Quilt Show preparations are coming along. We are ahead of where we were last year at this time, but that doesn't mean you can slow down! You all showed your Quilt Show knowledge during the “game show” at last month's meeting, so here are just a few reminders.

Auction Quilts – Many more are needed for a successful auction. The variety is terrific so far! January Guild meeting is the deadline for auction quilt donations.

Raffle baskets – Fabric, notions, precuts and gift cards (any kind) are all still needed. A preliminary basket assembly session will be held at the end of November, but donations will be happily accepted through January.

Road to CA – Two more white glove volunteers (2 hours each) are needed to be able to display our Opportunity Quilt and sell tickets. You can white glove any day of the show. 2. WW BOM Mary Etherington posted a brief recipe for a pretty star quilt with alternating light and dark backgrounds. You could use reds and blues in place of her purples and teals. Click on her graph paper image to enlarge and print.

The blocks are 9" finished. Set the quilt 5 blocks by 8 blocks and add 3" outer borders to get 51" x 78". Or, replace the 3.5" squares with 4.5" squares, and use 2.5" squares for the star points, to get a 12" block. Set the 12" block 4 by 6 and add 3" borders on the ends only.

3. Remember that little magazine The Workbasket? It will probably take a while, but The Antique Pattern Library, a nonprofit based in the Bay Area, will be given scans of all but 8 issues, from October 1935 to its demise in 1996.

APL, being a nonprofit, has permission from the copyright owner F + W Media to post the scans. Missing issues: Nov, Dec 1937; Jul, Nov 1938; Oct 1939; Jan, May 1940; Sept 1942. If you have one of those, let me know! To keep this quilting-related, this is the one issue they've posted so far, which has a pattern for Indian Arrowhead.

Community Services- Nadine Kirk & Jenifer Briggs

We discovered that hundreds of quilts have been delivered to Texas for victims of Hurricane Harvey, and the last day for the group to receive quilts for their planned distribution was November 4th. So instead we will focus on the fire victims of Northern California.

We will be collecting final blocks for our planned group quilt (red hearts, blue log cabins) at the November Guild meeting, and we will complete the quilt and donate it to fire victims in Northern California. Patterns for both quilt blocks are posted on the Guild website.

As we discussed at the October Guild meeting, we will be making another quilt for the Northern California fire victims, using the same heart pattern, but with floral hearts and a light background. We would appreciate it if everyone who would like to participate in this quilt brings their floral heart blocks to the November Guild meeting.

The quilting group Happiness is a Warm Quilt is coordinating quilt donations to fire victims, and they expect that donations will be accepted for six months to a year. Our contact stated that the first big push is to make **pillowcases** for the kids affected, because many kids are traumatized, even if they didn't lose their homes. Many had to evacuate, and schools were closed or burned. The kids can use pillowcases to carry their personal belongings. We will collect pillowcases at the November and December Guild meetings.

If you have a quilt you would like to donate (lap size or larger) we can provide you with a template for labels which should be sewn on before turning them in. Melanie Dreike has offered to help with delivery (thank you Melanie). If you have any questions, please contact Jenifer or Nadine.

Quilts for Wounded Warriors

This lovely quilt was made by a former guild member, Daisy Mendelsohn, who received the stash of a friend and used it to make this quilt in her honor. Our thanks to Daisy for her support of our wounded warriors.

Since these quilts get to our combat hospital in Afghanistan in just 48 hours, I thought you'd like to know how this happens. After I get the quilts and take a picture for our photo albums, each quilt is put into a pillow case that serves as a gift bag, along with a thank you letter, and I take them to Helen Lu at DHL Express (near LAX). She prepares and ships them the same day, and notifies our contact at Bagram of the tracking number.

DHL Express then flies to their hub at Cincinnati, and then flies directly to their facility in Afghanistan, where they notify our contact and the quilts are received on the front line. I can't thank Helen Lu enough for all her work in this wonderful service, and to DHL Express for their amazing support - they are true patriots!!

Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

Read Me a Quilt- Julie Maas

We had 11 quilts and books turned in at the October meeting, thank you! Many thanks to Karen Yarrow, Nancy Payne (2 quilts), Becky Tan (pillowcase included), Mary Jane Jewell and Nadine Kirk (2 quilts, one pillowcase plus finishing 3 more tops that were donated by someone at Nina's shop), and an anonymous member of the Santa Monica Guild. Your generosity and fine work is wonderful for CASA and the foster children. Please keep up the great work!

Here is the pattern for one of the quilts I turned in at the last Meeting, which finished at approx. 54 x 63 using a 3" border. (The pattern calls for a 5-1/2" border.) It is easy to piece and has a nice secondary design.

The pattern is free and available through Riley Blake Designs; click on the Patterns tab and then on Free Pattern Downloads. The pattern name is Vintage Market.

The blocks are 8" finished (cut 8-1/2") square (you can use a 10" square pack), with 2-1/2" (cut) squares for the snowball corners and 1" finished (cut 1-1/2") sashing and cornerstones. The first border is also 1" finished (cut 1-1/2").

Cost: 2 cents/square inch plus cost of batting & shipping
