Workshop Information:

January-February: No workshops for these months

March workshops with Jacquie Gering:

The **March 21** workshop "Slice and Insert: and the **March 22** workshop "Scrappy Improvisation" have filled. We are taking names for a waitlist for each of these workshops so see Sue Glass at the workshop table to add your name to either list. No payment is required until we can offer you a seat in the workshop.

The March workshop fee is \$80 for each workshop. We are offering a catered light lunch each day for an additional \$12 per person. Lunch must be ordered and paid for ahead of time. The lunch form with menu is available at the workshop table. We will also provide water and light refreshments each day.

Supply lists and lunch forms were sent to each confirmed participant in early December. If you are in either class and did not receive your supply list/lunch form, please contact Sue.

The March workshops will be held at the Torrance Recreation Center Auditorium. Private Source Quilting will set up their booth to provide any supplies you might need. Guild members are welcome to shop either day.

April 18, 2018 – Shirley McGuire will bring her expertise to share on the topic of "Felting, Reclamation, & De-constructing Wool for Applique." She will have three small projects for class participants to work on during the class to help us learn her techniques.

Class fee is \$50.00.

There is also a **kit fee of \$20** payable the day of the April workshop. The kit includes all materials needed to complete the three small projects presented in class.

Please note this class is more than half full, so don't delay in signing up if you want to be a part of this fun day.

May 16, 2018 – Beading Embellishment with Lisa Walton. Lisa says: "Just what you need – another obsession! This one-day workshop will teach the basics of bead embroidery and variations including attaching cabochons. The sampler made in class will be the starting point for many wonderful future projects as well as a piece of art in itself. As a bonus you will also make a beaded button using your new found beading skills."

We have a need for hanging and takedown staff, so if you can help, please call Mary.

Auction quilt donations will still be accepted at the January meeting. Please include an Auction Entry Form (available on the show website) so we have all the information we need for the quilt's description.

All **Opportunity Quilt** ticket stubs and money must be turned in at the January meeting as well. We are still accepting gift cards for **Raffle Baskets**.

Our Opportunity Quilt travels to **Road to California** right after the Guild meeting. If you will be visiting Road on Thursday, we could still use some help selling tickets. Please call me if you are able to help.

The block is a star with overlapping points and HST corners. I tracked down the pattern at the Machine Quilters' Exposition website. This page has links to download several nice patriotic blocks.

Keep all the star-point squares the same, for all blocks in the quilt, with a red point sewn first on the lower left of the white square, followed by a blue point sewn on the lower right. The blue will always overlap the red. Assemble the block with the two red HSTs diagonally across from each other, and the two blues on the other diagonal. Twenty-four blocks set 4 x 6 will make a 48" x 72" quilt. If you make eight extra red HSTs, eight extra blue HSTs and cut eight extra plain white squares, you can add 4" wide rows to the top and bottom of the quilt, completing the red/blue on-point squares and extending the length to 80".

3. Once you've made a set of blocks, and laid them out on your design wall, this video by Doug Leko shows how you can use just 3 pins to organize the chain piecing of the entire quilt:

SANTA ROSA FIRE VICTIMS. Another big thank-you to everyone who has helped with pillowcases, quilts and quilt blocks for the Santa Rosa Fire victims! The group Happiness is a Warm Quilt is continuing to distribute quilts and pillowcases. As of December 5, over 500 pillowcases had been given out. The next distribution of quilts is December 30, and the next batch of 150+ pillowcases will be given out when school resumes in January.

THOMAS (VENTURA/SANTA BARBARA COUNTIES) FIRE VICTIMS. The fire is not out yet, but the **Superbuzzy Quilt Shop in Ventura** has launched a project to help the Thomas Fire victims. They are in need of completed quilts (twin through king size) and pillowcases (adults or children). The Ventura Modern Quilt Guild has volunteered to assemble quilts using a pattern they developed (Perkiomen Valley Block) for those who wish to make blocks. Here is an update on what our members are doing to help:

SANTA ROSA FIRE VICTIMS:

- Three shipments have been sent/delivered, arranged by Melanie Dreike (thank you!), including 7 quilts, 5 crocheted baby blankets and 146 pillowcases.
- The top for the first SBQG group quilt (red hearts and blue log cabins) has been completed; we are making the back and getting ready for quilting.
- We are collecting blocks for the second SBQG group quilt (same heart block as the first quilt, but using flower fabric) -- please **bring your completed blocks to the January meeting.**

THOMAS FIRE VICTIMS:

- Instructions for the Perkiomen Valley Block are posted on the Guild website.

Community Services will continue to collect pillowcases and finished quilts for both groups of fire victims, and we will also collect completed blocks for the Perkiomen Valley Block (or 5" fabric squares) from everyone who can provide them.

Happy New Year! As we move into the new year, it's a good time to look back at what we did last year. In 2017, we sent 55 quilts to the hospital at Bagram, Afghanistan. While the need has lessened somewhat with fewer troops, we still have a large number of service men and women deployed there, and they deeply appreciate the comfort and care you send them with our quilts. The support we get from other sources has grown, and we often get quilts from outside the guild who learn about this project and want to contribute too.

We also reached the milestone of 800 quilts in December! While this includes all quilts since the program began, these are large quilts and the large number is a wonderful testament of your strong support for those who sacrifice so much to defend our freedom – Thank You!

The quilt shown here was a throw size that was made as a special request for one of the DHL Managers whose grandmother in England has health issues. As you know, DHL has been shipping our quilts free for several years, and to recognize their outstanding support, it was my pleasure to use some blocks that had been donated to make this as a get-well token and to show our appreciation. She replied with a happy, thumbs-up picture of her using the quilt.

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric
