided) to add at home – that will be ready for Show and Tell at your next guild meeting! This is a 4-hour workshop and most of the supplies will be provided by Suzi.

SWEATSHOP INFORMATION: The second Tuesday of the month, June 14, 2016, is the sweatshop date this month. We'll be sandwiching and processing 60 plus comfort quilts, assembly line style. We meet to Levy Adult School, 3420 West 229th Place, Torrance, 7 to 9p, Room 6, just off the south parking lot, close to the office. A few of us will be there to greet you. No quilting skills required. There will be no Sweatshops in July and August. The next Sweatshop won't be until September!

Last month we sent 8 quilts to the Joint Craig Theater hospital in Afghanistan, in time for Armed Forces Day and Memorial Day. We have a new contact at the hospital, who has already replied that they insure each American gets a quilt on admission, and they know how much love goes into making them

We also got a thank you note from a Lieutenant who received one of the quilts, saying he initially had an "itchy green Army blanket" in the ICU and was then moved into another room and given one of our "colorful comfortable quilts." He commented that they all sincerely appreciate these gifts and support from back home.

Thanks to everyone for the continued strong support, including some sister guilds and local quilters, and especially DHL Express for shipping our quilts with no charge and they arrive in 48 hours! .

1. On May 7, Barbara Brackman began a 6-month, 26-block, "Hexathon" Quiltalong. The EPP hexagonal blocks have 4"-finished sides. Patterns are posted on Saturdays. Start with the introduction:

3. Another shorter quiltalong: a Gwen Marston inspired medallion quilt, with 5 rounds. It will be over by the time you read this, but it looks like fun. You can tag along behind them. Start here:

4. Here's a beautiful quilt block from Judy Martin's 1984 book "Scrap Quilts", enlarged and converted to paper piecing to make a mini quilt, or the center of a medallion. Change the lives of foster youth who have aged out of the system by creating homes for them. Volunteers obtain donated housewares and furniture for the youth so they have a better life.

THE CANCER SUPPORT COMMUNITY/ WELLNESS COMMUNITY SOUTH BAY CITIES

Free program for cancer patients and their families. The goal is to help patients recover from the physical and emotional effects of cancer to the greatest extent possible. Psychological support and educational programs are designed to address the loss of control, hopelessness and social isolation that patients feel.

PROJECT NEEDS

Provides food to low income and homeless people. Located in Redondo Beach Project Needs provides hot meals on Tuesday and a food pantry is available twice a month. Currently they serve 120 meals every Tuesday and 350 families per month with the food pantry.
