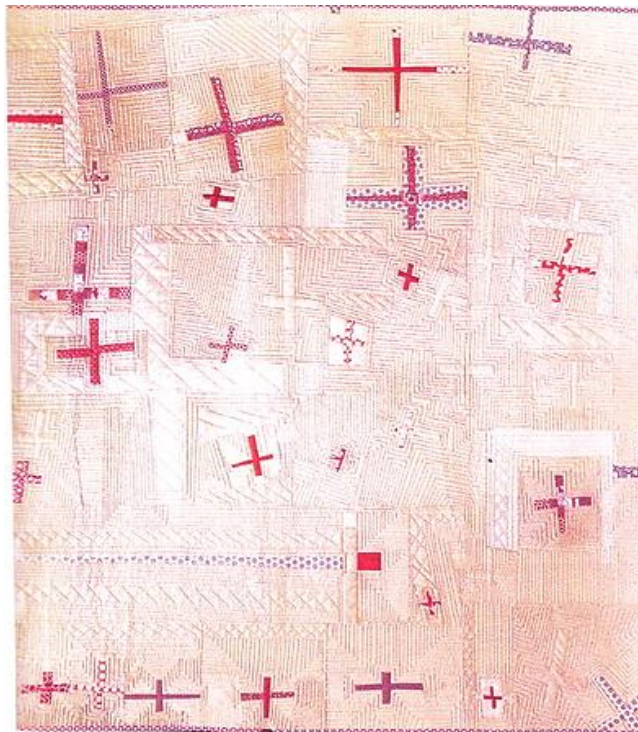
For the month of August 2018, we will initiate our "Block of the Month" program, with a "MODERN" slant. Blocks of the Month are opportunities to learn a new technique, try a new design/pattern, and play with different fabrics and colors. Each month we will supply a pattern for a block and provide guidelines for color and fabric. You may make up to five blocks for one chance per block to win all of the blocks turned in for the drawing at the guild meeting. You might want to make one block for the drawing and one block of your choice of color to keep. Use a color scheme of your choice for the keeper and have a "ready-to-go" Modern quilt project at the end of the guild year.

At the August meeting, we will provide directions for making the "Cross Block" which Jacquie Gering taught us at the March Workshop. The pattern is online under Members only, "Intra-Guild".

The guidelines for block colors are a light background (white, cream, light gray) and red for the insert color. Let's start off this year with lots of participation and see what we end with a year from now. This is one of the most popular projects for Guilds throughout the country. Let's make it one of ours too.

The August meeting will begin with a scavenger hunt/mixer. Please pick up your entry at the Intra-Guild table. Prizes awarded!!!

We will also have fabric and patterns so you can start making Christmas stockings for Community Services, which will be due at our November meeting. The pattern for the Christmas stocking is online, "Members-only, Christmas stocking".

August 2018 to May 2019 workshops

August 22, 2018: “Crossroads, A 2-for-1” with **Elizabeth Eastmond**. This class is really two classes in one! Elizabeth says: “This smaller quilt allows for fun piecing, as well as space to try out some free-motion or straight quilting on your domestic machine. We’ll make the top in the morning and then try out some quilting in the afternoon.” We have a few spaces left - call Sue to sign up. \$50 for members, \$60 for others. Kit Fee: \$12



September 19, 2018 – Mel Beach comes to town! Mel Beach is a San Jose, CA based quilt artist, teacher and lecturer who breaks away from tradition by adding her own modern, beautifully textured and colorful twists. In Mel’s class, we will unlock the fun and intrigue of Interleave quilts. This workshop will reveal all the secrets behind creating the illusion of curves and transparency. Best of all, these interleaves are assembled using a quilt-as-you-go technique. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others. No kit fee.



October 17th, 2018 – Tina Curran will teach “Whimsical Gardens.” This workshop involves making a pieced background, fussy cutting flowers (from floral fabrics), adding cut stems and then fusing down and raw edge appliquéing all the flower heads and stems to the background. The class project finishes at about 24" x 24". \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others. Optional pattern fee \$10 day of workshop.



November 21, 2018 – Nadine Kirk “String Pieced Stockings” We don’t usually have a workshop in November, but our own Nadine Kirk has agreed to teach this class. The deal is that if you make a stocking for Community Services, you get to take this workshop free! If you prefer to work on your own project, that’s fine too, but in that case, the workshop will be \$10.00. We will even have holiday fabric for you to use.

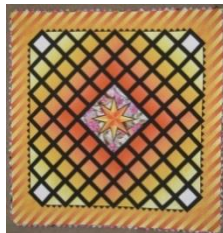


January 16, 2019 – Jaime Davis “Beginning Baltimore: Hand Applique.” This class is a great introduction to Baltimore Album Quilt making. You will learn the basics of beginning appliqué as well as some dimensional techniques. The focus is on the freezer-paper-on-the-bottom method of appliqué, but this class can also be adapted to include advanced students and other applique methods. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others



March 20, 2019 – Becky McDaniel, "Crazy Cushion"

This project is paper pieced with 3 different pattern designs: Star Jasmine, Pineapple (Not showing) and Flying Geese. It has a zipper and strap for carrying to wherever you need to have a cushion! The finished size is 16"x16"x3". \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others.



April 18 2019 – Karen Gloeggler “The Jane Austen Inspired Quilt”. Austen fan and avid quilter Karen Gloeggler went to England to see firsthand the only quilt known to have been made by the popular novelist. Karen’s workshop will focus on helping you create an Austen inspired quilt using the patterns from her book, whether you prefer a traditional or more modern approach. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others.



May 21/22, 2019 – Karen Kay Buckley

(Nakano Theater, Torrance Cultural Arts Center)

May 21st “Fiesta Mexico Block Three with Border”- Hand Applique (This class is the same day as our May guild meeting.)

May 22nd “Circles Squared”- Machine Applique

The fee is \$65 per class for SBQG/\$75 for others. There is also a kit fee for each class. NOTE: We will take names of nonmembers for the wait list starting in August. We will fill any open slots from this list in February.

SUPPORT FOR FIRE SURVIVORS. There is an on-going need for quilts for the survivors of the Thomas (Ventura) and Santa Rosa fires. Your efforts have been much appreciated by the survivors!

There is still a wait list for more quilts.

DAYS FOR GIRLS. Our Guild member Bea Savellano provided information regarding Days for Girls, a very worthy organization founded in Kenya in 2008 that provides kits and menstrual health education for women all over the world (now one million girls and women in 116 countries). Many women and girls are restricted in their lives because they have no way of managing their menstrual cycle. In our area there are groups making kits in Irvine and West LA, and an informal group in Hermosa Beach. The kit costs \$4 to make and includes 10 washable pads made of flannel, 2 snap in shields and a bag. Dottie's Findings August

My husband Mel and I have moved to Wilmington, North Carolina! I'm hoping to continue Findings from across the country. Mel has had Parkinson's Disease for many years, and had a big setback when he got the flu in January. He's been in a nursing home ever since, unable to swallow, using a stomach tube. Our daughter is a doctor, so we decided to move near her so she can help us. On July 12, Mel and I crossed the country in an air ambulance. Some of our 50-year accumulation was loaded into a POD to send here, but I left behind most of my fabric and books and the house in RPV, for our California son to deal with. Mel's now adjusting to a new nursing home. We're getting a house nearby, and hope he'll eventually recover enough to move home with me.

1. How good are you at drafting a pattern? Barbara Brackman posted photos of a quilt she dates to the 1960s or 70s.

She tried to draft it in Electric Quilt, but as she points out, her draft is not correct. Near the bottom of the page, she shows the sashing around the wheel. ALL of the blades of the wheel, AND all the pieces in the sashing, are cut from the same template. If you know the pattern source, or if you draft it, let me know!

2. WW BOM Cynthia Brunz gives us a simple scrappy quilt made from 2.5" squares and 2.5" strips. The blocks are 8" square:

I'd use reds and whites for the 4-patches and blues for the strips. Or maybe reds and golds, maybe reds running one direction; golds the other. I like the woven look. Set the quilt 6 blocks by 10 blocks to get 48" x 80".

3. Like to make HSTs? Audrey has the quilt for you!

Over the past year, she has made and delivered to me many dozens of lovely patriotic pillowcases, all freshly laundered and pressed, ready to go. Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

Hope everyone is enjoying the summer and staying cool. This is a wonderful opportunity to continue working on quilts for the children in the foster care system who are under CASA's care. The Guild website has a list of books that are available for you to choose to donate with your quilt, and there is also a list of suggestions of books for older children. As a reminder, the CASA system assists children from very young ages to young people up to 21 years old, who need bed quilts to brighten their living areas as they get ready to transition out of the system and be on their own. Quilts don't need to be elaborate, and suggested sizes are from 40 x 50-60 for younger children, up through generous lap sizes/twins.

Call for Quilts – Acquisitions - At the August meeting we will begin accepting quilts for the quilt show. We hope that each of you will enter a quilt this year! A link to the quilt entry form is available in the newsletter on the Quilt Show page on our website, and the Quilt Show website. For those of you without computer access, we will also have hard copies available at the guild meeting. While your quilt doesn't need to be completely finished, we do ask that you have the quilt top completed (including borders) before you submit an entry. This year, to ensure that we have accurate measurements for the quilts (important for hanging the quilts), we ask that you carefully measure the width and length (please don't guess) and provide those numbers in the correct location on your entry form. In addition, the Acquisitions Team will measure your quilt at a meeting to confirm the measurements and we will also photograph your quilt. If you aren't able to bring the top/quilt to a meeting, you can make an appointment with one of the team members to photograph and measure the quilt at their house. We're spread all over the South Bay from Harbor City to Manhattan Beach so one of us should be close to you! ☺
