We have many more wonderful and creative workshops through May 2020. We hope you will find one or more that interest you. We still have 2 openings for Kimberly Einmo's class coming up in a few short weeks this month. Be sure to stop by the workshop table and sign up for any or all of these great classes.

We want to remind everyone that your class fee includes a nonrefundable administrative fee. This fee is \$5 for each regular one day class. The fee for 1/2 day classes and special event classes is noted with each class description. The administrative fee will be deducted from your class fee refund if you cancel your reservation for any class.

The workshop fee is \$50 for SBQG Members or \$60 for all others unless otherwise noted.

October 16, 2019 – Kimberly Einmo "Lone Starburst" Kimberly's most popular class!

All it takes are 40 – 2 1/2" strips from a purchased precut bundle or strips cut from your own stash, plus one background fabric and the diamond design possibilities are practically endless! Kimberly will teach you how to strip-piece and cut diamond building blocks from strips using her EZ Jelly Roll Ruler or new Precision Precuts Ruler with no "Y" or set-in seams. No Supply fee.



November 19, 2019 - Kathryn Allison Pellman "Word Salad"

Create your own found poem or story using words found in your fabric collection in this creative, playful and fun filled workshop adding your own fashionista storyteller or a preprinted figure to complete your story. Your poem or story can be as long or as short as you like. Finished Project: 8" x 14" finished piece with one fashionista. Optional supply fee \$8.

March 18, 2020 – Tiffany Hayes – Calliope Quilt

Learn how to use The Goddess Tool to create Half Square Triangles, Tall Triangles, Half Tall Triangles and Corner Cut Aways. Tools are included for use during the Workshop with an option to purchase. Pattern is included in the workshop fee.



April 21, 2020 Latifah Saafir "Airshow Pillow or Mini Quilt"

Learn the basics of bias tape applique at this half-day workshop. Whimsical fabrics make this project a lot of fun and you can extend it for a larger wall hanging or quilt if you like. Fee: \$35 + \$12 supply fee. NOTE: This is a half-day class the same day as our April guild meeting.



The nonrefundable administrative fee for this 1/2 day class is \$3.00 and is part of the \$35 class fee.

April 22, 2020, Latifah Saafir "Clam Toss Quilt"

Clam Toss is a clamshell layout with a twist. The clams are turned in every direction! Learn tricks and tips to piece 8", 10' or 12" clams in any size quilt you like. Bring your own Clammy template or buy them in class. Fee: \$50 + supply fee for Clammy template (between \$16.50-\$31) and \$12 for the pattern

Countdown continues- we're down to just 5 months before the show! The entry system opened last month. That includes guild show, auction quilts, consignment quilts. For those without computer access we will have hard copies of the form available at the guild meeting. We're just asking for some contact information and some basic information about your quilt so we can plan how we hang it in the show. If you have any trouble or need help, we will have someone available at each guild meeting until December, but if possible, please don't wait until the last minute.

We will need a photo of your quilt(s). You may provide your own photo for your show entry or bring your quilt to the meeting and we will photograph it there. For auction and consignment quilts, we ask that you bring the quilt to the meeting so that we can take a photo that will be used on our website and social media to get maximum exposure.

Intra-Guild – Carollee Schuegraf, LaVerne Owen-Barakat

At the last meeting we had many members participate Block of the Month! Thank you! At the September Meeting LaVerne Owen-Barakat was the winner of House Blocks. Congratulation LaVerne. We hope you will make a quilt with these cute houses!

Block-of-the-Month due in October, is again Pinwheel Play! Very few fabrics. The pattern is on our website under Intra-Guild, Members Only as well as at the end of the newsletter. We hope you will make at least one block. We have included a photo of a sample. We hope we will have members participate.

We would like them 6 1/2" unfinished size. This is simple rail fence block, and by adding two 2 1/2 inch squares to the ends of two of the rectangles, a pinwheel is created. Use 4 different fabrics, a light, a medium and a dark, and a very light fabric for the 2 1/2" squares, which become the pinwheels. After the blocks are sewn into rows the Pinwheels appear! Any blue fabric combination. This pattern is designed by Gail Abeloe of Backporch Fabrics in Pacific Grove, (used with permission). The pattern is on our website under Intra-Guild, Members Only as well as at the end of this newsletter. We hope you will make at least one 6 1/2 inch block.

The Block-of-the-Month due in November is "R2/D2" a 9-Patch. 9 1/2" Block

Unfinished. Colors:

1. Your choice of plain white or white-on-white
2. Any bright solid fabric or reads as solid fabric.

Block-of-the-Month are opportunities to learn a new technique, try a new design/pattern, and play with different fabrics and colors. Each month we will supply a pattern for a block and provide guidelines for color and fabric. You may make up to five blocks for one chance per block to win all of the blocks turned in for the drawing at the guild meeting. You might want to make one block for the drawing and one block of your choice of color to keep. Use a color scheme of your choice for the keeper and have

a "ready-to-go" Modern quilt project at the end of the guild year. If you would like us to use a particular block, please let us know.

Findings October – Dottie Daybell

1. A simple Drunkard's Path quilt, made by someone with an eye for color and design. I love it! Note the two different kinds of diagonal stripes.

2. WW BOM This website is new to me: Quilt Jubilee from Lisa Sutherland. She sells patriotic fabrics, and has several very nice free patterns. I'm linking to "Unfurled" this month:

Her pattern is for a 60" x 80" quilt, with 4" borders. To get our narrower width, you can cut the red and white strips down to 28.5" wide instead of to 40.5". Or, if you omit the side borders, make them 36.5" wide.
3. Jayne had some small bright curved scraps to use up, and made a little quilt using Drunkard's Path blocks. But not JUST Drunkard's Path, and that decision makes the quilt. The three shades of gray are so much better than one shade.

4. In this post, Sarah talks about making a T-shirt quilt.

I love the way she planned the layout, using little photos of the shirts and moving those little pics around on graph paper. Much easier than laying out the shirts themselves! If you open that image in a new tab, you can enlarge it. The photos appear to have a grid - not sure what that is.
5. Curves really caught my eye this month! Elizabeth Eastmond posted a link to this simple modern block that you can set different ways. It's raw edge applique, but you can also piece it or use hand or machine applique with turned under edges, if you add seam allowances. I'd probably piece it.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - Due November 2019

R2/D2 9-Patch

Size: 9½" Block Unfinished

Colors: 1. Your choice of plain white or white-on-white
 2. Any bright solid fabric or reads as solid fabric

Cut: White or white-on-white

Four 4) 3 ½" squares the four corners of the nine patch

One (1) 1 ½" x 15" strip

Two (2) 1" x 15" strips

Cut: Any bright solid or reads as solid

One (1) 3 ½" square the center of the 9-patch

Two (2) 1" x 15" strips

Assembly:

Sew one each of the bright and the white 1" x 15" together. Then do the same for a second set. Press. Now assemble the two strips, bright sides to each side of the single 1 ½" x 15" white strip. Press. Square up one end of this striped piece then cut into 3 ½" squares. You should have four squares.

Assemble Row 1, 2, and 3. Then assemble the rows together as a nine patch. See Figure 1. Figure 2 depicts the blocks assembled into a quilt.

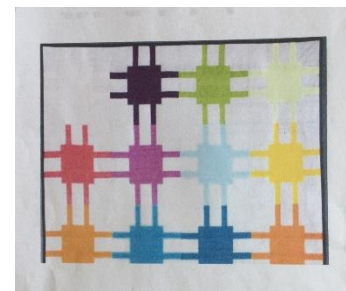
