At the September meeting please turn-in the cross-blocks you made, some lucky Guild member will get to take home all of the blocks.

Our "Block of the Month" for September is a 9 patch with a "MODERN" slant. At the September meeting, we will have examples of the Modern 9 patch. The pattern is online under Members only, "Intra-Guild" and at the end of the newsletter.

The guidelines for block colors are a light background (white, cream, light gray) and any color you choose for the color (four 2 1/2 squares with a modern flare).

Blocks of the Month are opportunities to learn a new technique, try a new design/pattern, and play with different fabrics and colors. Each month we will supply a pattern for a block and provide guidelines for color and fabric. You may make up to five blocks for one chance per block to win all of the blocks turned in for the drawing at the guild meeting. You might want to make one block for the drawing and one block of your choice of color to keep. Use a color scheme of your choice for the keeper and have a "ready-to-go" Modern quilt project at the end of the guild year.

We will also have fabrics so you can start making Christmas stockings for Community Services, which will be due at our November meeting. The pattern for the Christmas stocking is online, "Members-only, Christmas stocking, or use your own stocking pattern.

September 2018 to May 2019 workshops

Come to the workshop table at guild if you want to sign up for any of these classes and see the beautiful samples furnished by some of our speakers. Remember that you must pay when you register. We take cash, checks or credit cards (at Guild only). All listed workshops will be held at the Palos Verdes Library Community Room (except May 2019). Directions will be furnished to workshop attendees. Call or email Sue Glass if you have questions about any of our upcoming workshops.



September 19, 2018 – Mel Beach comes to town! Mel Beach is a San Jose, CA based quilt artist, teacher and lecturer who breaks away from tradition by adding her own modern, beautifully textured and colorful twists. In Mel's class, we will unlock the fun and intrigue of Interleave quilts. This workshop will reveal all the secrets behind creating the illusion of curves and transparency. Best of all, these interleaves are assembled using a quilt-as-you-go technique. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others. No kit fee.



October 17th, 2018 – Tina Curran will teach "Whimsical Gardens." This workshop involves making a pieced background, fussy cutting flowers (from floral fabrics), adding cut stems and then fusing down and raw edge appliquéing all the flower heads and stems to the background. The class project finishes at about 24" x 24". \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others. Optional pattern fee \$10 day of workshop.



November 21, 2018 – Nadine Kirk "String Pieced Stockings" We don't usually have a workshop in November, but our own Nadine Kirk has agreed to teach this class. The deal is that if you make a stocking for Community Services, you get to take this workshop free! If you prefer to work on your own project, that's fine too, but in that case, the workshop will be \$10.00. We will even have holiday fabric for you to use.



January 16, 2019 – Jaime Davis "Beginning Baltimore: Hand Applique." This class is a great introduction to Baltimore Album Quilt making. You will learn the basics of beginning appliqué as well as some dimensional techniques. The focus is on the freezer-paper-on-the-bottom method of appliqué, but this class can also be adapted to include advanced students and other applique methods. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others. **Note: this class does not conflict with Road to California (Road 2019 is Jan 24-27)**

March 20, 2019 – Becky McDaniel, "Crazy Cushion"

This project is paper pieced with 3 different pattern designs: Star Jasmine, Pineapple (Not showing) and Flying Geese. It has a zipper and strap for carrying to wherever you need to have a cushion! The finished size is 16"x16"x3". \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others.



April 18 2019 – Karen Gloeggler "The Jane Austen Inspired Quilt". Austen fan and avid quilter Karen Gloeggler went to England to see firsthand the only quilt known to have been made by the popular novelist. Karen's workshop will focus on helping you create an Austen inspired quilt using the patterns from her book, whether you prefer a traditional or more modern approach. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others.



May 21/22, 2019 – Karen Kay Buckley

(Nakano Theater, Torrance Cultural Arts Center)

May 21st "Fiesta Mexico Block Three with Border"- Hand Applique (This class is the same day as our May guild meeting.)

May 22nd "Circles Squared"- Machine Applique

Community Services- *Nadine Kirk & Jenifer Briggs*

We are ramping up to have quilts in process and ready to go for survivors of the (sadly) many natural disasters that occur with more frequency than ever. Fortunately, our local vendor Private Source Quilting donated a large quantity of batik scraps, which we are processing to use in the following quilt projects:

- **Batik Strip Sets:** We are sewing batik strips together lengthwise to make strip sets that are approx. 13" wide, and we have zip-lock bags available that include coordinated sets of strips for you to assemble. After the strip sets are turned in we will cut squares from the sewn strip sets, and the leftover pieces will be re-sewn into other blocks. This will be an on-going project, and we will make as many quilts as we can – there are a lot of strips!
- **Batik Disappearing 4-Patch Blocks:** We have kits available (including a printed tutorial) to make disappearing 4-patch blocks to assemble into a quilt (or two). The tutorial is also available on the Guild website.

We are following up for organized efforts related to the survivors of the recent fires in Northern California. In the meantime, a big thank-you for the 11 quilts that were made by Ethie Wilson, Gini Ozenne and Judy Chamberlain, and one donated by Diane Miller, at the August meeting. Ethie will be delivering them to the Redding area. There is still a need for quilts for the survivors of the Thomas (Ventura) and Santa Rosa fires. You may continue to support the fire survivors by directly contacting:

Over 600 quilts have been given out; some photos are posted at venturamodernquiltguild.com/thomasfire. There is still a wait list for more quilts.

DAYS FOR GIRLS. Our Guild member Bea Savellano provided information regarding Days for Girls, a very worthy organization founded in Kenya in 2008 that provides kits and menstrual health education for women all over the world (now one million girls and women in 116 countries). Many women and girls are restricted in their lives because they have no way of managing their menstrual cycle. In our area there are groups making kits in Irvine and West LA, and an informal group in Hermosa Beach. The kit costs \$4 to make and includes 10 washable pads made of flannel, 2 snap in shields and a bag. Check it out: www.daysforgirls.org -- and there is a TEDx talk, Celeste Mergens at TEDxBellingham.

We also have fabric for Wounded Warrior quilts, backs for WW quilts, and batting available. Please let Arlene Zobrist, Nadine Kirk or Jenifer Briggs know if you need batting for a WW or RMAQ.

Last, please contact Nadine or Jenifer with any questions, and thank you again for all that you do to help those in need, your work makes a difference!

Requirements:

Size: 48" by 78" (stretcher size)

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20"x30", coordinating fabric

We received a bumper crop of 19 wonderful quilts and books from: Lucia Petrarca (6 quilts and books), Sharon Amos (quilt and book), Karen Rakita (4 quilts and books), Pat Bryan (3 quilts and books), Louise Davidson (quilt and book), and Jane Pavline (4 quilts and books). This is truly an amazing start to the Guild year, and all of your efforts are much appreciated!

For inspiration on starting a quilt, please do check the Guild website for a list of books that are available for you to choose to donate with your quilt. There is also a list of suggestions of books for older children. As a reminder, the CASA system assists children from very young ages to young people up to 21 years old, who need bed quilts to brighten their living areas as they get ready to transition out of the system and be on their own. Quilts don't need to be elaborate, and suggested sizes are from 40 x 50-60 for younger children, up through generous lap sizes/twins.

September Findings by Dottie Daybell

1. It's high time I brought you some applique! Gladi Porsche visited the Maine Quilt Show in July, and as usual for her, gives us some wonderful photos. Be SURE to click each photo to enlarge it: click once and then click the "+" cursor. Or use the PC or Mac key combo to open in a new tab, then enlarge. They get really big:

2. WW BOM This quilt from Debbie isn't red, white and blue, but I think it would be worth trying in those colors. She used only three colors: white, blue-green, and yellow-green.

It's a mixture of half-square triangle blocks, quarter-square triangle blocks, and a half/quarter hybrid blocks. Make 8" blocks and set them 6 x 8. Don't use too much white, or too dark dark. Most of the pieces are a medium value, and blocks are low-contrast. We all have lots of mediums!

3. Here's a tip for pre-washing yardage. I haven't tried it yet, because I haven't had a chance to buy fabric since I moved. (Most of my stash was abandoned, and I have to start over. No time to even give it away.)

4. This is a pretty EPP pattern, based on a block found at the famous Brimfield Antiques Market in Massachusetts. It's available in two versions: the original 4-pointed Brimfield Block and a newer 5-pointed Brimfield Star. I saw it first at the Australian blog kokaquilts, where Linda's making the Star:

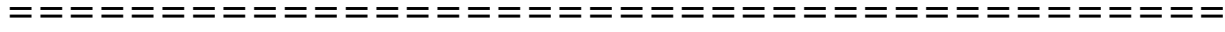

In addition, the Acquisitions Team will measure your quilt at a meeting to confirm the measurements and we will also photograph your quilt. If you aren’t able to bring the top/quilt to a meeting, you can make an appointment with one of the team members to photograph and measure the quilt at their house. We’re spread all over the South Bay from Harbor City to Manhattan Beach so one of us should be close to you! ☺

Intra-Guild SBQG Block of the Month [BOM] September 2018 9-Patch with a Modern Slant

Due: October 2018

You may make up to five blocks for one chance per block to win all the blocks turned in at the October SBQG meeting. Guidelines for the block are for a 6 1/2" block, two fabrics needed.

For light color use white fabric. You will need five 2 1/2" squares.

For contrasting color use any color with a modern color/look. You will need four 2 1/2" squares.

Use your favorite method to assemble your 9-patch block. The finished block should have the color fabric in each of the four corners. See image below.

Last step is to add white fabric to two sides of the block. You will need one 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" strip of white and one 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip of white for two adjacent sides of the square. Sew the short strip on first and the longer strip on last. Use your judgment when pressing seams to avoid color showing through on the white.
