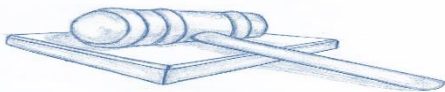

The quilt shown here was received from Martha Smith of Whittier, after our Guild meeting so it wasn't in our show & tell. We also received three more quilts from private donors, so we could send eight quilts to Bagram in August – a very nice shipment!

Dottie Daybell continues to find lovely patterns for us, and sends me some in addition to those she puts in her article "Findings." Thanks so much for all your help, Dottie. If you want to make a quilt but don't have a lot of time, we got a donation of several blocks that would make a great center panel and could be finished simply by adding some sashings to reach the size needed. Let me know if you'd like to finish this donation, or if you need any batting and backing.



**Quilt Requirements: Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size) All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable) Appropriate patriotic theme/design Optional: Pillowcase, 20" by 30", coordinating fabric**

## *Read Me a Quilt- Julie Maas*



*Wow did we have a wonderful group of quilts and books turned in at the August meeting! A new record – 19 quilts! Many thanks to Pam Overton, Lucia Petrarca (4 quilts), Trudy Ooms, Judy Platus, Sharon Amos, Karen Yarrow (3 quilts), Jane Pavlina (4 quilts), Jenifer Briggs, Nadine Kirk (2 quilts with pillowcases) and Sharon Childers (non-member). We cannot overstate how much your generosity is appreciated by CASA, and how much this helps the foster children. Please keep up the great work!*

We have one request from CASA: They prefer that quilts and books are donated anonymously. If you choose to put a label on your quilt, please include only: "Made with Love by South Bay Quilters Guild", and leave a space for CASA to write the name of the child who receives the quilt. This way all the labels, including those that we attach after the quilts are donated, are consistent and easier for CASA to use.

Here is an idea for using a panel in a RMAQ. The panel is approx. 22" x 34-1/2" (finished), and adding pieced borders creates a quilt top approx. 32-1/2" x 45-1/4". The "piano key" border strips are approx. 5" wide (finished) and were pieced using scraps. Adding another round of borders would increase the size of the top.

It's a quick and easy way to use a panel and scraps.

## Quilt Show 2018 – Julie Limbach Jones

Viewer's Choice will be updated this year to create categories of roughly equal size by combining the quilt category AND the quilting method. How does this affect your application? Not in the least! All you need to do is choose the Quilt Category (Applique, Art, Pieced, etc.) and select the appropriate Techniques Used like always. We hope this makes voting easier. **The Black and White Challenge** quilts will be voted on at the January meeting, (These quilts will remain with Acquisitions until the show) and winners will be revealed at the show. In addition, there will be four special categories for ribbons to be awarded before the show opens. These are: Best First Time Entrant, Most Humorous, Wow! and Best Interpretation of Theme (CONTRAST).

**Acquisitions:** All acquisitions should be submitted online

<https://goo.gl/forms/dC9hWNL7PruRQjCO2> and require a digital picture to accompany the application. If you need assistance, Melanie Dreike and her crew will be accepting appointments to complete your application at the Guild meetings or at Melanie's home. Deadline for entries is the December Guild meeting. There are 18 entries already. Our goal is at least one quilt for every guild member in our show!

**Auction:** we have about a dozen so far (thank you!), but about 50 is the goal for a great auction. Any type of quilt is welcome in our auction. See the show website for photos of the quilts. There will be a drawing for a gift certificate to AAA for everyone who donates a quilt!

**Raffle baskets:** Thank you for your donations so far. Refer to the August newsletter for basket themes. Notions, fabric and theme-related items are needed as well as non-quilting items like gift cards and bottles of wine!

## *Dottie's Findings - Dottie Daybell*

*Findings is Celebrating its Second Anniversary!*

1- Jacquie Gehring's new book "Walk" is all about walking foot quilting. I'm trying to downsize (or trying to convince myself to downsize), but I may need this one! I found a page of free tutorials on her blog, two of which are about using the walking foot:

2- WW BOM It's time for a simple scrappy quilt, a patriotic Stacked Bricks quilt:

The free pattern is spread over 4 web pages, but you can download a PDF if you register with your email address. The bricks are cut 5" x 8-1/2", to finish 4-1/2" x 8". Set it 11 bricks wide by 10 bricks long, to make a 49-1/2" x 80" quilt. For the half-drop set of Stacked Bricks, you'll need to cut 115 bricks (not 110!), and trim 10 of them to fill in the ends of alternate columns. Or cut 105 bricks plus 10 5" x 4-1/2" pieces for the ends. Because of seam allowances, those ends need more than half a brick.

3- Anybody want to make an English Paper Pieced Death Star quilt? My grand-niece would love it, but I'll leave that job to my sister, her grandma.

5- Irish quiltmaker Jude has a tutorial for making an 11-1/2" diagonal-strip-pieced block from scraps of various widths and lengths, without using a paper foundation. She uses her 12-1/2" ruler in a clever way. You know exactly how long to make each strip, so there's little waste. And no paper to remove! Take a look at her other free tutorials, too.
