Alexandra's blocks

She would like to have leaves of all sorts. They can be appliqued, pieced, paper pieced or any other way you would like to make the blocks. She would like them in sizes of 6 1/2, 9 1/2 or 12 1/2 inches. Background should be beige, cream, tan or white.

Donna's blocks

She would like Amish style nine patch blocks that are six and a half inches. Any color solid or tone-on-tone in the corners and center, black Kona cotton for the other four squares.

Workshop Information:

Come to the workshop table at guild if you want to sign up for any of these classes or have questions about our upcoming workshops. You may also call or email Sue Glass. We will have information on the remainder of the workshops for 2018 next month.

March workshops with Jacquie Gering:

The **March 21** workshop "Slice and Insert" and the **March 22** workshop "Scrappy Improvisation" have filled. We currently have only a very short wait list for the March 22 class, with no wait list for the March 21 class. Sue will be happy to take your name for either list. You never know – you might just get in, but you won't if you don't sign up. No payment is required until we can offer you a space. **Class fee for each of the March classes is \$80.**

The March workshops will be held at the Torrance Recreation Center Auditorium. Private Source Quilting will set up their booth to provide any supplies you might need. Guild members are welcome to shop either day.

April 18, 2018 – Shirley McGuire will bring her expertise to share on the topic of "Felting, Reclamation, & De-constructing Wool for Applique." She will have three small projects for class participants to work on during the class to help us learn her techniques. **Class fee is \$50.00.**

There is a **kit fee of \$20** payable the day of the workshop. The kit includes all materials needed to complete the three small projects presented in class.

May 16, 2018 – Beading Embellishment with Lisa Walton. Lisa says: "just what you need – another obsession! This one-day workshop will teach the basics of bead embroidery and variations including attaching cabochons. The sampler made in class will be the starting point for many wonderful future projects as well as a piece of art in itself. As an added bonus you will also make a beaded button using your new found beading skills." **Class Fee is \$50.**

2018-03 Findings March

1. Annemieke from the Netherlands is making hexagons from scraps. She's made 1100 little hexies with 3/4" sides and is starting to put them together.

Be sure to click on the photos to enlarge them. I love what she's doing with the larger shape, a single piece of fabric basted over 4 hexie papers joined (taped?) together.

2. WW BOM After last month's simple parallelograms, how about some more complicated blocks from Moda Bake Shop? But they're 16" blocks, so you don't need very many. It's mostly Fast Flying Geese, making stars.

Set the quilt 3 blocks x 5 blocks to get 48" x 80". Make 8 of the large stars and 7 of the small stars. Set them alternating, with large stars in the corners. From each fat quarter, not counting the background fabric, you can get one large star and one small star, so you'll need eight fat quarters. The amount of background fabric is left as an exercise for the student! The background doesn't need to be all one fabric; a variety of light scraps would work.

3. We're all thinking about black and white fabric, given this year's challenge. Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr posted a link to a Smithsonian Institution article on black and white fabrics in WWI. Here's their post, with the link to si.edu:

SANTA ROSA FIRE VICTIMS. Thank you again to everyone who has helped with pillowcases, quilts and quilt blocks for the Santa Rosa Fire victims! The group Happiness is a Warm Quilt is continuing to distribute quilts and pillowcases (more than 1,000 pillowcases). Over 200 quilts have been distributed, and there is a wait list, especially for larger queen/king size quilts.

- Our guild has delivered over 210 pillowcases, 7 quilts, and 5 crocheted baby blankets
- The first SBQG group quilt (red hearts and blue log cabins) is finished and ready to be delivered.
- The second SBQG group quilt (hearts on white) is ready to be laid out and assembled.

THOMAS (VENTURA/SANTA BARBARA COUNTIES) FIRE VICTIMS. QuiltCon donated a booth to the Ventura Modern Quilt Guild, and many finished quilts, tops, blocks, yardage, bolts of fabric and batting were donated.

- If you know of any long arm quilters who could help quilt a few of the quilts for VMQG please ask them to contact Georganna Hawley at communications@venturamodernquiltguild.com Deliveries to survivors are being coordinated through Red Cross information. Over 200 quilts have been delivered so far. - Our Guild has delivered one completed Perkiomen Valley quilt and pillowcase , and two quilt “kits”, including tops, backing, binding and batting.
- With the blocks that have been made by our members, we have two more tops being quilted now, plus two more being assembled.

PHILANTHROPY NOMINATIONS. As noted in the newsletter and at the February Guild meeting, each year we ask our members to nominate local charities that will be considered for philanthropy awards from the Guild budget. Nominated charities are not restricted exclusively to the South Bay area, but we do encourage members to consider charities that support our local communities and those where our members reside.

Nominations will be accepted from February to the close of the April guild meeting. The Philanthropy Nomination form is posted in the Member's Only section of our website and is attached to this newsletter. As required by our Guild bylaws, nominated charities must be IRS-designated non-profit organizations. Members who wish to submit a nomination must provide the completed Philanthropy Nomination form **and** provide **either of the following with their form:** a copy of the organization's IRS letter of designation or their tax ID number.

In order to be accepted for consideration, the completed Philanthropy Nomination form **must also include the following information**, which is highlighted on the form:

The name of a contact at the organization, their address, telephone, and e-mail address (if possible). This information is used by the Guild treasurer in reporting Guild donations to the IRS and the state.

A description of what the charity does for the community and how donated funds will be used.

We will compile a list of the nominated charity organizations, along with a description of their activities, for review by the Board and inclusion in the May newsletter. The membership will vote on the nominated charities at the May Guild meeting, and the voting results will be presented to the Board at the June Board meeting. At that time, the Board will review the voting results and determine which charity(ies) will receive funds from the Guild budget. If multiple charities are selected, the philanthropy budget (as determined at the May Board and Guild meetings) will be allocated by the Board based on the voting preferences of the Guild. The Board's recommendation will be presented to the Guild at the June meeting and the Guild will vote on the final award amounts.

We can always use more quilts, as they are used by/donated to sick patients as well as battle injuries. Never a shortage of those. Both my patients and staff understand the time and effort spent to make these wonderful pieces; I give you my personal assurance that these quilts find their way to patients in need.”

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20”x30”, coordinating fabric

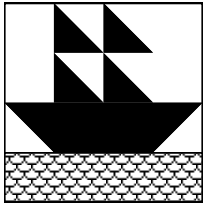
