## *Dottie's Findings - Dottie Daybell*

1. Lori from Humble Quilts posts photos from an exhibit at the Northwest Quilting Expo. Cathy Erickson is a modern quilter who also loves Baltimore Album quilts. These antique quilts are in her collection:

On my Mac, I command-click on images to open them in a new tab, which has a "+" cursor to click to enlarge them to see the details. On a PC, not sure how to do that, try a right click?

2. WW BOM If you have lots of red, blue, and light scraps, or if you want to make a group quilt, the Depression Block is just what you need. It's made from sixteen half-square triangles. Here's a quilt to look at, and a link to a pattern:

I'd cut 5" squares, and sew a dark to a light, stitching 1/4" on either side of a diagonal line, then trim to get 4-1/2" cut HSTs. These will make 16" finished blocks. Set them 3 blocks by 5 blocks to get a 48" x 80" quilt. The Patchwork Square site is new to me, and worth a look around while you're there.

3. Pippa Moss collects Welsh quilts. In this post, she shows us a Sanderson Star quilt, with many interesting quilting designs. Many of these quilts were sold as pre-marked kits. Pippa tells you to double click on each image to enlarge it, and then use the back button to return. Be sure to do that. (But this doesn't work on the above Humble Quilts page!)

I like the cable border with roses in the corners. I've drawn my own cable borders, and it's sometimes hard to turn a graceful corner.

4. This is a pretty quilt made with old-fashioned fabrics -- florals! I really like her busy floral background, and her flowery butterflies:

She used a very modern-looking free pattern for Kona solids (linked in her post) and completely changed the look.

5. Wanda from Exuberant Color has just finished a Hunter Star quilt top, made from Aboriginal fabrics. In this post she compares this quilt with previous ones she's made. I like them all:

**SANTA ROSA FIRE VICTIMS.** A big thank-you to everyone who has helped with pillowcases, quilts and quilt blocks for the Santa Rosa fire victims! The group Happiness is a Warm Quilt is distributing quilts, and they have already had several distribution events. Here is a quote from them:

"We did our first pillowcase delivery of 400+ to Schafer school, the hardest hit school population (1/2 of students lost homes). We need thousands of pillowcases so please keep working away on them. We will take any size quilts you bring us, but biggest need is for bigger bed size quilts esp double and queen size. Your guild is fabulous!"

Here is what we are doing to help:

Two shipments have been sent, arranged by Melanie Dreike (thank you!), including 6 quilts, 5 crocheted baby blankets and 73 pillowcases.

Assembly is in process for the first SBQG group quilt (red hearts and blue log cabins).

We are collecting blocks for the second SBQG group quilt (same heart block as the first quilt, but using flower fabric) -- please bring your blocks to the December meeting.

If you would like to make a pillowcase but need a refresher on the "hot dog method", here is a link to a good tutorial video on YouTube by The Crafty Gemini on YouTube. In case the link doesn't work, the video is called: How to make a Pillowcase- Burrito/Sausage/Roll Up Method".
