Workshop Information:

We take cash, checks or credit cards (at Guild only). All listed workshops will be held at the Palos Verdes Library Community Room. Directions will be furnished to workshop attendees. Call or email Sue Glass if you have questions about any of our upcoming workshops.



August 22, 2018: “Crossroads, A 2-for-1” with **Elizabeth Eastmond**. This class is something new for our guild. It really is two classes in one! Elizabeth says: “This smaller quilt allows for fun piecing, as well as space to try out some free-motion or straight quilting on your domestic machine. We’ll make the top in the morning and then try out some quilting in the afternoon.” We have a few spaces left - call Sue to sign up **Class Fee is \$50 for members, \$60 for everyone else. Kit Fee (payable day of workshop): \$12**



September 19, 2018 – Mel Beach comes to town! Mel Beach is a San Jose, CA based quilt artist, teacher and lecturer who breaks away from tradition by adding her own modern, beautifully textured and colorful twists. In Mel’s class, we will unlock the fun and intrigue of Interleave quilts. This workshop will reveal all the secrets behind creating the illusion of curves and transparency. Best of all, these interleaves are assembled using a quilt-as-you-go technique. Stop by Sue’s table and see the beautiful class sample. **Class Fee is \$50 for SBQG members, \$60 for everyone else.** No kit fee.



October 17th, 2018 – Tina Curran will teach “Whimsical Gardens.” This workshop involves making a pieced background, fussy cutting flowers (from floral fabrics), adding cut stems and then fusing down, & raw edge appliquéing, all the flower heads and stems to the background. The class project finishes at about 24" x 24". Signups start at the May guild meeting. **Class fee is \$50 for members, \$60 for everyone else. Optional pattern fee \$10 day of workshop.**



November 21, 2018 – Nadine Kirk “String Pieced Stockings” We don’t usually have a workshop in November, but our own Nadine Kirk has agreed to teach this class. The deal is that if you make a stocking for Community Services, you get to take this workshop free! If you prefer to work on your own project, that’s fine too, but in that case, the workshop will be \$10.00. We will even have holiday fabric for you to use, so don’t delay, sign up today!

January 16, 2019 – Jaime Davis “Beginning Baltimore: Hand Applique.” This class is a great introduction to Baltimore Album Quilt making. You will learn the basics of beginning appliqué as well as the dimensional technique of ruching, and hand embroidery. The focus is on the freezer-paper-on-the-bottom method of appliqué, but this class can also be adapted to include advanced students and other applique methods.



March 20, 2019 – Becky McDaniel: “Crazy Cushion.” This project is paper pieced with 3 different pattern designs: Star Jasmine, Pineapple (Not showing) and Flying Geese. It has a zipper and strap for carrying to wherever you need to have a cushion! The finished size is 16"x16"x3".



April 18, 2019 - Karen Gloeggler, author of The Jane Austen Inspired Quilt. This workshop will focus on one of the designs featured in Karen’s book. These quilts can be made in traditional or modern styles. More information will follow at our September guild meeting.

DAYS FOR GIRLS. As a reminder, our Guild member Bea Savellano provided the following information for this very worthy charity project:

When I was in India in January, I attended a girls school and learned that many girls do not attend school or finish school because they have no way of managing their menstrual cycle. Once home, I received an unrelated email with information about Days for Girls, an organization that provides kits and menstrual health education for women all over the world. The story is fascinating. Celeste Mergens founded the organization while volunteering in Kenya in 2008. Days for Girls now serves one million girls and women in 116 countries. There are teams in the United States that make these kits. In our area there is one in Irvine, and one in West LA. I also found an informal group in Hermosa Beach. The kit costs \$4 to make and includes 10 washable pads made of flannel, 2 snap in shields and a bag. Check it out: www.daysforgirls.org -- and there is a TEDx talk, Celeste Mergens at TEDxBellingham.

As we celebrate the birthday of our country, this quilt reminds us how fortunate we are to live in this great country, and to have our self-sacrificing military troops defend our freedom.

As you know, the primary focus of our Quilts for Wounded Warriors is to get our quilts to the combat hospital on the front line, so the wounded receive them immediately and have them for the flight home.

However, we can also give these quilts to any special cases that are closer to home and deserve special recognition. Many of you have family and/or friends who have served or are still serving their country, and if

you know of someone who has gone above and beyond, or maybe has lingering problems (such as PTSD) and would benefit from the comfort of one of our quilts, please let me know. For many wounded, the war isn't over when they come home. As a donor, your quilt will still go to the front line unless you are asked to let it be given to a special case; your choice.

Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

On behalf of Julie and the CASA team, many thanks for the 6 quilts and books that were turned in at the June meeting! We received a donated quilt (which we were able to pair with a book from the RMAQ book stash and a pillowcase), along with quilts and books from our members Pat Bryan (1 quilt and book), Melanie Dreike (top, quilted by Kellie Rollo Fireman, book from Nadine Kirk), and Nadine Kirk (3 quilts, one with pillowcase and books, one from the RMAQ stash). We hope that our members will have time this summer to continue to work on quilts for the children under CASA's care, which are such a wonderful help to them. As a reminder, the CASA system assists children from very young ages to young people up to 21 years old, who need bed quilts to brighten their living areas as they get ready to transition out of the system and be on their own. Quilts don't need to be elaborate, and suggested sizes are from 40 x 50-60 for younger children, up through generous lap sizes/twins.
