It now has a totally different feel, still seeing the movement and circles but now there are circles showing up. The points to the stars are easy because of the tools you will learn to use.

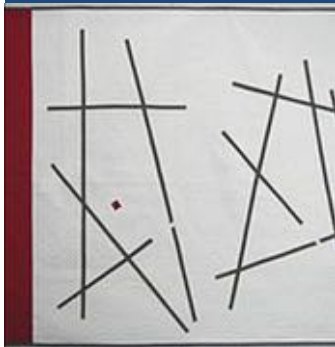
October 18, 2017 – Arlene Arnold – Esthers Stars



This pattern is taken from an 1880 quilt and looks crisp in two colors but also great in any fabric selection. You may choose from two block sizes to make either a full size quilt or wall hanging. Arlene will show you how to use one unique ruler for crisp star points and make perfect square in a square blocks every time.

March 21, 2018 – Jacquie Gering “Slice and Insert”



Learn from one of the modern quilt movement's master quilters. Jacquie will teach you the basic technique and a new adaptation, a foolproof strategy for matching inserts, simple techniques for adding complexity to a design as well as how to work with even width and wedge shaped inserts. Combine simple sewing with a new skill and create your own linear design.

March 22, 2018 – Jacquie Gering “Scrappy Improvisation”



Jacquie will help you discover how to use all those scraps that are too big to throw away. Learn this unique twist on improvisational piecing. Learn to use the concept of "inflow" to manipulate the negative space in your quilt. The class will focus on making blocks for a quilt, and Jacquie will provide instructions on paneling your blocks to create a unique layout.

Let's talk about the Quilt Show timeline. August is when quilt show activities really begin in earnest. This month the **online acquisition** form will be ready <https://goo.gl/forms/dC9hWNL7PruRQjCO2>. So if your entry is far enough along that you know its FINAL dimensions and techniques, submit your entry! In September, Melanie and her crew will begin taking appointments to submit your application at the meeting or at her home. Remember a photo needs to accompany your entry. If you don't have a photo, the acquisitions crew will take one at Guild meetings beginning in September. The last day to enter a quilt for the 2018 show is the December Guild meeting. In January, Acquisitions and Hanging lay out the show, determine acceptances and show display cards are printed and available for you to review. I would really LOVE to see at least one quilt from every member in this year's show.

For those of you planning to enter the **Black & White Challenge**, you must enter it in the show and your quilt must be COMPLETED and turned in to Julie no later than January 9, 2018. We will be displaying them and voting at the January Guild Meeting. Fabrics: black/gray/white plus only one other color; size: 24 x 24 inches; any design/technique may be used; must be 3 layers: top, batting, backing; and include a sleeve. Complete rules on the show website.

*Donations for our **Raffle Baskets and Auction Quilts** continue this month. We are planning to have some lovely themed raffle baskets for our 2018 show. Here are a few of the categories: Holiday (any holiday), Modern, Kitchen, Travel, Text, Black and White. We will have a complete list at guild at the quilt show table. We can use fabric, notions (scissors, thread, pins, etc.), patterns, novelty items that fit into these categories. For example, for the kitchen basket, we are looking for fabric with a food or kitchen theme. An apron or two would be a good addition, or if you are cleaning out your kitchen and have a new or very gently used baking pan, maybe a cake mix, etc. Please be sure your contributions are new or in very good condition so that our show guests will want to purchase lots of raffle tickets for them. A nice bottle of wine is a good addition to any basket too.*

We are not taking books in general this year although if you have a book that fits into one of the categories and it is in top condition, we will take it. Call Sue Glass if you have questions about raffle baskets, or if you want to help putting them together.

We have 9 auction items already (but we need a lot more)! They are on the quilt show website for your perusal. Be sure to fill out your auction entry form to submit with your quilt and you receive a show pin. Donations of basket and auction items closes at the January Guild meeting

Show pins and Opportunity Quilt tickets will be available this month. The pin features the center block of the Opportunity Quilt and is the traditional cloisonné style. Cost is \$6 or you can get one free with an auction quilt donation! Each Guild member is asked to sell \$20 of opportunity tickets or more if you can. That means more for our bottom line and more we'd be able to donate to other charities. Please turn your ticket stubs and money to Nancy no later than the January Guild meeting.

The first note came from a quilt donated by Westside Quilters, shown here. The second note came from a quilt made by private donor, Linda McKenzie. We also thank them for supporting our guild's community service project – it is appreciated!

We have a new point of contact at the Bagram hospital, since they rotate every 6 months. Helen Lu has already sent her a shipment of quilts (free shipping from DHL Express) and the contact replied that she will be happy to distribute them for us.

Quilt Requirements: Size: 48” by 78” (stretcher size) All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable) Appropriate patriotic theme/design Optional: Pillowcase, 20” by 30”, coordinating fabric



Read Me a Quilt- Julie Maas

Hope everyone is enjoying the summer, and has had time to work on CASA quilts. The Guild website has a list of children's books that are available to donate with the quilts, plus a list of suggested books for older children (Middle/High School Books).

Reminder: white Kona cotton “Skinny Strips” (a roll of 40 1-1/2 inch wide strips), also known as a “Honey Bun”, are available for you to use as sashing and inner borders for CASA quilts.

My pictured quilt top is 40” by 51”, and uses the 1-1/2” strips. The block size finishes at 11”, and the tutorial for the block using 1-1/2” squares for two rounds is available at:

My alternate block used a 7-1/2” (7” finished) center square, plus two rounds of 1-1/2” strips.

2018 Quilt Show Staffing!

The online Sign Up Genius will again be used for managing our **Quilt Show Staffing**:

<http://www.signupgenius.com/go/4090e4baeae2da6fa7-sbqg1>. Each member is asked to sign up for **4 hours** at the show. Please **DO NOT** sign up for back-to-back shifts in two separate areas; we need a little transition time for full coverage of all areas. Also, before signing up, please be sure you understand the needs of the job. For example, if the job requires walking around for 2 hours and you can't walk or stand for more than a few minutes, that job is not right for you. There are many different areas, some sit-down and some standing. Ask Mary if you are not sure! With our online sign up, you will get an automated email reminder 2 weeks before your shift and again 2 days before your shift. If you do not have email, a letter will be provided to you. Guild members do not pay admission to the show if they are working. Guild members will take their instruction for the staffing area from the Quilt Show Committee Member who oversees that area only. If you cannot work the weekend of the show, please let Mary or Julie know so we can find something else for you.

The show is successful because all of us contribute to that success. Thank you in advance for your participation!

August Plea for Quilters- by Nancy Jengo

Hi all guild members, "aka" quilters. I am Nancy Jengo the new Patchwork Star chairman. I am asking everyone to think about being a Patchwork Star at one of our guild meetings.

We all love quilts and are interested in seeing the journey in quilting our members have made in their quilting lifetimes. Even if you have been a Patchwork Star in the past, we have many members who have not seen your work at all and we know you have done more quilts since you were Patchwork Star. Please consider showing us what you have done since then. Also, we have new Patchwork Star pins so it won't be a duplicate of the one you already have! Let me know if I can schedule you to show your wonderful quilts. See me at guild or call me at 310-378-5523.



Dottie's Findings- Dottie Daybell

1. It's fun to add your own twist to a simple pattern. Rose began with this nice pattern from Debbie at A Quilter's Table:

But once her blocks were made, she decided to re-orient them and add rectangles to randomize the rows. Here's what she got:

I like them both.

2. WW BOM Jan designed this block for Quilts of Valor: a half log cabin, starting with a large HST. It would be good for a scrappy group quilt:

The HST has one light triangle and one dark triangle. There are two versions of the quilt: light logs surrounding the light triangle, as Jan does, or dark logs surrounding the dark triangle, as Alycia does:

Jan's tute is for 9" blocks. For our Wounded Warrior quilts, you COULD scale the blocks up to 12". The 9" blocks have 6" finished HSTs, and two 1.5" finished strips on the sides, thus the HST is 2/3 of the block. You need these proportions to get the HSTs to connect from block to block. For a 12" block, therefore, you need an 8" finished HST, and 2" finished strips. HSTs can be made from 9" cut squares, then trimmed to 8.5" raw. Strips are cut 2.5". Set the quilt 4 blocks by 7 blocks.

But for this quilt, I think the 9" blocks show the concentric diamonds better. You'd need to set the quilt 5 or 6 blocks wide by 8 or 9 blocks long. Add narrow borders if you use the smaller numbers.

3. If you have small scraps, and lots of thread and time, Deanna has some free patterns for you! She's found ways to control the chaos of hundreds of 2" squares. I like "Times Two", "Growing Up Odd" and "Film at Five".

4. Elizabeth at Occasional Piece gives us a free pattern and a fun idea for displaying mini-quilts. It's a tiny sailboat quilt, mounted on an 8 x 10 acrylic photo stand.
