What's happening in Workshops?

January 16, 2019 – Jaime Davis "Beginning Baltimore: Hand Applique." This class is a great introduction to Baltimore Album Quilt making. You will learn the basics of beginning appliqué as well as some dimensional techniques. The focus is on the freezer-paper-on-the-bottom method of appliqué, but more advanced students will also enjoy it. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others. \$10 kit fee. **This class does not conflict with Road to CA, Jan 24-27.**



March 20, 2019 – Becky McDaniel, "Crazy Cushion" This project is paper pieced with 3 different pattern designs: Star Jasmine, Pineapple (Not showing) and Flying Geese. It has a zipper and strap for carrying to wherever you need to have a cushion! The finished size is 16"x16"x3". \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others. \$30 kit fee.



April 18 2019 – Karen Gloegler "The Jane Austen Inspired Quilt". Austen fan and avid quilter Karen Gloegler went to England to see firsthand the only quilt known to have been made by the popular novelist. Karen's workshop will focus on precision piecing and creation of your own version of this beautiful quilt. \$50 for SBQG/\$60 for others.

Community Service – Nadine Kirk and Jenifer Briggs

Sadly, we have a new need for quilts for fire survivors. Here is an update on our activities:

- We have 12 tops currently in process from the batik strips that were donated by Private Source Quilting, with 8 out for quilting and one being bound. These quilts will be distributed to:

The Quilter's Sew-ciety of Redding, Inc., for the survivors of the **Carr Fire**. Survivors of the **Camp Fire in the Paradise area**, and the **Woolsey/Malibu** (and other local fires) once a distribution point has been established.

- Thank you to everyone who has turned in sewn strip sets. Please return any strip sets at the December Guild meeting; we will continue to make tops as long as we have materials.
- Stay tuned for additional projects for fire survivors, including pillowcase kits.

There is still a need for *finished* quilts for the survivors of the Santa Rosa and Thomas (Ventura) fires and mudslides. You may continue to support the fire survivors by directly contacting:

As of November over 1,050 quilts have been given out to the survivors of the Ventura/Santa Barbara fires and mudslides.

Other charity opportunities:

- **Days For Girls.** International effort to provide kits and menstrual health education for women all over the world (now one million girls and women in 116 countries). Many women and girls are restricted in their lives because they have no way of managing their menstrual cycle. Check it out: www.daysforgirls.org -- and there is a TEDx talk, Celeste Mergens at TEDxBellingham.

We also have fabric for Wounded Warrior quilts, backs for WW quilts, and batting available. Please let Arlene Zobrist, Nadine Kirk or Jenifer Briggs know if you need batting for a WW or RMAQ.

“Hello, my name is Specialist Aaron Talamantes and I received your letter and quilt. I don’t think anyone wishes they were in the position I’m in but knowing there are people like you that care for me and are constant in your support of me shines light on a dark situation. I don’t think I can express into words how grateful I am . . . something so simple makes a huge impact. As long as there is air in my lungs and blood pumping through my veins, I will be holding on to this quilt and letter. So on behalf of myself, the select few I am lying beside, my family, my platoon, and United States Army, Thank you.”

How rewarding it is to hear that our quilts make a huge impact and shine some light on a dark situation for our wounded warriors! I’m sharing this latest thank you note to let you know how grateful they are for your support.

Requirements:

Size: 48” by 78” (stretcher size)

All cotton (including batting, 80/20 acceptable)

Appropriate patriotic theme/design

Optional: Pillowcase, 20”x30”, coordinating fabric

There is also a list of suggested books for older children to inspire you. As a reminder, the CASA system assists children from very young ages to young people up to 21 years old, who need bed quilts to brighten their living areas as they get ready to transition out of the system and be on their own. Quilts don’t need to be elaborate, and suggested sizes are from 40 x 50-60 for younger children, up through generous lap sizes/twins.

For those of you without computer access, we will also have hard copies available at the guild meeting or we'll be happy to mail you a form or two. Just give one of the team members a call. Complete the form and turn it in to the team at the meeting or you can mail them to Robyn Wilkes at 23222 Elm Avenue, Torrance, CA 90505. Robyn will see that the info is input into our database. Remember, your quilt isn't officially entered until we have the application and a photo. Please carefully measure the width and length (don't guess) and provide those numbers in the correct location on your entry form. Your quilt does not have to be quilted or bound to enter it in the show but knowing the status at quilt entry will help us to follow up with you as to the progress. If you provide your own photo (digital photos are preferred), please remember to put your smiling face in the photo! That helps us ensure that we have the correct quilt entered for each person. Your photo should be named with your last name and the entry title (e.g., Overton_Wonky Trees) and emailed to SBQGquiltshowentry@gmail.com.

Log Cabin with a Modern Slant

Due January 2019

blocks turned in at the January meeting.

Guidelines for the block are for a 6 ½" block (6" finished) or a 12 ½" block (12" finished), and multiple fabrics are needed.

Start with a center square of a modern medium gray, size is up to you. Our samples started with a 2 ½" square. Proceed as you would for any log cabin pattern with the first two sides added sequentially with a modern fabric color of your choice, then the next two sides added sequentially in a different contrasting modern fabric and so on. Continue until your desired size is obtained.

The width of the logs can be different each time you add a log. You can trim to a wonky shape each time as many times as you like. The last logs added should allow the winner of the BOM to square up to 12 ½" or 6 ½" block.

The unifying color will be the center block of modern medium gray. Let your creativity go wild. You can't make a mistake because you can add another log. Have fun and borrow modern fabrics from friends or utilize traditional fabrics in a modern way. See samples and finished quilt photo for inspiration.
